Welfare fraud reduced?

New computer hopes to catch thieves, estimated at 550 cases in Durham

DURHAM - In an attempt to cut down on some of the \$180 million in welfare fraud, the Ontario government will install a new computer system.

The province-wide system will link social service departments, cut down on paper work and give case-workers more time to work with clients, says Pat Daley, the special assistant, communications, to Minister of Community and Social Services Tony Silipo.

More than \$6 billion is spent on social assistance (general welfare) each year in Ontario, making up about 10 per cent of the provincial budget. There are about 640,000 welfare cases in the province, representing about 1.3 million people.

In Durham, there are about 11,400 general welfare cases and approximately 7,000 family benefit (chiefly single parents and disabled people) cases. In 1993, Durham will spend about \$151 million on welfare, with money coming from regional taxpayers and provincial grants.

Both Ms. Daley and Paul Cloutier, the administrator of income support for Durham Region, say about three per cent of welfare cases involve fraud.

That works out to about 550 cases in Durham, which Mr. Cloutier calls "a lot."

He adds that a survey done by a University of Toronto law professor found about 50 per cent of

Beware of phony fire 'inspectors'

AJAX - The fire department here is warning residents to be wary of people going door-to-door claiming to be doing inspections.

Ajax fire prevention officer Captain John Hunter says his department has had complaints about people showing up at homes, saying they're conducting inspections and checking smoke detectors.

"No one from this fire department or from (Durham) Region is

doing this. We don't do inspections unless we're requested by the homeowner," Capt. Hunter says.

People claiming to be inspectors usually prey on seniors, he says.

Late last month, an 83-year-old Ajax woman had her purse, including her credit card, stolen after she opened her home to a man who said he was checking smoke detectors.

On the same day, an 80-year-

old Oshawa woman had her purse and credit card taken by a man claiming to sell peepholes for doors.

Capt. Hunter says he's checked with fire departments in neighboring communities and was told they haven't had any recent complaints.

However, "If it's going on here, it could be going on there."

Earlier this year, the Pickering Fire Department issued similar warnings.

Capt. Hunter notes that all Ajax Fire Department personnel carry an identification card, with the carrier's picture on it, and they wear the department uniform.

If anyone suspicious shows up asking to conduct an inspection, call Durham Regional Police at 9-1-1.

people admit to defrauding the income tax system.

"No one working in the system condones abuse of the system," Mr. Cloutier says. "I hope most people also have the same reaction to people cheating on income taxes, because that's also money geared for government programs."

Nancy Anderson, of the information systems branch with the community and social services ministry, says the "greatest ability" of the new system is detecting fraud and abuse before it happens.

The \$100-million system will link all social services offices in the province, so caseworkers can verify information across the system, Ms. Anderson says.

Ms. Daley says the new computers also "streamline the whole administration of social assistance and make it less likely there'll be errors."

Some municipalities use the existing provincial network, while others are on stand-alone systems and some are on a manual paper process.

When a person files for welfare, a caseworker fills out a four-page form and then puts the information on to a computer.

The new computers will also cut the amount of millions of dollars in overpayments, Ms. Daley says.

Installation will begin in the spring and take about two years.

Durham has a welfare fraud hotline which people can call. Last year, more than 700 calls were made, but in more than half the cases there were no irregularities, Mr. Cloutier says.

If someone has a complaint of possible abuse, call 432-6192.

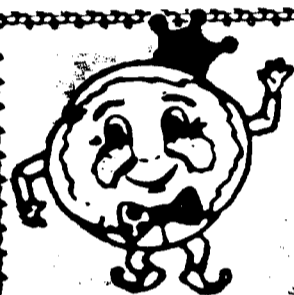

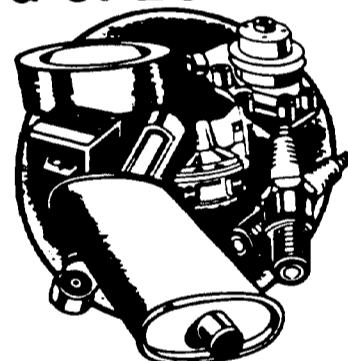

the late spring and summer. Under the social contract, custodians must take 12 unpaid leave days before March 31, 1994. They also met dictated savings through early retirement incentives.

