Water plant location 'lunacy'

Lobbyist fears rise in birth defects near nuclear station

AJAX-PICKERING - A recent spill of radioactive water into Lake Ontario underscores the danger of building a new water plant near the nuclear station, Pickering council heard Tuesday.

Sherrill Willard of Save The Ajax Waterfront Committee urged politicians to "ask questions" of the province and the region about Sun-

day's leak from the Pickering plant. She said the spill illustrates the need to find another location for a \$60-million water plant planned on the Ajax lakefront two-and-a-half miles from the nuclear station.

"Are we being lulled into ignoring the lunacy of locating such a huge water plant so close to both nuclear and sewage plants?"

Firefighter wins bravery award for lake rescue

PICKERING - A Pickering firefighter who pulled two men to shore after their boat capsized in frigid waters last year has been recognized nationally for his efforts.

Michael Gamba is the Canadian Firefighter of the Year, an award to be presented by the Insurance Bureau of Canada at the annual meeting of the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs in Calgary on Aug. 19. He'll also receive \$5,000.

"This award recognizes the efforts of firefighters everywhere" and the "diversity of rescues" they're involved in, Pickering fire chief Steve Stewart said at a press conference yesterday.

"We're not just old smoke eaters who crawl into a fire and take a beating. It daily gets more complicated."

Mr. Gamba and fellow crew members responded to such an incident when an aluminum boat capsized in Lake Ontario near the Pickering nuclear plant in February 1991.

Two of the four men in the boat had made their way to shore by the time help arrived. The other two chose to stay with the boat, one of whom lost his grip and began to float away.

Seven-foot waves and a rocky shoreline made it impossible to launch a rescue boat. Mr. Gamba donned a rubber dry suit and, tied to a life-line, entered the water. Because of the waves and the life-line, he was only able to get about 30 feet from shore and had to wait until the men drifted close to him.

As he pulled the first man to safety, Mr. Gamba crashed against rocks on the shoreline, badly bruising his knee and foot.

Time was against Mr. Gamba in his rescue of the second man, who was unconscious and weighed about 300 pounds because he was wearing a snowmobile suit and snow boots. Though

Search continues for missing man

AJAX-PICKERING - The search continues for a Pickering man whose disappearance is "out of the ordinary," police say.

Andrew Brian Rous, 27, hasn't been heard from since July 14 when he left a message on the answering machine at his Diefenbaker Ct. home.

A credit card in his name has been used in Thunder Bay and Tillbury.

Mr. Rous, also known as Brian Wheeler, is a housekeeper at the Ajax and Pickering General Hospital.

He stands 5'4", weighs 125 pounds, has a slim build, short brown hair, a moustache, brown eyes and a medium complexion. When last seen, Mr. Rous was wearing navy pants, white running shoes and a short-sleeved blue T-shirt bearing the hospital logo.

He was driving a white 1989 Hyundai GLS four door, with the licence plate 863 PRY. He's an avid rollerskater and had rollerskates with him.

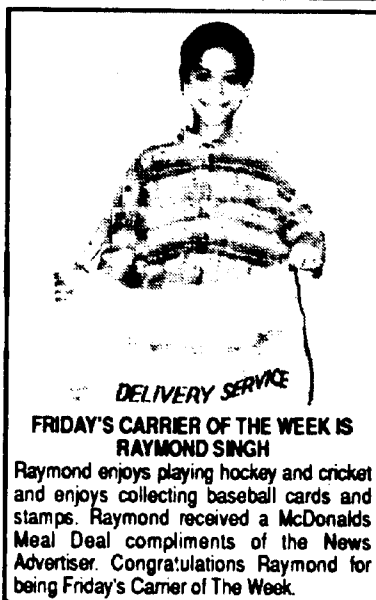

Reform candidate hopefuls square off

AJAX-PICKERING - If voters support the Reform Party in the next federal election, they'll see a balanced budget in just three years, candidate hopefuls promise.

Pickering's Bill Foden and Whitby's Andrew Davies addressed about 80 area residents at the Pickering Library Wednesday night. Each is hoping to garner support in their bid to represent the party in Ontario Riding, which includes Pickering, Ajax and Whitby.

