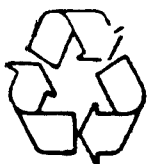

# Towns look forward to growth

**AJAX-PICKERING** - Both Ajax and Pickering can look forward to future growth, the Towns' mayors say.

Ajax mayor Jim Witty and Pickering mayor Wayne Arthurs outlined their economic agendas during a board of trade luncheon Tuesday.

Ajax "has continued to show moderate growth" despite the recession, said mayor Witty, although building permits have declined over the past two years.

"It has long been my opinion that we should make better use of the expertise that presently exists within our own community," he said in mentioning the creation of two task forces that will study industrial and commercial development and formulate a new strategy for the town.

Upcoming developments include a shopping centre at Hwy. 2 and Harwood Ave., which will "act as a catalyst for a mini-boom" in development; and the province's approval of a new water supply plant has "cleared the way for the servicing of hundreds of acres of industrial-designated lands", mayor Witty added.

Mayor Arthurs announced the beginning of a "Pickering Exporting Group" which will urge companies to export products, intelligence or technology.

"Weak economy or not, steel is going up in the town of Pickering," he said in outlining

current commercial and residential projects. Future development includes a hotel at Brock Rd. and Finch Ave.

As well, mayor Arthurs outlined his involvement with mayors in the Greater Toronto Area to "pursue a partnership" with the province to "strengthen the GTA's eroding economic base." Group initiatives could include participation in international trade shows.

The town is withholding development charges against new projects for another four years, and will work to expedite development applications, he said. "I continue to be optimistic based on the level of activity we see in our offices."

# Youth centre wins reprieve

**AJAX-PICKERING** - An after-school program at the closed Barbara Black Centre for Youth Resources will be resurrected soon with the help of the Town.

The youth centre, which operated out of the East Shore Community Centre, closed recently due to funding problems.

The Town is providing staff to supervise an after-school gym program, says Tom Quinn, director of community services and facilities. However, that will only allow the program to operate until April 1, he says. "It's a band-aid thing, that's all it is."

The centre's board of directors continues to apply for

Provincial government funding, says Cathy Walker, board president. "We haven't given up. I have grant proposals littering my house. I spend my weekends writing them."

In order to consistently offer youth services in the community, government funding will be needed, she says.

To help pay for the Town staff who will supervise the after-school program temporarily, a bingo is being organized by the Optimist Club of Pickering, and youths are volunteering to help. It's hoped that at least \$3,000 will be raised, says Ms. Walker.

The bingo is planned for

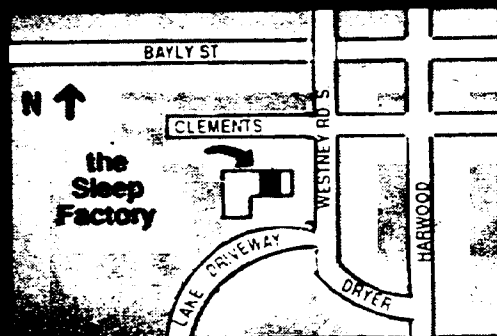

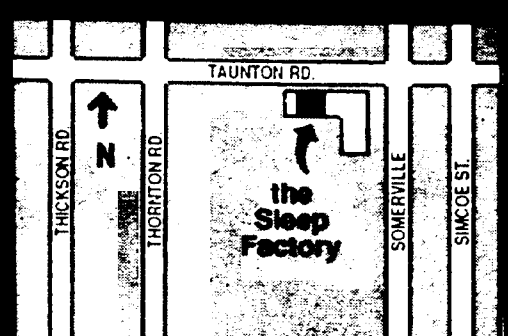

# Welfare change has little effect on taxpayers

DURHAM - A change in how the welfare tab is financed may have little impact on taxpayers.

The Province announced last week it'll pay 100 per cent of the cost of General Welfare Assistance beginning next year. The Province currently pays 80 per cent and municipalities like Durham Region 20 per cent.