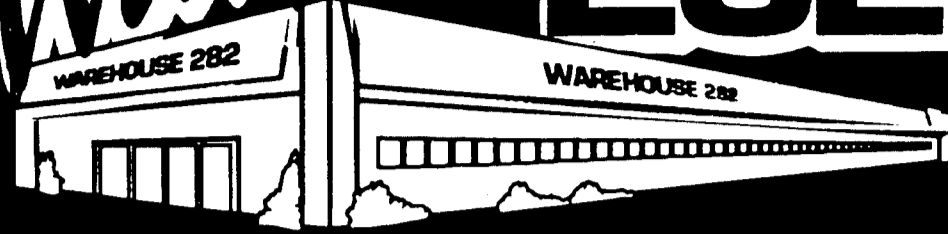

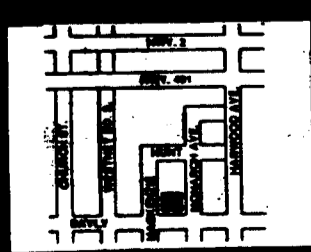

We can only imagine what a body looks like after it's been bounced off the pavement, having been thrown from a motorcycle. And we are glad our emergency rooms and rehab centres see less of these injuries thanks to motorcycle helmets, also made mandatory by legislation.

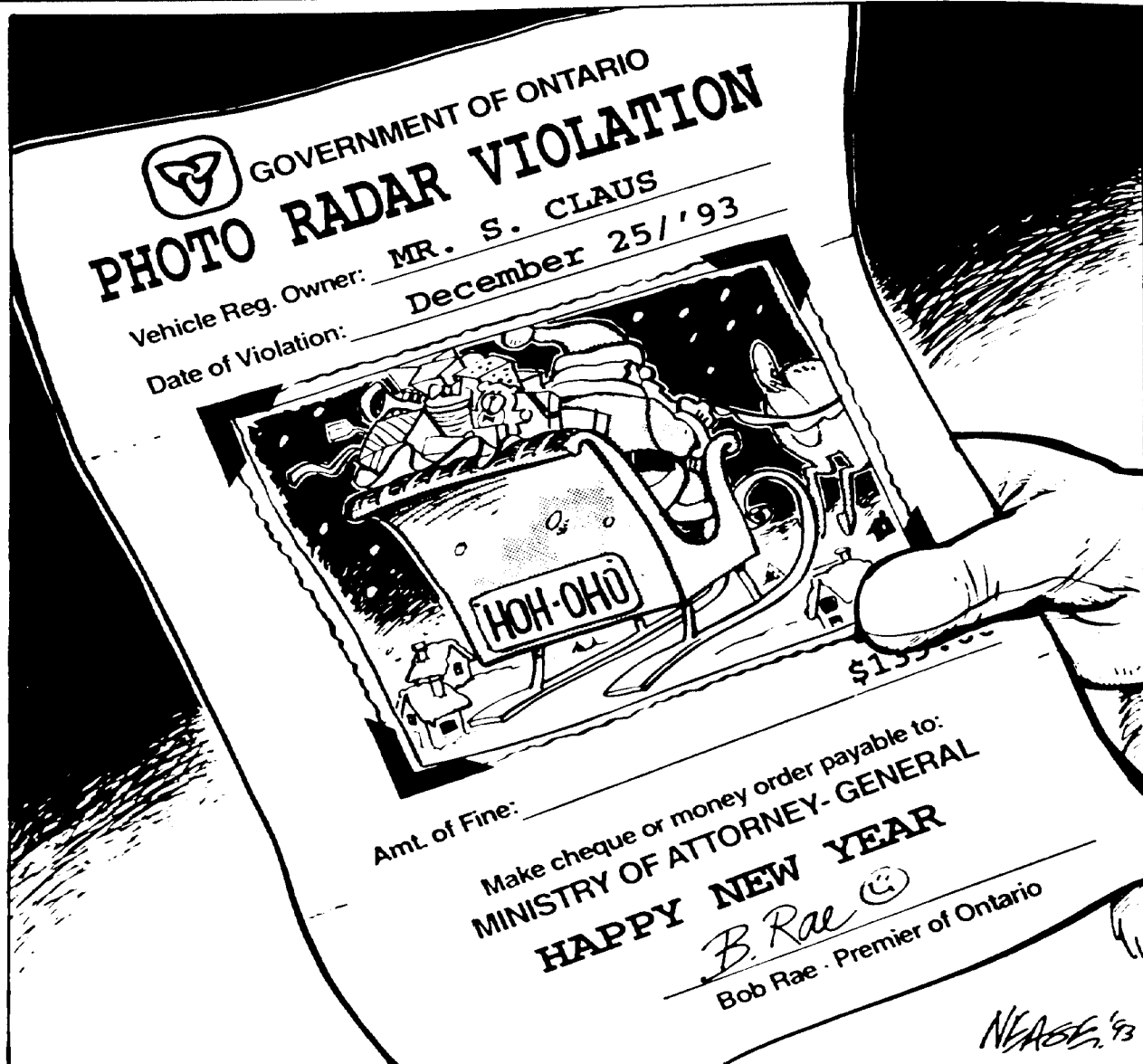
And let's face it, from a purely financial aspect, our over-burdened health care system needs as few long-term care patients as possible.