"A government must live within its means," said Mr. Foden, a lawyer who promised to balance the federal budget while maintaining such social services as health care, pensions and unemployment insurance.

Mr. Davies, the owner of a computer consulting firm, believes "there's enough fat and abuse in the system" to allow for a balanced budget in a few years.

Each held the party line in their support of a Triple-E Senate, the use of a referendum and questionnaires to determine the electorate's views on certain issues, and allowing constituents to recall an MP they feel has violated his oath of office.

Both attacked Ontario's employment equity policy, which recommends goals in the hiring of the physically disabled, visible minorities and aboriginal people.

Mr. Foden supports the "equality of all races" and wants "individual rights protected without regard to culture, color or language...It's racist to impose that kind of quota on businesses," he said. "Put the best person for that job in that job."

Mr. Davies agrees "all Canadians are created equal" and would support color-blind and gender-blind testing to ensure "the best person gets the job."

He would like to see tighter

immigration laws so "murderers, rapists and terrorists are no longer a burden to us," while Mr. Foden said he'd "welcome genuine refugees."

On the issue of Quebec, Mr. Foden said he'd "welcome Quebec to constitutional negotiations with open arms" if distinct society recognized its historical and cultural differences, but not if it gave the province greater rights than others.

Aboriginal self-government, however, proved to be a stumbling block for each candidate hopeful.

"I would like to see native people get together and tell us what they want," suggested Mr. Davies, saying he could support a regional-type government if it's not discriminatory.

Though he said recognizing the Metis as an aboriginal people "has some merit," Mr. Davies admitted to being "out to lunch until I get some facts on the native people."

He believes "native people should be equal to us...They may have been here a thousand years, but they're just the first wave of immigrants."

According to Mr. Foden, "No one knows yet what native self-government means," suggesting it must be subject to overriding laws and could be similar to a municipal government.

"We need input from natives to see what they would like to see happen," he said.

Ajax resident Don Sullivan, an endorsed candidate, was unable to attend the meeting.

The Ontario Riding Reform Party's 820-plus members will select a candidate Sept. 9 for a federal election next year.

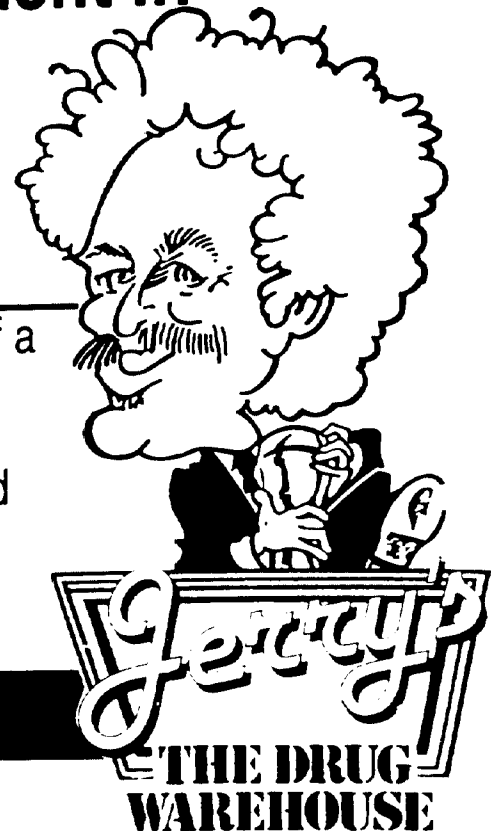

Bungee jump operator pleased by lack of ban

DURHAM - The province's decision not to ban bungee jumping is an "excellent" one, according to the Ajax company involved in last weekend's bungee jumping death of a local teen.

Adrenaline Rush Adventures is reacting to yesterday's announcement that jump companies can continue to operate.

The province had been considering a ban following Saturday's death of Troy Hurtibese, of Whitby. The 19-year-old jump master trainee had been demonstrating the safety of the sport at a rock concert near Peterborough when he fell to the ground.

A graduate of Archbishop Denis O'Connor Catholic School in Ajax, Mr. Hurtibese failed to correctly attach his bungee cord to a cage suspended from a crane, according to Adrenaline.

