

'Something must be done'

Loose truck wheel strikes bus

□ No injuries were reported when a transport truck travelling in Pickering Friday had a double wheel come loose when making a turn from Liverpool Road on to Bayly Street.

PICKERING — Though no one was injured after a pair of runaway truck tires bounded across a busy intersection here Friday, the incident brought back harrowing memories for a Whitby family.

"We feel something has to be done to avoid these tragedies and accidents. While there were no lives lost (in Friday's accident), there could have been," says Eileen Worona.

Her daughter Angela, 31, was killed in January when two wheels flew off a transport truck, one of which slammed into the windshield of her car while she was driving on westbound on Hwy. 401 at the Ajax-Whitby border.

"We don't want this to happen to another family," Mrs. Worona says of the tragedy.

In this latest incident, according to Durham Regional Police, a pair of wheels came off an 18-wheel transport truck making a left-hand turn from Liverpool Road to Bayly Street shortly after 9 a.m.

"I just froze. I couldn't do anything," says Jane Gribben of Pickering, whose car sustained a minor dent when struck twice by the joined wheels after they deflected off a nearby school bus.

Laidlaw bus driver Ruth May said she "saw the wheels come off the truck. The bolts started flying. I saw it coming towards

me and thought, 'What am I going to do? I can't go anywhere.'

"The guy in front of me avoided (the run-

away wheels)," recalls the veteran bus driver of 18 years, who's glad no students were

Sex magazine draws fire from Catholic school board

DURHAM — A magazine which discusses masturbation, premarital sex, abortion and birth control has been creating a lot of noise at the separate school board.

But not the kind of noise the ministry of health likely intended when it sent a publication called Noise directly to high schools.

"It contravenes the teachings of the Catholic church," explains Durham Region Roman

Sex questions answered, angry questions raised by separate board

Catholic Separate School Board director Grant Andrews. "It gives no provisions whatsoever for moral and ethical commentary."

The magazine tells students "not everybody is 'doin' it.' Really. No matter what your friends say, a lot of people your age aren't ready to go all the way."

It also candidly discusses many issues the separate board finds offensive.

For example, in response to a girl's question about unprotected

sexual intercourse, the magazine suggests she can take the morning-after pill within 72 hours to "prevent pregnancy". She's advised to take a pregnancy test if intercourse occurred two or more weeks earlier.

When asked if only boys masturbate, the magazine answers: "No. Some guys do and so do some girls. They find it a good way to get to know their own bodies."

The magazine provides phone numbers to the Teen Sex Infoline, Planned Parenthood and the AIDS

Hotline.

Board chairman Tom Oldman objects to the magazine because its editors "appear to be unaware that one-third of the students on Ontario schools attend separate schools."

But he's particularly upset the ministry of health sent the document directly to schools, instead of through administration.

"They have no regard for our policies," criticizes Mr. Oldman. "We have talked to them before. They agree to comply and then they don't."

He's referring to the ministry's distribution to schools in 1992 of a pamphlet called Condom Sense. It answered such questions as: Where should I keep my condoms? Do I have to use a condom every time? What if I'm embarrassed to buy condoms?

In a recent letter to the ministry, Mr. Oldman has asked that it "respect our separate school rights and beliefs and reflect that respect in your consideration of materials to be distributed to the schools within our jurisdiction".

A copy of that letter was also forwarded to the ministry of education and training.

While Durham Board of Education's Self and Society program facilitator Mike Brousseau "hasn't heard of or seen the magazine," he's equally critical of the ministry's distribution methods used.

"I thought they would have learned their lesson by now," he says, believing material should be sent directly to administration "even if just out of courtesy".



on board at the time of the accident. "I guess I stopped most of the force of it" as the wheels struck her front passenger-side bumper. "It all happened quite slowly, like slow motion. The wheels were wobbling as they came across the intersection." The truck driver pulled off the road at Bayly Street and Sandy Beach Road, but "it's not likely he would have known what happened," according to Ministry of Transportation

enforcement officer Bob Machesne. A broken bearing on a rear wheel of the truck's passenger-side is to blame for the accident, reports Mr. Machesne. The driver has been charged with failing to conform to safety standards and faces a fine of up to \$300. A dozen trucks — three alone this week — have lost their wheels in southern Ontario this year, according to reports. An accident on the Queen Elizabeth Way in Mississauga on Monday claimed the life of one man.

In the wake of the accidents, the Province has introduced tough new regulations for the trucking industry. It has hired 50 new enforcement officers to travel the highways looking for unsafe vehicles. Violators of safety regulations will also face stiffer fines. "I've been in the business 20 years and have never seen so many tires coming off," notes Mr. Machesne, who speculates "trucks just don't seem to be living up to (safety) standards."