Provincial municipal affairs minister Dave Cooke and John Harrison, former president of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), said the change would take effect Jan. 1, 1994, after AMO consults with municipalities.

Durham's social services commissioner Garry Cubitt says the Region expects \$101 million to be doled out this year to the area's 20,000 welfare recipients with Durham's portion \$16.3 million.

Now that the Province is taking over all welfare funding, municipalities will take over the cost of providing property assessment services and responsibility for some provincial highways that primarily carry local traffic.

Yet to be determined are which highways the Region will take over and Durham's costs for running the property assessment services and road maintenance.

Municipalities across the province shelled out \$340 million

to welfare recipients in 1992, according to the municipal affairs ministry.

In exchange for the Province picking up welfare costs, Ontario municipalities will hand over \$135 million for property assessment services and \$40 million for high-way work.

In addition, the Province will reduce unconditional grants to municipalities by \$165 million.

Tom Edwards, chairman of Durham's health and social services committee, says "I'm quite satisfied (the Province is taking over responsibility for welfare). The government's action is an appropriate one — actually, the government and AMO, because AMO initiated this."

The Region has been calling on the Province to assume the full share of welfare costs "for some years now," Mr. Edwards notes.

Elsewhere in Canada, provinces pay the full welfare tab, he says.

The Region will continue to deliver the welfare system — processing applicants and staffing the service.

For 1993, it will cost \$14 million in Durham to provide the service, with the Region paying \$7 million.

"As it stands now, that stays the same. That's my reading of the announcement. The cost sharing on the administration is unchanged," Mr. Cubitt says.

# War on against seniors' abuse

DURHAM - A battle is being waged here to fight "hidden crimes" against the elderly.

"There are many kinds of elder abuse," notes Kerry Delaney, coordinator of an Elder Abuse Education project.

"The abuse can be physical, emotional and psychological. The most frequent form, however, is financial. It's called the hidden crime because it's done by family mem-

bers, people of trust. The abused person often doesn't want to talk about it."

The prevention of elder abuse through education is the aim of a project recently undertaken by Durham Region Community Care Association and funded by the ministry of health.

"Elder abuse has long been recognized as an issue," adds Ms. Delaney. "It's something that needs to be

addressed. Our focus is on education because it's one of the best methods of prevention."

Over the next 20 months, the association plans to produce a brochure on elder abuse and increase the awareness of programs aimed at seniors, including such services as friendly visiting, caregiver relief and seniors' day programs.

It also aims to arrange speakers on such issues as the aging process and power of attorney. It will encourage families to consider and plan for the care a family member will need and will educate the elderly on their rights.

The association plans to educate postal and utility workers and others who may come into contact with the elderly on appropriate support services. It will also establish a reference library of materials on elder abuse.

The association will hold an information session on its education project Thursday, Feb. 4 at Camp Samac, 1711 Simcoe St. N., Oshawa.

## PCs 'ready for election'

AJAX-PICKERING - The Tory battle cry was sounded by two federal cabinet ministers recently for local party members to win the next election.

"We're ready to fight an election led by Prime Minister Brian Mulroney," who's shown "unswerving leadership in tough times," Solicitor-General Doug Lewis told Conservatives who gathered to nominate Rene Soetens as their election candidate. Mr. Lewis is co-chair of the PC's Ontario campaign.

"Canadians are going to have a choice and we welcome the challenge," he said.

The Liberals "have no idea what to do" if elected, and would respond by throwing money taxpayers don't have at problems, he predicted. "We're tired of the whining, groaning, and moaning of the opposition party. They're mired in the '60s and '70s...the Canadian public is not stupid."

Tories will have to spread the message about the party's achievements, advised Bernard Valcourt, minister of employ-

ment and immigration.

"The next election will be about the record. We acknowledge times are tough out there for Canadians, but times are not tough because of action taken by this government."

Prime Minister Mulroney did not create the world-wide recession, but his policies will help bring economic recovery to Canada, said Mr. Valcourt.

