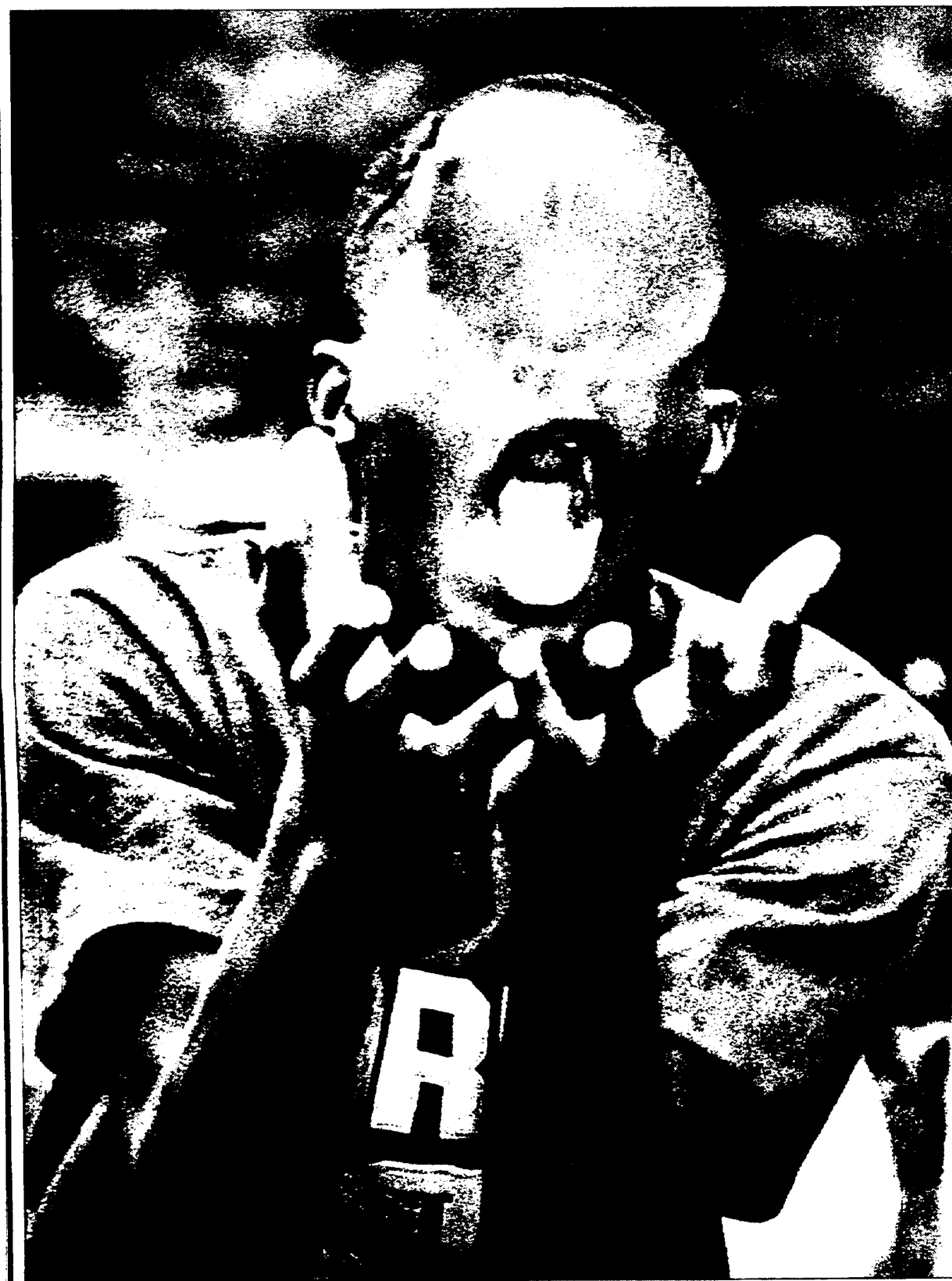

THEFTS UP

Police are warning residents to keep an eye out for thieves

AJAX/PICKERING - Durham Regional Police are warning residents to take extra security precautions after a rash of break-ins and auto thefts in the first six months of the year.

Police report there were a total 261 break-ins in Pickering in the first six months of this year compared to 197 over the same period last year, which translates to a 32 per cent increase. Pickering had 48 break-ins

in June alone.

Ajax had 269 break-ins in the first six months, a 25 per cent increase over last year's total of 214. Ajax saw 63 break-ins in June alone.

Auto thefts are also on the rise.

Pickering auto thefts totaled 122 in the first six months of the year, with 23 of those occurring in June.