The mistake was overlooked in a standard safety double-check by a fellow worker, said the company spokesperson.

Although the company doubts the mistake would have occurred if the jumper had been a consumer instead of an employee — because he would have undergone three checks instead of two — the ministry of consumer and commercial relations is advising the public that bungee jumping is not presently regulated by government.

"It is a dangerous activity where individual safety cannot be guaranteed," a press release says.

All jump operators must now post a cautionary notice at jump-

ing locations and must draw it to the attention of potential customers.

The ministry will also set up a task force to deal with public safety concerns. It will be made up of representatives from the consumer ministry's technical standards division, the ministry of labor, and the industry.

(The labor ministry regulates worker safety in the area of bungee jumping, but its mandate does not include public safety.)

The task force will examine current industry practices, related legislation and regulations, practices in other jurisdictions, and the industry's safety record.

It may suggest industry self-regulation, voluntary guidelines, government regulation or a ban on the activity.

Adrenaline says it will now treat all employees as consumers by following three safety checks. "It's a tragedy," says the spokesperson. "We all feel sad

about what happened."

Following the accident, Adrenaline was shut down for the third time in a month. The labor ministry's stop-work orders fell under industrial guidelines governing safe and proper use of

cranes.

The company hasn't decided yet whether it will close up shop here. "We're looking at what to do," says the spokesperson.

A coroner's inquest has been called into Sunday's tragedy.

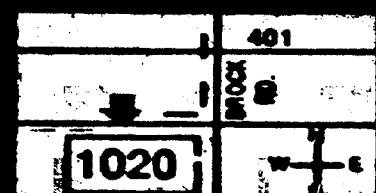

How safe is nuclear?

Sunday's spill of radioactive water from the Pickering nuclear plant into Lake Ontario must be cause for concern.

We have the same concerns as an Ajax woman. Sherrill Willard of Save The Ajax Waterfront Committee says the leak underscores the danger of building a new Ajax water plant near the nuclear station. She urged Pickering council Tuesday to "ask questions" of the province and the region about the biggest spill in the nuclear plant's history.

She claims there have been 10 additional cases of Down Syndrome babies in the area since an Atomic Energy Control Board study was released in October 1991. That study found Down Syndrome birth rates in Pickering are higher than the provincial average, but couldn't prove a link between the birth defect and tritium, a radioactive byproduct of CANDU reactors. "What if we find out the water is tied to birth defects?" asks Ms. Willard.

And, we have the same worry of Durham Nuclear Awareness, a group that advocates shutting down nuclear plants. "We're concerned about the amount of tritium the nuclear plant is allowed to release," says spokesman Irene Kock.

Ontario Hydro tells us Sunday's spill represents three per cent of the plant's monthly tritium release limit. In other words, the utility's implying, if the plant spewed the same amount of radioactive water into the lake 30 days of every month, the spills would only represent 90 per cent of the tritium release limit.

Says Ms. Kock: "We're very concerned the guidelines are much too high." Those limits are set by the Atomic Energy Control Board, acting on the advice of the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency, made up of scientists from around the globe. They come up with the guidelines based on "the world level of knowledge on radiation".

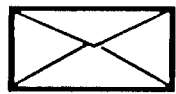
But, how expert can that knowledge be? How can anyone really know the dangers posed by a spill from a nuclear plant when nuclear power has only been with us such a short time? When people began smoking tobacco, no one knew then the terrible toll the practice would exact.

Despite the assurances from Hydro that we get after each and every nuclear plant accident, no one can really know the dangers they pose. It could be another generation or another century before we know.

Until we know how safe nuclear power really is, Ontario Hydro must work fervently to end the possibility of accidents like the one last Sunday.

She claimed there have been 10 additional cases of Down Syndrome babies in the area since an Atomic Energy Control Board study was released in October 1991. That study found Down Syndrome birth rates in Pickering are higher than the provincial average, but couldn't prove a link between the birth defect and tritium, a radioactive byproduct of CANDU reactors.

"What if we find out the water is tied to birth defects?" asked Ms. Willard. "We shouldn't be making any fast moves."