"It's not to say everything is perfect, but if we follow the recipe of the socialists or the Liberal party, it would be a much worse situation," he assured.

Under the Tory government's guidance, jobs will be created and unemployment will drop, he said. "The confidence will be there and we'll see things turn around rapidly."

"We have, as Tories, to get the people of this country to stop and think about the record, about the things we have done to get this country in the right direction...we'll go for it and tell Canadians the story, the record."

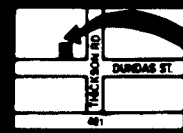

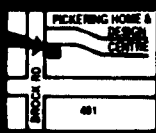

# RC school board demands answers on Altona Forest

PICKERING - Frustrated separate school board trustees are going straight to the top.

The Durham Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board is appealing to Premier Bob Rae to resolve an ongoing battle with four government departments in

its bid to build a school in the Altona Forest.

"Action is required by you to bring resolution to problems within your government that are hurting children attending school in west Pickering," urges a letter from the board to Mr. Rae.

But, according to Durham West MPP Jim Wiseman, negoti-

ations are now taking place between the ministry of natural resources and the landowner of Altona Forest. The area may be preserved as a corridor for wildlife between Duffins Creek and the Rouge River Valley.

(Earlier this week, the province announced its decision to preserve 20,000 acres of green space in the valley.)

Plans to build a school in the Altona Forest date back more than a decade.

The ministry of municipal affairs approved plans for the proposed Highbush community in 1982 which included a site for a Catholic school. In 1989, the ministry of education approved funds to purchase the site and build the school.

But in 1990, Pickering council bowed to public pressure and asked the ministry of the environ-

ment if it had an interest in pre-

serving the 330-acre forest. It hasn't yet received an answer and has moved ahead with development plans, which call for low-density housing, two schools and a park.

Meanwhile, interest groups asking for an environmental assessment continue to wait for a response.

The board appealed to the ministry of education in 1991 to help resolve its accommodation problem and has since reached an agreement for severance and purchase of the proposed school site with the existing owner.

However, the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) won't consider the appeal until other land in the area is dealt with.

"There has to be a way of getting the ministries together," says Pickering trustee Kevin Ashe. "Kids are sitting in portables and parents are frustrated."

A new school would alleviate "the crisis situation" at St. Monica Catholic School, which is struggling to cope with 710 students in a facility designed for 240, he explains.

Development of the forest "doesn't mean you're against the environment," argues Mr. Ashe. "You can have some balanced, responsible growth."

"We're being kind calling it a forest. It's not being looked after," he adds, saying it's a gathering spot for teenagers and bikers and a dumping place for garbage.

However, it's "not likely" Mr. Rae will "try and influence the OMB," says Mr. Wiseman, who believes it "makes sense for the school board to try for another site where the kids are."

## 'Good neighbor' foils robbery bid

PICKERING - A "good neighbor" is being credited with helping police nab a teen suspected of trying to rob a house here.

"It's an example of a good neighbor keeping their eyes open," Durham Regional Police Staff Sergeant Tony Turner says of a foiled robbery attempt on Antonio St. around noon Tuesday.

"Neighbors usually know who should be in the house. That's why groups like Neighborhood Watch are so important," he adds.

The neighbor called police after spotting a male trying to get into a nearby house through a window. The teen, who was in the house when police arrived, fled on foot and was arrested about 15 minutes later near the Petro-Canada gas station at Liverpool Rd. and Bayly St.

The young offender was charged with break and enter with intent to commit robbery.

## Gas jockey tied up in robbery

PICKERING - Four men, one armed with a handgun, robbed a Petro Canada gas bar in Pickering early Thursday morning.

Two men entered the gas bar around 2:25, bought some small items and left. Then two other men entered with a handgun and tied up the attendant.

The four fled with a small quantity of cash.

The first suspect is black, 19 to 22 years of age, and was wearing a black coat and green pants. The second is black, also 19 to 22 years old, dressed in all black, wearing a mask and carrying a handgun. The third is black, and was wearing a black coat, yellow and black pants and a mask. There was no description of the fourth suspect.