Ajax saw its auto thefts go from 66 last year, to 83 this year, an increase of 25 per cent. The town had 23 during a five-week period between June 30 and Aug. 8.

While police consider the numbers disturbing, it's difficult to determine the cause of the increases, said police spokesman Staff. Sgt.

Charges laid in Ajax bar robbery

AJAX - Durham Regional Police have charged four men with the July 30th armed robbery of Terry Sheridan's Texas Country Show and Bar.

The men were arrested following a joint investigation by the Metro Toronto Police Holdup Squad and the Durham Regional Police Robbery Unit, says Insp. John Hamilton of 24 Division in Ajax.

"Thank God (arrests were made) before somebody was killed. The credit must go to the members of those two units," says Insp. Hamilton.

Police have also recovered four handguns - three of which are semi-automatics - which they believe were used in holdups in Scarborough and Ajax.

Durham police laid the charges after questioning the four men, who were arrested by Metro police following an early morning robbery at a Scarborough restaurant Tuesday.

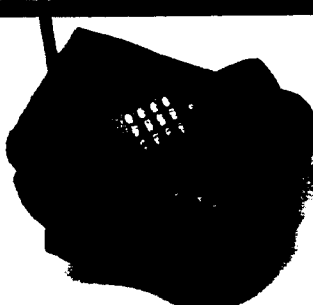

Man arrested in connection with hold up

PICKERING - An 18-year-old Scarborough man is charged with armed robbery after a convenience store was robbed around 9 p.m. Tuesday night.

Durham Regional Police say a man who was armed with a replica handgun entered Mike's Variety and Milk Store on Kingston Rd. and demanded cash from the female teller.

The man and a male accomplice then fled the scene in a white car after being given an unknown quantity of cash.

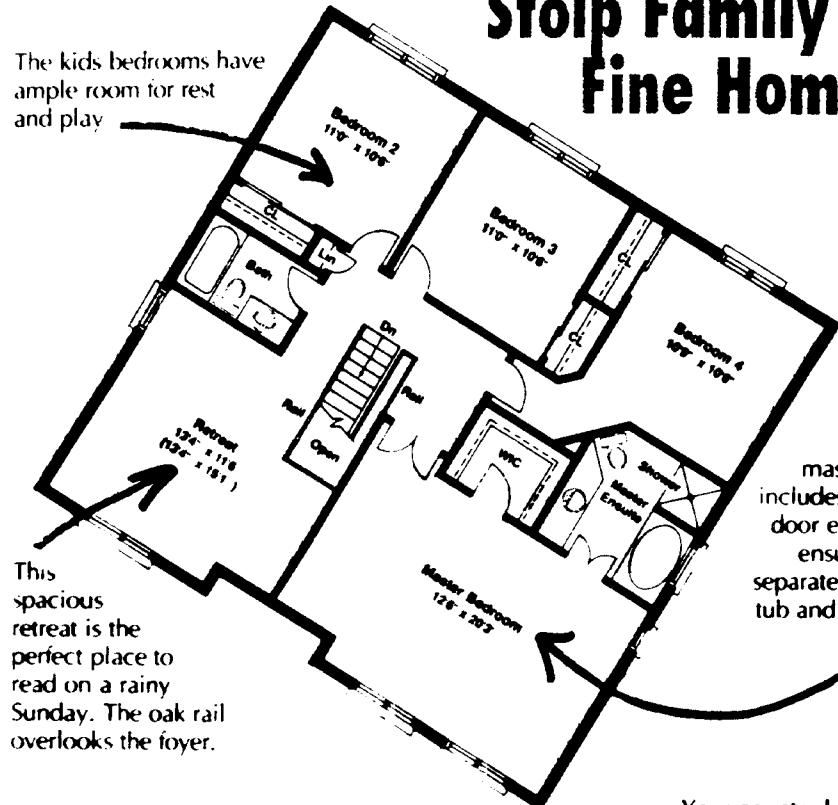
The vehicle was later stopped by Metro Toronto Police in Scarborough and one man arrested. Another man fled on foot from the scene and is still at large, police say.

Some of the money taken from the store was recovered by police.