In an earlier interview, Durham Nuclear Awareness spokesman Irene Kock also said the spill

necessitates taking another look at the location of the water plant. "It might be way too close (to the nuclear station.) In our view, it lends a lot to the argument the proposal needs to go through a full environmental assessment."

But council voted against a motion to ask the region to lobby the federal government for more study into a possible relationship between tritium and Down Syndrome. Politicians pointed out to Ms. Willard that environment minister Ruth Grier will soon be reviewing the findings of an Environmental Assessment Advisory Committee set up to evaluate the Ajax waterfront proposal.

Regional politicians will "be guided" by the committee's findings, Ms. Willard was told.

rescuers worked to get his body temperature up, he didn't make it.

Mr. Gamba recalls feeling "frustrated" during the rescue, which he says "you don't forget. Events like this help bring it back, though I don't think it ever leaves you."

The three survivors recently dropped by the fire department. "It was probably the most emotional half-hour most of us have ever spent," admitted chief Stewart. "Their gratitude and appreciation...was wonderful to see."

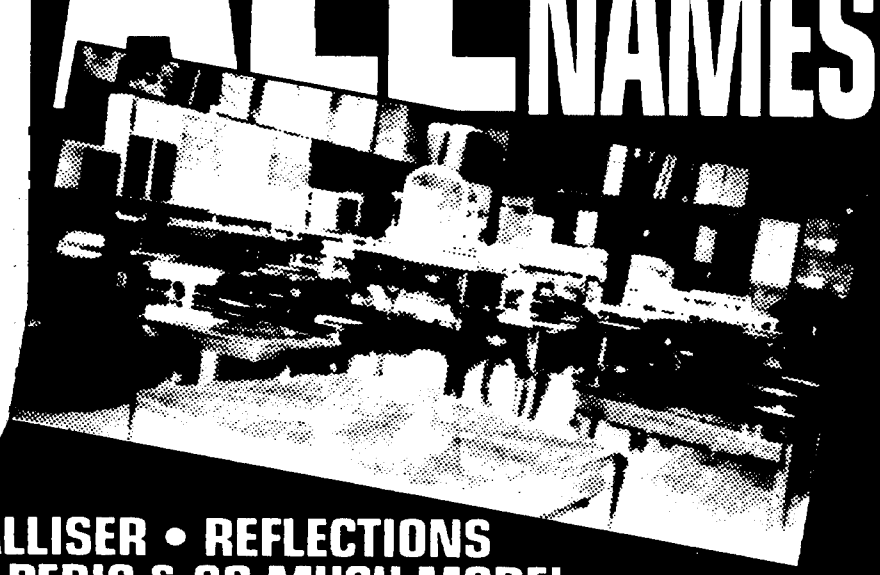

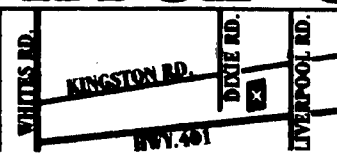

Murray McLauchlan headlines Sunday festival

PICKERING - Folk music legend Murray McLauchlan will make a special guest appearance during Pickering's first Grassroots music & arts festival this weekend.

Grassroots, to be held at Pickering Museum Village Sunday, will feature live entertainment, workshops, demonstrations and displays designed to celebrate Canada's music and art heritage.

Four thousand people are expected to attend the festival, which will be the culmination of eight months of planning by town staff and numerous community volunteers. The town is funding the event with the help of local commercial, service and retail organizations.

"A lot of these people have given a great deal of volunteer time to help develop this project — performing artists, entertainers and volunteers from the community," says museum village manager Lynn Winterstein.

An impressive line-up of performances will feature music brought to a young Canada by settlers from Scotland, Ireland, England, France, Eastern Europe, Africa and the United States.

Folk art will be showcased with carvings, sculpture, printing, painting and more by Canadian artists who practise time-honored skills. Demonstrations will allow public participation where possible. Children's entertainment includes a puppet troupe, toymaking, art, music, storytelling and street theatre.

Food and refreshments will be available throughout the day courtesy of local service groups, with

Upper Canada Brewery and Hillebrand Wineries featured in a beer tent.

McLauchlan, who's expected to give a one-hour performance at about 7 p.m., "felt good about this project," adds Ms. Winterstein. The recording artist was contacted through relatives living in Pickering.