## Bandits handcuff clerk

PICKERING - A convenience store clerk was handcuffed by men wearing balaclavas in an armed robbery here early Wednesday morning.

Durham Regional Police say two males entered Becker's at 512 Kingston Rd. around 2:30 a.m., pointed a small handgun at the clerk, handcuffed his wrists together and made off with a small amount of cash.

The clerk phoned police who cut the handcuffs. There were no injuries.

The first suspect is described as a black male, 5'7", 145 pounds, wearing a red jacket. The second is a black male, 5'8", 180 pounds, stocky build, wearing a black jacket.

## Fighting abuse of the elderly

The murders of two Metro senior citizens in a little more than a week have us worried and wondering. Is violence against the elderly increasing?

The Toronto newspapers regularly publish stories about seniors being mugged by thugs -- parasites who prey on the weak, beat them up and rob them, probably more often than not, to pay for drugs.

Durham Regional Police Staff Sergeant Sandy Ryrie says the local force hasn't noticed an increase in crimes against the elderly. "We haven't seen it here."

We hope he's right. However, as more Torontonians move here for cheaper housing, Toronto-type crimes seem to follow. A scary thought.

But, violent crimes aren't the only crimes against seniors that trouble us. There are also the "hidden crimes", in the words of Kerry Delaney, coordinator of an Elder Abuse Education Project, recently undertaken by Durham Region Community Care Association and funded by the Ontario ministry of health.

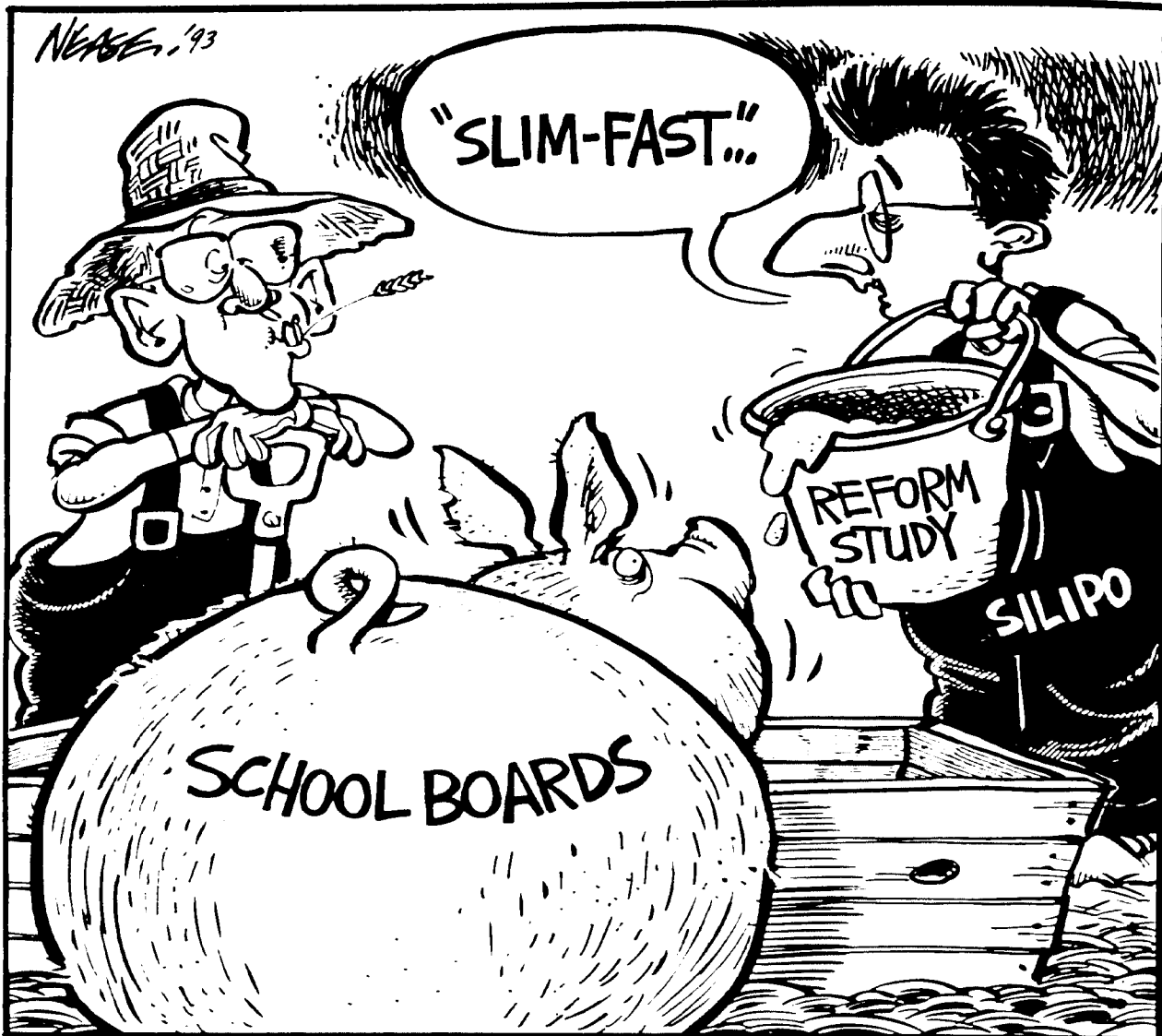
"There are many kinds of elder abuse," notes Ms. Delaney. "The abuse can be physical, emotional and psychological. The most frequent form, however, is financial. It's called the hidden crime because it's done by family members, people of trust. The abused person often doesn't want to talk about it."

