Students tripped up

DURHAM - Out-of-country school trips and thrill-seeking adventures could come under stricter guidelines as the separate board here addresses parental and staff concerns.

"Under present economic conditions, there's pressure on everyone to survive, let alone get into such

niceties as vacations," explains Durham Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board trustee Joe Bugelli.

"It's difficult to deny your child a trip because you don't want them to stand out (from peers). How do you deal with that extra pressure?" asks the Whitby trustee.

He also wonders "what trips are considered educational and what

are fun?"

At present, any trip approved by a school principal must be authorized by a superintendent before it's given the green light.

But principals are looking for tighter excursion policy regulations, pointing to such recent requests as white-water rafting, bungee jumping and hot air ballooning — all of which they turned down, notes superintendent Fred Sweeney.

While thrill-seeking trips "might be downright outlawed" because of the threat of liability, banning school trips altogether "could deprive some kids of a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity," warns Mr. Sweeney.

He points to reduced group rates and fund-raising efforts students usually begin at least one year before a trip takes place.

At Father Leo J. Austin Catholic Secondary School in Whitby, for instance, 50 French-immersion students have been planning since last year for a trip to Paris in June.

"If people think it's just for



rich people, that's just not true," says student council president Jennifer Shannon, 16, who "worked all summer" saving for the trip and is involved in at least three fundraisers to offset costs.

The Ajax resident believes the trip will be "very educational" and applauds the teamwork required in fundraisers.

At St. Mary Catholic Secondary School in Pickering, student council president Mike Hills, 18, has "received a lot of complaints from people who want to go on trips but don't have enough money" to take part in a band trek to Vancouver and basketball trip to Texas.

"Price is a big problem, especially with a school club or team, as opposed to pleasure trips," he explains.

Still, students should have the chance to decide whether they want to take part in trips, suggests Mr. Hill, who hopes the board will talk to students before making any decision.

Mr. Sweeney will meet with principals next month and report his findings to trustees in November.

Armed bandits strike Pickering restaurant

PICKERING - A restaurant manager was forced to open a safe at gunpoint while 16 employees were ordered to lie on the floor here late Thursday night.

At approximately 11:45 p.m., two armed men entered The Olive Garden on Kingston Rd. through the back door while employees were putting out garbage.

The manager, who was struck with a gun, opened the

safe. The bandits grabbed cash and fled on foot with a third man Durham Regional Police believe was waiting outside.

The suspects are black males. The two who entered the restaurant are slightly over 6' tall, while the one outside is somewhat shorter.

Two hand guns were seen during the robbery.

Police investigation is continuing.

Gas stations' sales of other goodies fuel Pickering fight

PICKERING - What gasoline stations can and cannot sell without operating as convenience stores has become an issue in Pickering.

Town staff will investigate how much floor space local gas stations are using to sell "accessory items" at the direction of council. The investigation follows complaints by Family Food Fair that its neighbor, Ultramar Canada Inc., is operating a virtual convenience store out of a gas station at Brock Rd. and Pickering Parkway.

Ultramar, fined last July for sale of goods contrary to a Town bylaw, recently requested permission to continue selling cold drinks, packaged food, cigarettes and other goods.

Town planners are agreeable and say council could endorse service station definitions to allow the sale of those items, or it could amend bylaws to specifically recognize the sale of a wider variety of goods from service stations.

The Ultramar property is currently zoned only for the sale of fuel and automotive-related products, planning director Neil Carroll told council Monday. The proposed change would allow the sale of chips, cookies and more as long as it wasn't the primary function of the station, he said. "You wouldn't be able to have a mini-Becker's or a mini-Mac's."

(There are gas stations in Town on properties zoned for both fuel and retail sales, and therefore are not in violation by selling non-automotive items. Mr. Carroll explained in an interview later. Other gas stations may be in the same situation as Ultramar).

Police services board member re-appointed

DURHAM - Sarah McDonald has been re-appointed by the provincial government to serve an additional two years as a member of the Durham Police Services Board. This will be her second two-year term.

Mrs. McDonald is a resident of Ajax and has lived in Durham Region for 18 years. She works as a multicultural and race relations consultant for the Durham Board of Education, and is a founding member of the Pickering Caribbean Cultural Association.