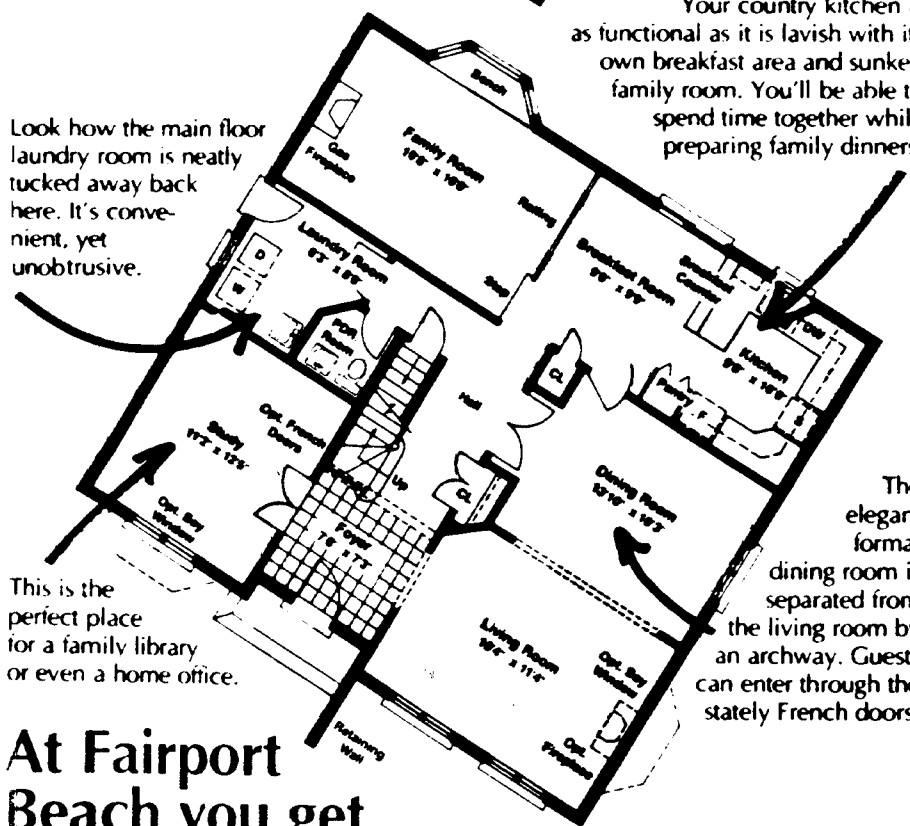

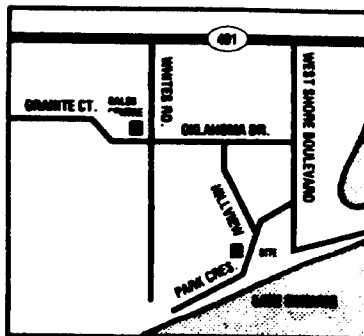

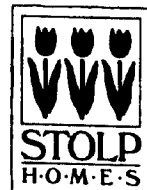

Be more vigilant about protecting property, warn police

"It's a cycle. Crime is totally unpredictable. Statistics over a short period of time don't really give an accurate picture of what's going on. We don't want to scare the public," he says.

At the same time, police are asking the public to be more vigilant when locking their homes, businesses and vehicles. The public should also be reporting any suspicious occurrences by calling Neighborhood Watch or Crime

Stoppers.

"We need the assistance of everyone," says Insp. John Hamilton, adding people should dial 911 when they spot suspicious individuals near their home or vehicle.

Police are advising people to always lock their windows and doors, as well as their garage doors, at home. As well, people should never leave their keys in their vehicles and should always lock their car doors when leaving their vehicle.

Under no circumstances should people ever leave a spare key inside their car.

"People sometimes make it too easy for break-ins or thefts to occur," Insp. Hamilton says.

Homeowners have lost items such as cash, jewelry, electronics, televisions, VCRs and appliances such as microwaves.

To help with the recovery of stolen items police will launch Operation Identification in conjunction with the Ajax Family Festival and Trade Show at the Ajax

Community Centre Sept. 9-11.

Residents will be able to borrow electric engraver pencils from police stations to mark their valuables.

"When something is stolen, nobody ever knows the serial number of the item, which makes it very difficult to trace," Insp. Hamilton says.

Often, items stolen in Ontario may turn up in other parts of the country, he says.

Under the program, the

identification numbers of stolen items would be entered into a Canada-wide computer information system. When stolen items which have been engraved with identification numbers are recovered, police are easily able to determine if they have been stolen and

who owns the items.

Insp. Hamilton says the engraver pencils are extremely easy to use and can be used on plastic, wood or metal.

Suspects each face 13 robbery charges

Metro police believe a gang made up of at least four men has been terrorizing late-night restaurant patrons in the Scarborough area over the last two months.

Several patrons at the Texas Country Show and Bar, located at the Mackenzie Plaza on the north side of Bayly St. at Mackenzie Ave., were terrorized by four armed and masked bandits who fired numerous shots and held a knife to the throat of one waitress.