"Elder abuse has long been recognized as an issue," she points out. "It's something that needs to be addressed."

And, the Elder Abuse Prevention project is doing just that. "Our focus is on education because it's one of the best methods of prevention," says Ms. Delaney.

Over the next 20 months, the project will produce a brochure on elder abuse and increase awareness of programs for seniors; inform the elderly on their rights; encourage families to plan for the care of aging relatives; and educate workers who come into contact with seniors on available support services.

We wholeheartedly endorse any action that will help reduce abuse of the elderly.

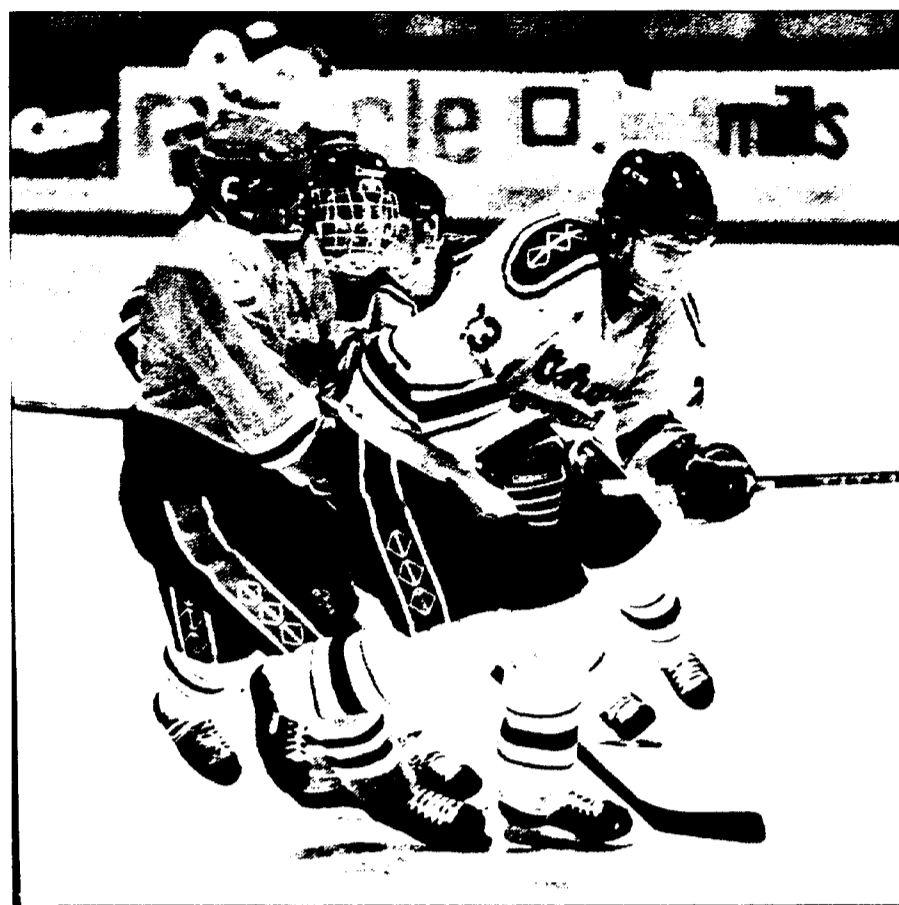
Recording assists were Courtney Boyd with two, Stephanie Murray, Lorissa Stroud, Barnes and Sharpe with one each.