"I enjoy being a part of this board," said Mrs. McDonald. "We work together as a team for the benefit of the community. I want to put a lot of my energy into the police service."

convenience store and would "virtually finish off the convenience industry," maintained Bev Rosner,

whose company is landlord to Family Fair. "Convenience operators may as well shut down."

Council deferred a decision for two months pending the staff report.

Pickering firefighter hiring rules could be changed

PICKERING - A suggestion the Town revise its hiring policy regarding part-time firefighters is expected to be debated in two weeks.

Councillor Maurice Brenner says non-Pickering residents who live within a 10-kilometre radius of a fire hall should be eligible to

apply for a job as a part-time firefighter.

Currently, a Town policy says only Pickering residents or municipal taxpayers can be hired as part-time firefighters, and full-time firefighters are usually hired from the experienced pool of part-timers. The same hiring policy is in effect in Ajax and Whitby.

Mr. Brenner's suggestion follows a complaint against the Town made to the Human Rights Commission. Marlene Lambert of Ajax appealed to the commission after she learned Pickering wouldn't consider her application to become a firefighter.

Two residents asked council Monday to leave the current hiring policy in place.

"Let's give the people of Pickering a shot first," urged Randy Vaine. "Let's leave our bylaw alone for now."

Elizabeth Quinn added, "I really don't think changing the policy is good for Pickering. There are so many good people in Pickering, taxpayers, that are qualified to be firefighters."

Residents invited to Take Back the Night

DURHAM - Durham residents are being invited to take back the night.

The Region's first Take Back the Night walk is being organized by the Oshawa Durham Rape Crisis Centre in Oshawa Thursday, Sept. 30.

The evening kicks off at City Hall at 6 p.m. with face painting and balloons for the kids. Oshawa Mayor Nancy Diamond will preside over the opening ceremonies at 7 p.m. and the women and children will take back the night with a walk through downtown streets beginning at 7:30 p.m.

At 8:30 p.m., the post-walk festivities at Memorial Park will include a live band — Julia Propeller — which recently opened for Blue Rodeo.

Men are encouraged to show their support by participating in both the pre-walk and post-walk activities, said organizer Noelle Bickle.

The actual walk, however, is just for women and children.

She explained that while a woman might feel safe with a brother, father or male friend, she might feel afraid to walk the streets by herself or with her daughter or son. And that's the point of the walk.



Durham College gets passing grade

DURHAM - Over 94 per cent of first-year students who attended Durham College last year were satisfied with the education and services they were receiving, according to a survey conducted by the college last December.

The study also found that more than 93 per cent believed they made the right decision in attending the college. Over 94 per cent felt the college provides the skills and knowledge required for success. Around 90 per cent said they would recommend Durham to their friends.

The study was based on a sampling of questionnaires completed by 390 students. It showed an increase of almost eight percentage points over the overall student satisfaction rate of the previous year.

Students were asked to state whether they were very satisfied, satisfied, dissatisfied or very dissatisfied with, or had no opinion about, a range of college services. The percentages cited for student satisfaction combine the "very satisfied" and "satisfied" ratings. Study results issued by the college did not include the precise figures for the other ratings received.

College student council president Shari Lovelock was not surprised by the survey findings.

"It is an excellent, excellent place," she said. "It's very open, very friendly. The administration seems to be very progressive."

"It's all coming from the top and it's all due to (college president) Gary Polonsky," added Ms. Lovelock. She praised Mr. Polonsky for his interest in students and receptiveness to their concerns.

The topics students were somewhat less happy about included the help they received in choosing or planning a program (79.8 per cent satisfaction); the sensitivity of administration to students' needs (75.1 per cent satisfaction); the student loan application process (50.9 per cent satisfaction); the price of textbooks (24.5 per cent satisfaction); the availability of parking (55.6 per cent satisfaction); and parking fees (42.6 per cent satisfaction).

Though 98.2 per cent of students were satisfied that a college diploma would increase their chances of getting a good job, as

many as 14.5 per cent said they were uncertain why they were attending college.

Fifty-six per cent believed college graduates were likely to have an easier time finding jobs than university graduates. But 50.5 per cent said a university degree

would be of more use than a college diploma, and 33.3 per cent said they intended to go to university after completing their college diploma. Six per cent already had university degrees.