He launched his career in Quebec and Ontario coffee houses, winning his first Juno Award in 1973 after his hit Farmer's Song won a gold record. A writer/performer of international stature, he can currently be heard on CBC Radio in his Swinging On A Star weekly program.

Many other performers are giv-

ing of their time and coming considerable distances to join the festival. They include: Tanglefoot, a "rollicking folk trio"; Huronia Olde Tyme Country, a Franco-Ontarian Quartet; Dennis Stillwell Martin, guitar, banjo and vocals; Purple Dragon, a puppet troupe; Conrad Kipping & Friends, guitar, fiddle, banjo and mandolin; Enoch, Kent, Ian Bell & Friends, Scottish folksingers; Brigand, a five-person Celtic band; Justine Maw Quartet, early Canadian reels & jigs; Owen McBride, a folk teller & singer; Mardy-Lucier Porte, an Ojibway folk performer; and Hugh Laurence, folk carver.

Other entertainers and artists include Dennis Mann, folk teller; Oliver Apitius, instrument maker; Sheila Maloney, primitive painter, quilter, rug hooker and printmaker; Paul Simpson, toymaker and historian; and Gordon Law, folk carver.

Displays and demonstrations will include pieces from the collection of Ralph & Patricia Price of Port Perry; examples of early Canadian painted furniture from the collection of historian/collector Michael Rowan; sculpture commissioned for the event as created on site by William Fraser (alias Jacques Du Bois/Jack Wood); and carvings by Ivan Law. The town will be selling Grassroots T-shirts at \$15 each, with proceeds to the museum village.

Grassroots will be held from noon until dusk, with activities and performances taking place throughout the afternoon at various sites in the museum village grounds. At 5 p.m., the entire

show will move to the stage area where live entertainment will continue.

Because space is limited, tickets to the festival are being sold in advance only. Cost is \$5 for adults and \$3 for students, children and senior citizens. A family pass is

\$15.

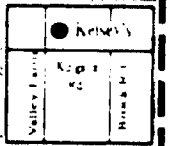

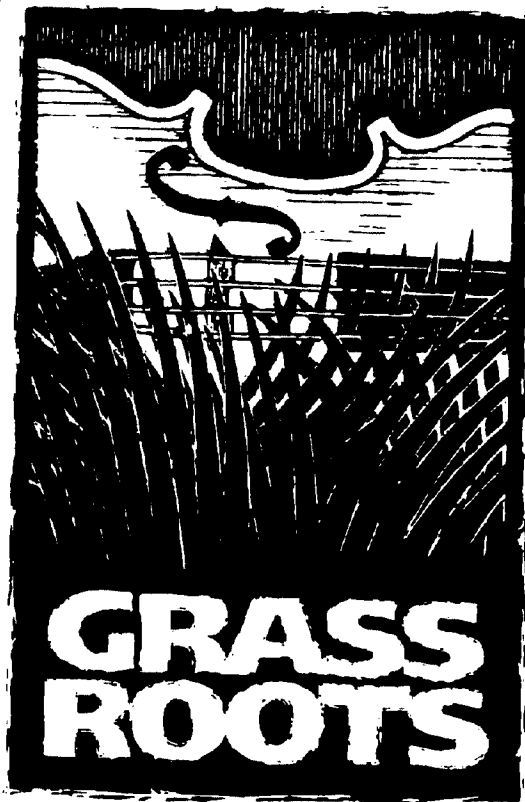

Ajax Legion celebrates 50 years of service

Cartoonist and author Ben Wicks will be the speaker at the 50th anniversary dinner of Ajax branch, Royal Canadian Legion, Aug. 12.

More than 200 members, including most of the surviving past presidents of the branch, are expected to attend the event. The Legion is also marking the anniversary with week-long celebrations from Aug. 9 to 15. They include a church parade and outdoor service adjacent to the swimming pool at the municipal buildings on Sunday, Aug. 9 at 1 p.m., followed by entertainment at the branch on Hunt St. at 3 p.m.

The following day a barbecue will be held at a nominal fee. There will also be a sports tournament at the branch, including snooker, darts and horseshoes.