### CHOICE OF MUTUAL FUNDS SHOULD REFLECT PERSONAL NEEDS

By the mid-1990s, it is estimated that mutual funds in Canada will be worth about \$186 billion. That's triple their current value, and nine times their value only five years ago. In this, the last of a four-part series, we look at how mutual funds can be used to meet your personal investment objectives.

Of the more than 700 mutual funds available in Canada today, which one is right for you?

Each provides the benefits of professional management, as well as an opportunity to participate in a large, diversified portfolio of securities. But in most cases, that's where the similarity ends.

Why? Simply because different funds are designed to meet the needs of different investors.

For example, if you're approaching retirement, your primary investment objectives will be preservation of capital and a steady source of income. On the other hand, if you're in your early 30s, you'll probably be less concerned about short-term security than long-term growth.

In each instance, there's a type of mutual fund (or combination of funds) that is best suited to your personal goals. To see which one is right for you, let's review the following criteria:

**Time Horizon.** Basically, this is the time remaining until you expect to use the proceeds of your investment. If it's three years or less, then you should probably concentrate on stable, income-oriented investments such as mortgage, bond, or money-market fund. If your time horizon is five years or more, you may want to consider investing in an asset allocation fund or equity fund - either of which is subject to short-term fluctuations in value, but offers higher potential growth over the long term.

**Liquidity.** Like many people, you may require that at least some of your investments are liquid, or readily cashable. This could be to provide a source of emergency funds, or just a "parking spot" for money that you're reserving for future investment opportunities. Here, any mutual fund will provide you with the liquidity you need, since they are usually cashable within a few days. It's worth remembering, however, that it is not always desirable to liquidate some types of mutual funds - particularly those that may have recently suffered a short-term decline in value. And certainly, if your fund is sheltered within an RRSP, you will not want to use the money - and incur the subsequent tax penalties - unless absolutely necessary.

**Income.** If you're like many people, you may depend on your investments to provide you with a regular source of income. In this case, your holdings should be weighted towards mutual funds that concentrate on interest-bearing securities, such as mortgages, bonds, and money market instruments. Keep in mind, however, that bonds (and, to a certain extent, mortgages) can decline in value if interest rates start to rise. Finally, if you wish to minimize that tax liability on your income, you may want to consider investing in a fund that generates and derives a substantial portion of its returns from dividends.

**Growth.** While North American stock markets have performed sporadically over the past few years, historical averages show that equities offer consistently superior returns in the long term. So if your goal is to achieve capital growth over a period of five years or more, you may want to consider investing in a Canadian equity fund or equity index fund (this type invests in stocks that make up the TSE 300 Composite Index) - both of which are eligible for your RRSP. You can also increase your level of diversification and gain exposure to foreign markets with an international fund.