Judging by the survey results, most of the students aren't killing

themselves with homework. Only 7.3 per cent said they did course work every night of the week, while 13.4 per cent said they did some five or six nights a week, 31.7 per cent did some three or four nights a week, 28 per cent did some one or two nights a

week, and 19.6 per cent only "rarely" did any. Over 36 per cent admitted to being "rather lazy".

On the other hand 38.3 per cent said they found tests and exams an enjoyable experience, and 32.6 per cent enjoyed writing essays and reports.

Lawn bowling facility fails to strike council fancy

AJAX - Lawn bowlers here will have to continue travelling out of town to enjoy their sport.

An estimated \$250,000 price tag for an eight-lane bowling green put the item on a 'wish list' of recreation facilities that may be built in Ajax in the future.

Harland Cres. resident Tina

Thompson wrote two letters in the summer to parks and recreation director Tom Flood requesting the facility.

"There are many people in this Town who would support this, and it seems to me that ever since I have been in Ajax (I came in 1952), nothing much in the

In 1952), nothing much in the

recreational line has been done for old people," she wrote.

She included a petition with 94 signatures supporting a facility.

Ward 4 councillor Jim McMaster told council colleagues Monday the \$250,000 figure doesn't include the cost of

buying land or the yearly maintenance charges. Installing lights would increase the cost to \$400,000, he added.



Keep on tripping

Obtaining a well-rounded education is an ongoing process that can't be confined to a classroom. Many aspects of school life, such as participating in team sports and socializing at the prom, help mold the characters of young people and teach them lessons in life.

School trips, now under scrutiny by the Durham Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board, can also be valuable educational tools.

Many of us have been fortunate enough to take an out-of-country school trip with our peers. Many have travelled with sports teams to participate in tournaments. It would be a shame if students in the Region's separate schools today are denied that opportunity.

It's true that, in these economic times, many parents may not be able to afford the cost of trips, and that can make it hard on the child who's forced to stay behind. But that's where group fund-raising activities come in.


The so-called "thrill-seeking adventure" trips are a different story. Recently, requests by students that they go white-water rafting, bungee jumping and hot-air ballooning have been denied by board superintendents. Those kinds of activities can, and should, be done by the kids on their own time. There's a big difference between taking a trip for the sole purpose of having fun and taking a trip that will include competitive sports or touring historical sites.

If the board imposes tighter excursion policy regulations -- which principals want -- then trustees will presumably have to define which trips are educational and which are merely "fun". It will be to trustees' credit if they come up with those guidelines and don't outlaw trips altogether.


Board superintendent Fred Sweeney says banning all trips "could deprive some kids of a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity." Reduced group travelling rates and fund-raising efforts can make all the difference to a youth who might not otherwise have the chance to see a bit of the world.

In Whitby, 50 French-immersion students have been planning a trip to Paris since last year. Dump plan blindly marches ahead

To the editor,

Does Queen's Park's left hand know what it's right hand is doing?

The Province's Interim Waste Authority (IWA) garbage dump site search in Durham Region has resulted in a short list of five sites. All four sites in Pickering conflict with other major provincial developments.

One is located in the planned

path of Hwy. 407. Is Queen's Park planning a four-lane tunnel under the garbage dump, a bridge over it, or will it expropriate extra land for a costly detour around the megadump?

That same site and two others are within the Planning Area for the proposed Seaton community. Is Queen's Park actually proposing to build this "model community" of

more than 75,000 people around the largest garbage dump in Canada? Surely this is a new departure in community planning.

The fourth is located in the Agricultural Preserve announced by the Rae government as part of the Rouge Park. Preserving good farmland by dumping garbage on it is one of the strangest notions I've ever heard come out of Queen's Park.

These blunders raise troubling

questions about the viability of a process which seems to have marched forward for two years with its eyes clamped closed. It's past time for the Rae government to let its right hand -- the IWA -- know what its left hand -- the rest of the government -- is doing.

Maybe Mr. Rae should just follow the Environmental Assessment Act like everyone else.

I have recently given birth. It was probably the best experience in my whole life. I had my midwife, Carol Cameron, my husband and children in attendance with me and my hospital birth (which was necessary because of health risks in my particular pregnancy) was made as close as was humanly possible to the home birth which in my heart I desired.