The bandits also shot at a bar patron who attempted to get the licence plate number of their stolen van and two police officers in a cruiser who pursued the van into Scarborough before losing it.

Metro police arrested four men after bandits with handguns terrorized patrons at the Imperial Place Chinese Restaurant on Alton Towers Circle in Scarborough this week.

Last week, bandits pistol-whipped and roughed up patrons at Poach Place restaurant on Sewells Rd. in Scarborough. The female owner there suffered a heart attack.

Durham Regional Police have laid 16 charges against each of the four men in connection with the armed robbery of Texas Country Show and Bar.

Each of the men is facing 13 counts of robbery, plus one count of using a firearm in the commission of a crime, one count of being disguised with intent to commit a crime and one count of possession of a dangerous weapon.

Drugs stolen from delivery van could be lethal: police

PICKERING - Durham Regional Police are warning that drugs stolen from the back of a delivery van could be lethal if taken in the wrong dosage.

Police say someone lifted \$1,500 worth of drugs from the back of a delivery van during a delivery at the SuperCentre Plaza on Liverpool Road around 10:50 a.m. Monday.

The stolen drugs are in pill, tablet and liquid form and include codeine, hydrochloride and morphine.

The truck belonged to Medis Health and Pharmaceutical of Mississauga, police say.

Anyone with information regarding the incident should call Durham Regional Police at 683-9100, ext. 324 or Crime Stoppers at 436-8477.

In addition, a 19-year-old man from Pharmacy Ave. in Scarborough is charged with one count of attempted murder after an Ajax bar patron was nearly shot.

An 18-year-old man from Carleton St. in Markham is charged with two counts of attempted murder after two Durham Regional Police officers in pursuit of a stolen van had a bullet hit the windshield of their cruiser.

Also facing charges are two 18-year-old Markham men, one from Timber Circle, the other from Coxworth Ave.

The men also face at least 46 charges in connection with robberies in Metro.

They were to make appearances in Toronto court and will be scheduled to appear in Oshawa court.

The release states that her "astute business acumen and powerful leadership capabilities would bring invaluable experience to council".

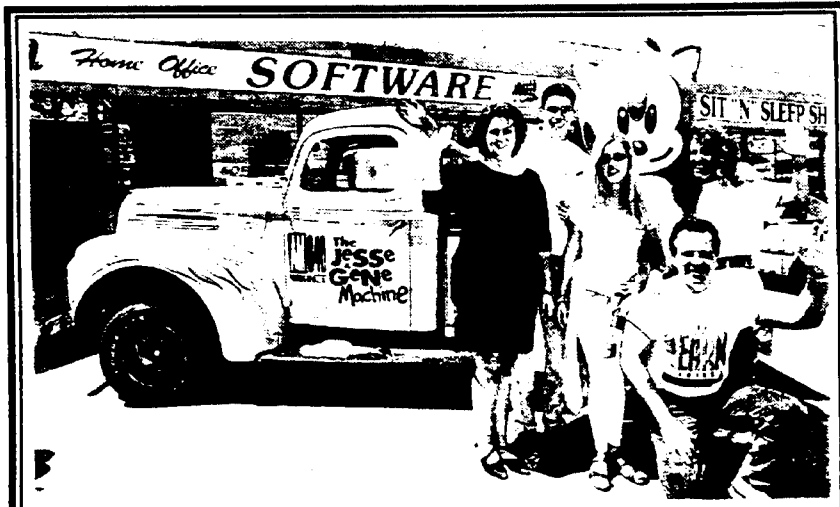

Armed robbers sought

DURHAM - Crime Stoppers and the Durham Regional Police robbery squad are asking for the public's help in solving an armed robbery in Blackstock on April 20.

Just prior to midnight, a male entered the Beckers Store at 14421 Old Scugog Rd. The suspect was wearing a black ski mask and was carrying a rifle and ordered the clerk to lie face down on the floor and not move. A second person entered the store and ran to the rear area. The armed suspect then ran behind the counter and struck the security camera, causing it to blur. The robbers then removed cash from the till and about 15 cartons of cigarettes which they loaded into a garbage bag. Both of the

robbers left the store through the rear door.

Suspect number one is male, white, about 5'11" tall, 175 pounds, early 20s, wearing a black ski mask, blue coat and gloves.

There is no description of suspect number two.

Anyone with information on the identity of these two suspects is asked to call Crime Stoppers. The police service needs the

public to become involved in crime prevention and by phoning Crime Stoppers, you can assist. As a caller, you won't be asked to identify yourself or have to go to court. If an arrest is made as a result of your tip, then you qualify for a cash reward of up to \$1,000.