**Balancing your asset mix.** Is there one type of fund that's right for you? In most cases, probably not. Because even if your investment objectives are almost exclusively oriented towards income or growth, you'll still need some measure of diversification in your portfolio. Consequently, you may want to consider investing with a company that offers a full range (or "family") of mutual funds. This will allow you to shift your assets between funds - often at no charge - to accommodate your changing investment needs.

Strong defensive play by Jessica Field, Jamie-Lynn Wilsdon and Megan Purdy contributed to the well-earned tie.

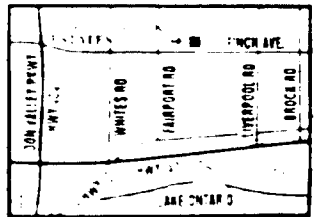

## PRESTO!

The magic never stops  
for real-life Ken and Barbi

PICKERING - He can make a live canary disappear and then crack open an egg and watch the bird flutter out. He can make his wife's head appear to turn completely around on her shoulders while her feet stay firmly on the ground.

He can do a million other illusions, and make them look as easy as magic.

He's Ken Poynter of Pickering and, along with his stage partner/wife Barbi, he's hoping to work a little magic on their own careers and become famous.

"I want people to walk in and get a chill up their spine and leave with their jaw to their chest and their eyes just in a glaze," Ken, 28, said in an interview recently.

The couple — whose names really are Ken and Barbi — have been working together for three years in their company, Poynter Productions. They're newlyweds who are currently entertaining aboard a Caribbean cruise ship during a working honeymoon.

When they return home in May, they'll start working on plans to perform in other parts of Canada and establish themselves with a wider North American audience. They've already entertained in places that include Mexico, Club Med resorts and Toronto's Harbourfront.

Ken, who chose his career at age nine after seeing illusionist Doug Henning perform, wants to be as well-known as Henning and David Copperfield.

"Every magician wants to be famous...Henning opened up the door and Copperfield walked through the door."

Adds Barbi, "And you'd like to walk down the hallway."

While their lives are glamorous and exciting, the business of magic is also hard work. Ken admits to being a perfectionist, meticulous about show details that could go wrong, such as music, lighting and

special effects. "The magic itself is not a problem; it's putting the whole production together...Either you become a perfectionist or you're stricken with anxiety."

Little things have gone wrong. A canary once got loose when the Poynters were performing at the Pickering Town Centre, forcing Barbi to abandon Ken on stage and chase the bird through a store's furniture department. Another time, Barbi had to do the head-twisting trick with a migraine headache.

"I walked off the stage smiling and burst into tears because I was in so much pain," she recalls. "The

show must go on."

Even if everything goes off without a hitch, there's a chance a volunteer called to assist on stage will be a poor sport.

"If someone comes up on stage who's going to ruin the fun for everyone else, you have to use your talent as an entertainer to win back the audience or let it roll off your shoulders," says Ken. It doesn't pay to poke fun at a volunteer with a poor attitude, he says. "It starts becoming a war on stage; you have to be a good host."

Even worse, says Ken, are people who insist they know how a trick was done. "A lot of people

want to beat the magic and find out how the trick was done...They never guess how it's done. People come up with this cocky attitude and you can't convince them they're wrong. It ruins the atmosphere you've created. People are captivated and in awe; you shouldn't have to figure it out."

The business of magic must be run as just that — a business, the Poynters say — and can be expensive to break into. Illusions, which can be complicated productions with backdrops, fog machines and strobe lights, can cost up to \$20,000 each.

"You really have to work to get a good, hour-long show," says Barbi, who adds that, "The more illusions Ken does, the more he wants. I don't think the show will ever be big enough for him."

But, magic can also be lucrative. The Poynters have seen their income double each year and are investing their profits back into the business. In two years, they expect to have a show worth hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Not a bad return on the investment of a little magic kit for a 10-year-old Ken. By 14, he had an agent and was performing at birthday parties, corporate functions and flea markets. He learned from books and videos, and became proficient at manipulating his hands.