All of this was possible only because I was willing to go the extra distance to another com-

munity's hospital. You see, midwives are not welcome at Ajax-Pickering Hospital. Even though they are in the process of being licensed in this province and even though they provide as much support to the new father as to the birthing woman. Carol helped us to achieve the natural birth we had desired so much, this considering this was our largest baby by far.

Children are also not welcome in the labour unit of Ajax-Pickering. It was important to us that our children be there. Choices are very important to many birthing women and can be the difference between a natural birth and a caesarean.

Why must Durham women get their desired choices at hospitals that are not in Durham? I find that to be a very sad situation. It's time for change.

Colds, coughs common

Back to class, back to runny noses

DURHAM - If back-to-school means back-to-coughs-and-runny-noses in your household, you're not alone. That's because kids acquire more than an education when they return to classes, they also pick up all kinds of viruses from each other, which they seem to pass around between them for the rest of the school year.

"Yes, kids tend to become sicker when they're in school," says Durham Medical Officer of Health Dr. Robert Kyle, "particularly in the winter months when it's more difficult to get out to recess."

The most common illness by far is the common cold, he says, because there are several hundred different types of viruses that can cause it, and they all tend to be very contagious. While kids and adults of all ages can catch them, it's the younger elementary school kids who seem to be hit the worst.

"They tend to have poor hygiene," says Dr. Kyle. "They cough without covering their mouths, they're more interactive with other kids, they tend to share food."

The symptoms are familiar to all parents — sore throat, a

cough, a runny nose, fever. The difficulty is figuring out when it's serious enough to keep kids home, especially when working parents have to stay at home to take care of them.

According to Dr. Kyle, a "good indicator" is whether a child says he or she is too sick to go to school. But if you've got the kind of kid who wants to stay home after one sneeze, you might consider whether he or she is coughing heavily, has a high fever (above 38.3 degrees centigrade), or simply appears unwell.

"When in doubt, better to be

on the safe side," says Dr. Kyle. "Obviously if it appears to be more serious not only would you keep the child from school, you would probably have the child see his or her own doctor."

There's not much point in keeping a child home simply to avoid infecting others, according to the doctor.

That's because viruses are often spread before any symptoms of illness appear in children.

"There's so many kids carrying these viruses, there's very little one parent can do," he explains.

The average cold is contagious for one day before symptoms occur and up to five days into the illness.

As for the other traditional childhood illnesses, Dr. Kyle says they are not that common any more since all school children must be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps and rubella.

Chicken pox still gets around a bit among the younger ones, and there is an occasional outbreak of measles because a small number of children fail to respond adequately to the vac-

Clarence and Alabama inadvertently swipe a briefcase full of drugs and head on a high speed cross-country chase with cops and robbers in persistent pursuit.

The pair decide selling the booty to a Hollywood big wig is the safest and simplest way to set themselves up for life.

Boy, were they wrong. It turns into a run for their lives.

While Slater and Arquette make an odd couple, they are lovable and you end up pulling for them as they outrun cars, guns and the bad guys.

The bad dudes, and not so bad dudes, are the best aspects of the

There are a lot of memorable cameos in this movie. Dennis Hopper is Clifford Worley, Clarence's dad, and has to deal with a sudden re-emergence of his troubled son.

Elvis, who keeps showing up in the bathroom mirror, is played by Val Kilmer and eggs Clarence into his life of crime.

Brad Pitt plays a zonked-out druggie and Gray Oldman is a pimp. Both are flat-out funny.

Christopher Walken is the loving couple's worst nightmare as Vicenzo Coccotti, a dapper and ultimately dangerous Detroit hitman.

Barry Williams, Colin Kaye and Julian Olden scored for Dunbarton in the opening half.


Paul Hutcheson scored an insurance marker for Dunbarton in the second half to end the scoring.







FULL-TIME COURSES:

All full-time course candidates must be in receipt of UIC benefits at the start date of the program.

COOK PRE-APPRENTICESHIP BASIC (610 Hours, Oct 18 - March 25, Oshawa Campus)

This full-time food preparation program prepares students to undertake employment as cooking personnel. The course consists of 12 subjects plus a placement component.