A reunion is planned for Tuesday where ex-members of the club can meet and renew old friendships and on the Thursday, a past presidents' reunion night will be held.

The week's activities will wind up on Friday with a Monte Carlo night and a sports day on Saturday where free corn on the cob will be served followed by a pot luck supper and a '40s dance in the evening. All events, with the exception of the dinner, are open to the public.

There are no surviving members from 50 years ago, but the branch has two members, Tom Veitch of Woodhouse Cres. and Ben Severs of Brock St. Pickering Village, who joined the branch 47 years ago.

Veitch, who came with his father to live in the town in 1942 when it did not even have a name — it was part of the then Township of Pickering — recalls that there were no houses south of Hwy. 401. There wasn't even a Hwy. 401 and the acreage south of the freeway was one vast munitions plant, ringed with barbed wire.

Severs, a retired Ajax firefighter, who came to work in the town when he was discharged from the armed forces in 1945, said there were only 597 permanent homes, north of Hwy. 401.

He worked initially for the War Assets Corporation, became a volunteer firefighter in 1952 and later

joined the permanent staff before retiring 11 years ago.

In 1952 there were only four full-time firefighters, plus a chief and 20 volunteers on the fire department, he said.

The founding members of the Legion first met in the Carter Hall building, close to where the town's

outdoor swimming pool is now located. Later they moved to a large recreational building in Cedar Park and then to a building on Harwood Ave. where the Pennyworth's department store now stands.

This burned down and the Legion decided to build on its present site, Hunt St. Here again another

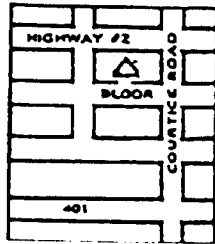
fire destroyed the building in 1971, but the Legion, undaunted, rebuilt and in 1977 enlarged with a \$250,000 addition.

During its 50 years, the Ajax Legion has donated between \$500,000 and \$1 million to local organizations and charities and to needy individuals.

Drycon Building Services has solution for wet basements

 To the average homeowner, there's nothing worse than a leaking basement. Short of the roof caving in, there's nothing more daunting than the prospect of having to repair that irritating leak.

But before you start thinking that 'weeping system' is aptly named, considering the mood you're in, give yourself some peace of mind and call the professionals: Drycon Building Services.

Drycon specializes in basement waterproofing. While many people continually assume this is a complicated and expensive job, owner Larry Goodwin points out that isn't necessarily so.

In many cases, the problem is pinpointed to a specific area, and can be fixed without spending additional time or money. Cracks in the foundation are a major cause of leaks, but if they're caught early enough, the damage can very often be reversed.

Larry fills the cracks with a specialized hydraulic cement that repels the water and leads it down and out of the house. Newer houses are just as susceptible to cracks, due to the settling of the building, but unfortunately the warranty on new homes only covers the basement for the first two years. That's where Larry comes in, repairing the small problems before they become big ones.

In some cases, though - especially in older homes - more extensive work needs to be done.



Occasionally the weeping system, the system of tiles and gravel that prevents water from seeping in, has to be redug. This generally involves a strip being dug around the outside perimeter of the house, though, as with cracks, sometimes only isolated sections need repair.

Once the trench is dug and the weeping tiles are replaced, a three-part waterproofing sealant and mesh membrane are applied to the concrete walls.

Without this membrane, the sealant would split and crack with the settling of the house. This combination makes the foundation completely impermeable.

In cases where it's difficult or impossible to dig outside the house, a similar set-up can be installed indoors. A trench can be dug around the interior perimeter of the house, and filled with weeping tiles and gravel in the same manner as the outside system. New concrete is poured over the trench to refinish the basement.

Whatever the situation, Larry

ensures complete waterproofing, and extends his warranties on this kind of work for up to 10 years.

Drycon's other area of specialty is concrete refinishing. Instead of replacing chipped and broken concrete, you can simply have it refinished. Drycon uses a special concrete coating to level out uneven patches.

After cleaning off dirt and residue, a thin skim layer of this concrete is applied to restore the original look of the object. Cracks around swimming pools can be filled, as can chips and pits in concrete stairs. Even broken, crumbling concrete can be repaired by this process.