As a youth, he'd ask his buddies to chain him up and leave him alone while he worked to escape, laughs Barbi. "His parents would come home and there he'd be on the floor."

Ken is now training Barbi in close-up and stage magic, so she can have a greater participation in shows. "I want us to have a partnership of magician-magician," he says. "I think we should be a magic couple."

And if their crystal ball reveals children in their future, with a little luck — or magic — they'll be twins or triplets. Then the Poynters could really stage some great illusions.

A group of residents is organizing the event, to be held Friday, Feb. 12 at Swans Marina on Liverpool Rd. S.

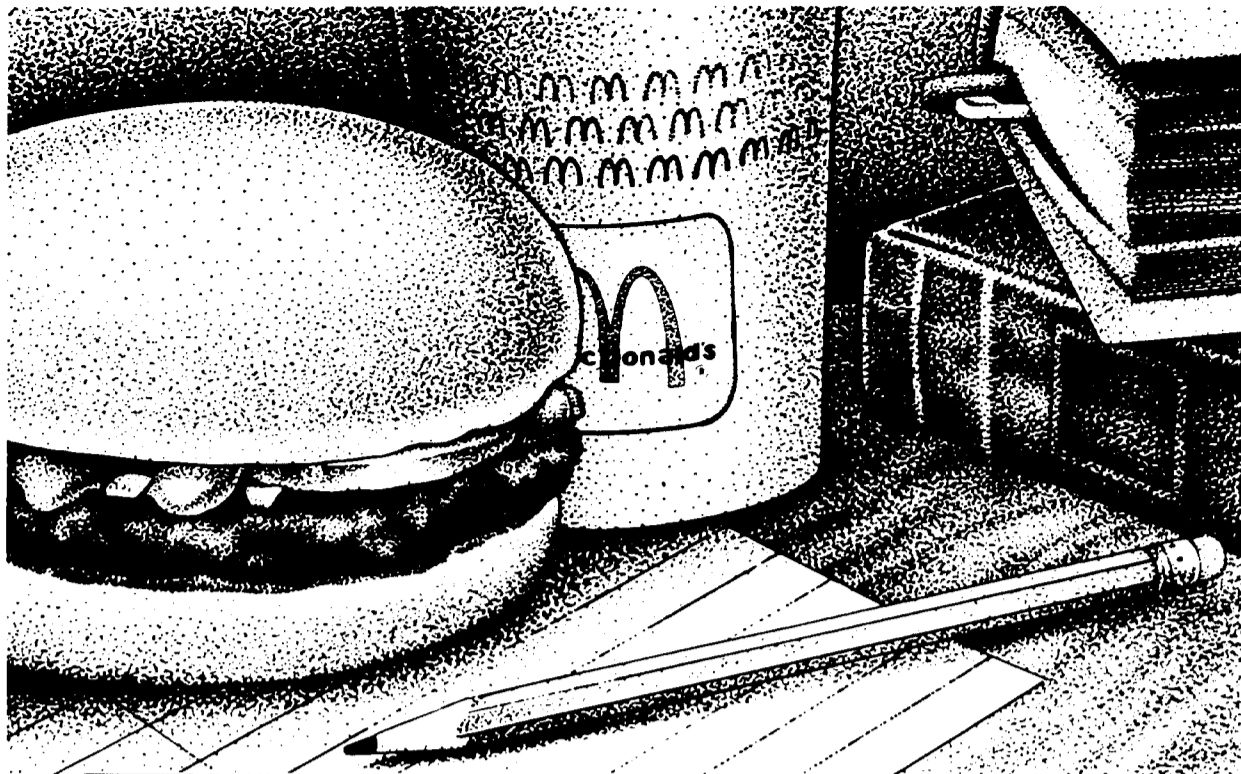
It's not intended the dance make a profit, but if that should happen the proceeds will be used to hold a second dance, says organiz-