EDITORIAL

A needed boost for education

Durham schools have just received a shot in the arm from the Province. And it's going to pump up an area that particularly needs it — technological education.

Durham public and separate schools will share \$514,200 for technological education. And that's part of the \$60 million going to 600 secondary schools in the Province through the Technological Education Program and Renewal Fund, a five-year program.

The money will go to developing new curriculum in broad-based technologies and to purchasing new computers and other equipment. The new programs implemented would be related to communications, construction, technical design, hospitality services, manufacturing and transportation.

While cutbacks in education have been severe (and, some say, shortsighted and irreparable), the one thing that should not be neglected is the area of technological studies. Educating our youth in newer technologies is an absolute necessity if Ontario — and Canada — is to keep from falling far behind on the information highway and various other technological thoroughfares.

There are already indications that Canada has some catching up to do as other countries around the world have taken the initiative and made great leaps forward in technological innovation.

The \$60 million boost in this area will go far toward narrowing that gap.

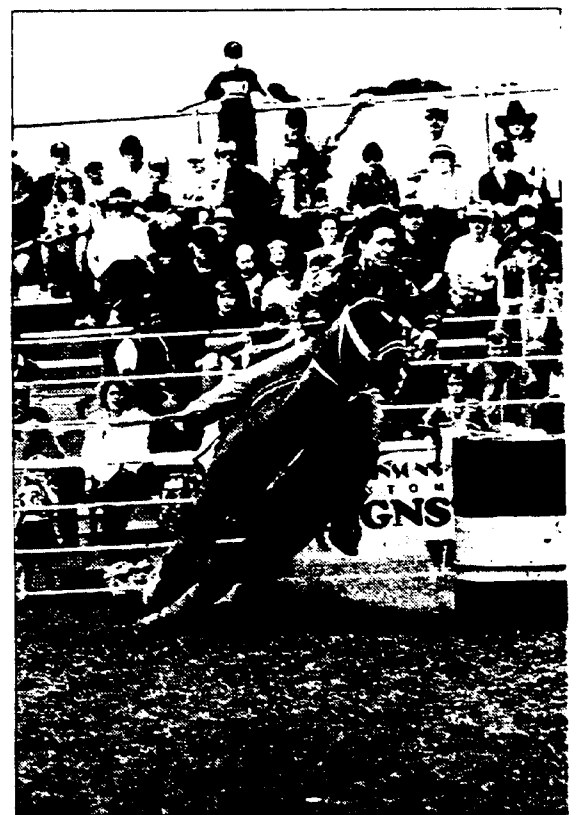

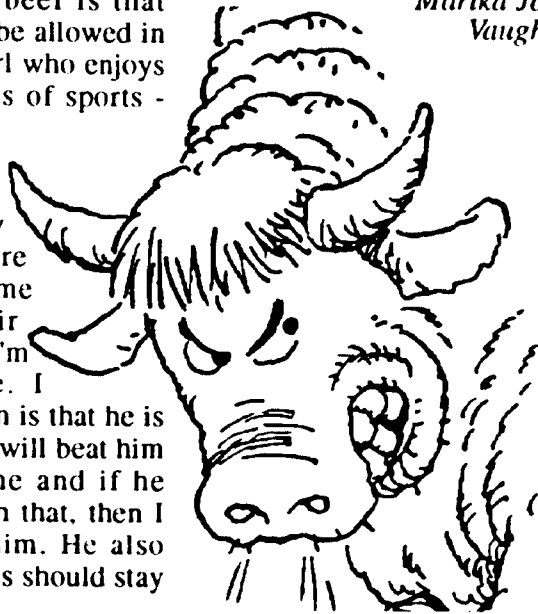
SEXIST MALES

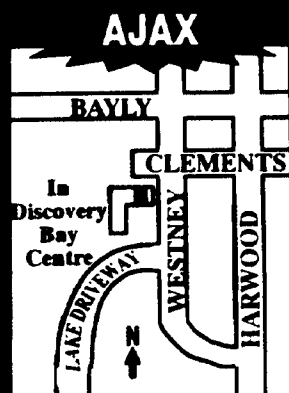

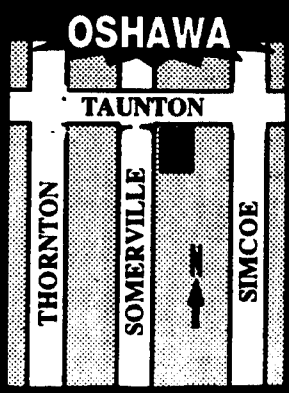