Car idlers can cause chaos

To the editor:

Here we go again! Now that the cold weather has arrived, the annual winter epidemic of car idling has begun. Drivers warm their cars up in the morning or sit in them with engines running, perhaps unaware of the health and environmental damage to which they are contributing.

Typical early morning scene in my neighborhood: Family A goes out to the car 15 minutes before departure time to warm it up. Gradually, the car exhaust wafts through the neighborhood in which Families B, C and D have children with asthma, a condition car exhaust helps to trigger. One family wants a warm car, the others dread the onset of asthma outbreaks which sometimes lead to their children's hospitalization.

I'd like to offer a few simple suggestions for how we can all work on solutions to the many problems caused by our cars. Resolve to drive less! Walk, bike, carpool, and use public transit more. Dress appropriately for the weather, then warming up the car (something which is bad for the engine, anyway) won't be necessary. When sitting for longer than 10 seconds, turn the engine off! If these simple measures seem too much of a strain, think of them as a gift to our children and grandchildren, who are having to grow up with a rapidly dwindling supply of clean air.

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation has created a poster - great for store windows - which says "STOP IDLING" and explains briefly why we need to do so. I created a handout which I give to people who sit in cars with engines idling. People concerned about air pollution and our children's health are welcome to give me a call (985-3225) - I'd be more than happy to share copies of both.

School board names new building

DURHAM - After months of consideration, the public school board has selected a name for its new \$21.5-million headquarters.

The administrative building will be named the Durham Board of Education Centre, trustees decided Monday.

The four-storey centre is being built along with a new high school on a 26-acre site on the north side of Taunton Rd., between Garden and Anderson Sts., in Whitby.

It's expected to be complete by the end of September 1994. It will house administrative staff who now work out of six facilities across the Region. (Less than one-third of that staff now work out of the board's central office on Rossland Rd. in Oshawa.)

Members of the public were invited to submit names for the administrative building, which has been criticized by some as too costly a venture during tough economic times.

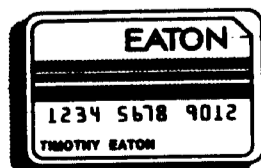

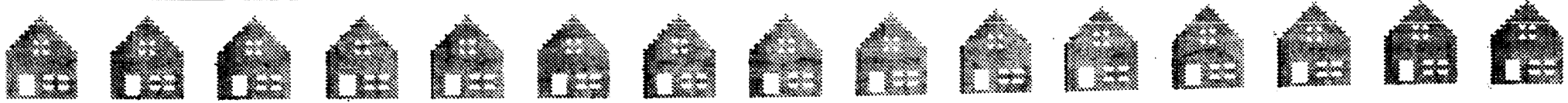

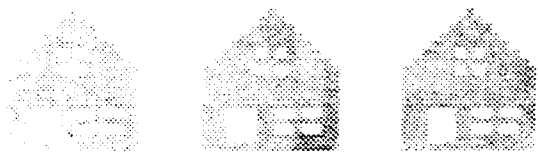

Ajax kids become cub reporters

editor's notes



AJAX - The special section you're reading is the result of a lot of hard work by a group of talented kids.

Ten children between the ages of nine and 13, eager to experience the job of a newspaper reporter, signed up for a new program offered by the Town of Ajax Department of Parks and Recreation. The first-ever Junior Reporters' Club met every Tuesday evening for 10 weeks, and it was an eye-opening experience for all of us.

To begin with, the story ideas the kids came up with were impressive. Imagine being 13 years old and wanting to tackle the issue of provincial social contract legislation through an interview with Ajax mayor Jim Winy. Others chose to interview

well-known local personalities, such as Ken Shaw of CFTO-TV and Mr. Dressup. Inside, you'll also find interesting opinion pieces written by the children and other great stories.

Over the course of the program, we discussed lots of aspects of newspaper reporting. The children learned how to recognize newsworthy events, how to set up and conduct interviews and how to write their stories. We also took a close look at how newspapers are designed and put together, and talked about the importance of advertising.

On our final evening, awards certificates were handed out for the three top stories. Adam Dowsett achieved both the Best News Story Award and the Best

Editorial Award, while Ryan Skalko picked up the Best Feature Story Award for his interesting piece on Mr. Shaw.

For one reason or another, not every member of the group was able to complete a story or hand one in early enough to make our deadline, so you won't see everyone's byline here.

However, the names of all club members are listed below the photograph that appears above. Newspaper deadlines are tough, and although a few children had difficulty meeting them, all learned something about the business.

Several of the program participants show talent as journalists, should they decide to pursue that career. All professed to having enjoyed the course.

On behalf of the children, I'd like to thank Peter Marsh, head of Metroland's printing division, for making this special section possible.

Without his support and enthusiasm, the kids' stories might never have been published.

A special thanks as well to all those in the community who agreed to be interviewed by the children and gave generously of their time.

The Ajax Junior Reporters' Club was certainly a worthwhile project that we all enjoyed, and the children and I hope you take pleasure in reading their efforts.

Maybe someday, we'll see their bylines in newspapers and magazines regularly.

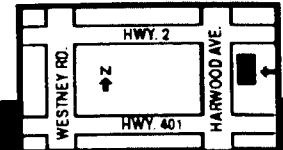

AJAX - Rainbows, a support group to make kids feel wanted and to help them cope with a loss, is "very effective", says a teacher at Lord Durham Public School.

In the Rainbows program, a

group of four to five students and one facilitator meet once every six-day school cycle to talk about their problems. For example, they might discuss death or divorce. Last year in Lord Durham Public School there were 70 to 80 students involved, says teacher Yvonne Eefting.

Most Durham Region schools have Rainbows and are either in the first or second year of offering the program. The main goal of Rainbows is to make kids feel that they are not alone in their situation.

"I think that it is an excellent program and it is very effective," comments Miss Eefting.

Ryan Skalko, 11, enjoyed meeting CFTO-TV's Ken Shaw for an interview. The St. Jude school student joined the program to improve his writing skills and feels he's achieved that goal. He was also interested in learning a bit about journalism.

Laura Tegelberg, 10, is a student at St. James Catholic school. She joined the Junior Reporters' program to improve her writing skills and believes she has.

Without hockey on TV, the day is boring. When hockey's not on the tube, I play road hockey.

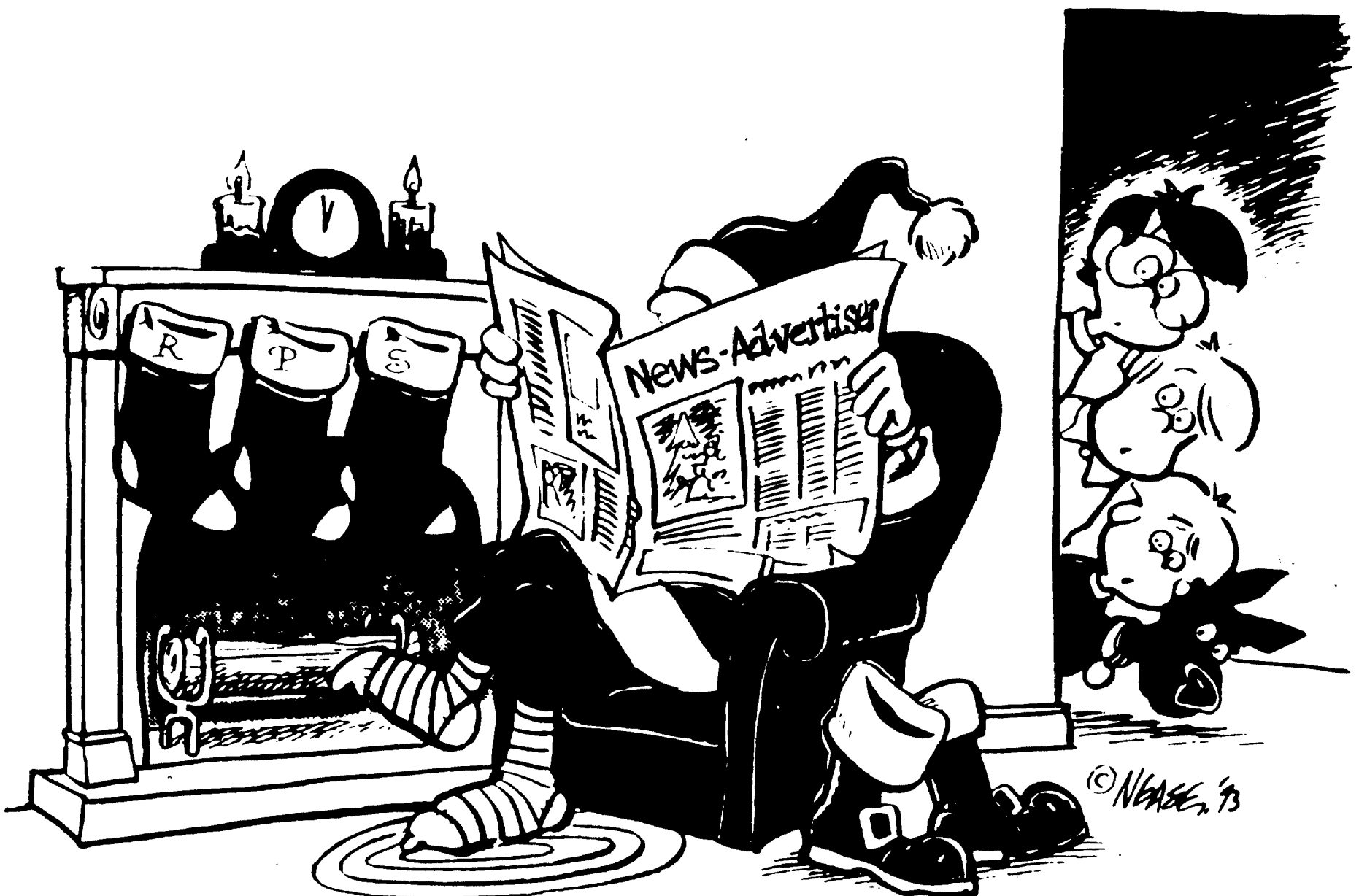

This is what we get with Wayne's World 2, the sequel to the enormously funny and successful Wayne's World of a year ago.

The two lead characters, Wayne Campbell (Mike Myers) and Garth Algar (Dana Carvey), are just as silly the second time around but now they have a purpose in life and it seems to ruin the whole premise of the pair.

Wayne wants to accomplish something with his life and it takes some nocturnal intervention by a naked Indian and Jim Morrison to set him on the course.

Morrison tells Wayne in a Field Of Dreams sequence that the bands will come if he books them. And so begins the epic journey to adulthood for the boyhood buddies.

Wayne's fertile imagination tells him holding Waynestock, the biggest concert since Woodstock, will bring him closer to being a man.

The long and winding road carries the pair to England in search of the greatest roadie of all time, Del Preston (Ralph Brown), to assist them with the show.