Drunk driver jailed 9 months for Metro crash

Two women injured after car plowed into Toronto bus shelter

PICKERING — A local student has been jailed nine months after pleading guilty to a drunk driving accident last summer that marred the lives of two fledgling actresses.

Calvert David Fowler pleaded guilty last month to two counts of impaired driving causing bodily harm, his lawyer Jerome Rotenberg confirmed in a phone interview this week.

The electronics technician student registered 250 mg of alcohol per 100 ml of blood — triple the legal limit — when he plowed through a bus shelter on Queen Street in Toronto last Canada Day.

One woman was left permanently partially disabled.

Splintered bones of her right ankle have

been connected by a metal plate and eight screws. She also suffered a broken pelvis as a result of the accident and her legs are scarred.

A second woman suffered torn knee ligaments in both legs.

Glass is still

embedded throughout her body and scars remain above her left eye and on her legs.

Mr. Fowler was also banned from driving for two years and ordered to perform 100 hours of community service when sentenced on March 30.

Hospital's future debated by election candidates

Liberal, Tory, NDP hopefuls square off in televised debate

AJAX-PICKERING — They agree our hospital is ailing, but the Durham West candidates for the three main provincial parties each have a different remedy for curing it.

During a televised phone-in show Tuesday, New Democratic Party MPP Jim Wiseman said his party would provide money to ensure the expanded hospital could function. "Funding will be available. I have a letter from the minister (of health) saying growth will be funded in the future."

Since taking office in 1990, the NDP has increased funding to the Ajax and Pickering General Hospital to \$27 million a year from \$17.7 mil-

lion, Mr. Wiseman said.

Progressive Conservative hopeful Janet Ecker said her government would "maintain current (health care) funding", eliminate waste and fraud, and not impose user fees.

Also, the funding formula used by the Ministry of Health to determine the amount of money a hospital receives should be changed to recognize growth, she added.

A Liberal government would provide multi-year funding for hospitals, based on what the facilities receive in

1994-95, says Grit candidate Joe Dickson.

"Something the hospital would have is stability. It hasn't had it for five years. It would allow the hospital to do long-range planning," said Mr. Dickson.

All three candidates agree the Acute Care Study recently completed by the Durham District Health Council should be implemented. The study calls for the hospital to be a full-service facility and receive more operating money.

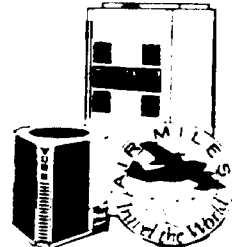

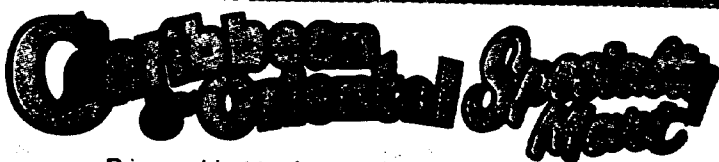

Open-concept schools 'not a bonus for anyone'

□ Public board set to approve renovations to help outdated schools

DURHAM — Parents and staff at two older schools which require renovations that "fell through the cracks" during past budget deliberations won't be left behind another year.

Plans to close in open-concept classrooms at Queen Elizabeth school in Oshawa and Woodlands Centennial in Pickering made it through the Durham Board of Education's final round of budget talks Monday.

That budget is expected to be given final approval at the next regular board meeting April 10.

Plans to close in open-concept classrooms "were solidly supported in the past," Brian Cain, superintendent in charge of finance, admitted at recent budget talks.

But those plans "simply got sidelined" year after year as trustees cut budgets in an effort to reduce taxes, Mr. Cain noted. In this year's budget, \$750,000 has been set aside to close in open-concept classrooms at Queen Elizabeth. And \$500,000 of last year's \$1.5-million operating budget surplus

has been earmarked to replace temporary walls with permanent ones at Woodlands Centennial.

Open-concept classrooms were popular in the mid-to-late 1960s. (That's when Queen Elizabeth got a new addition and Woodlands Centennial was built.) A library was located in the centre of an open-concept area and pods — virtually classrooms without walls — surrounded it. Educational gurus at that time were calling for child-centred learning rather than curriculum-centred learning and believed a student "could progress at his or her own rate" in an open-concept setting, explains Queen Elizabeth principal Lloyd White.

"It fell out of fashion in the '70s and I'm sure it all stemmed from parental pressure," he explains.

"Parents don't want their kids in pods. Children have shorter attention spans than adults, so many (parents) feel (their children) are disadvantaged right off the bat because it's harder to concentrate and pay attention."

Though partitions have been placed around each pod at Queen Elizabeth, they don't reach the ceiling and "noise still carries through," notes Connie Caton, school advisory committee chairman. Despite "excellent teachers who are tolerant and who work together," Mr. White believes renovations are long overdue.

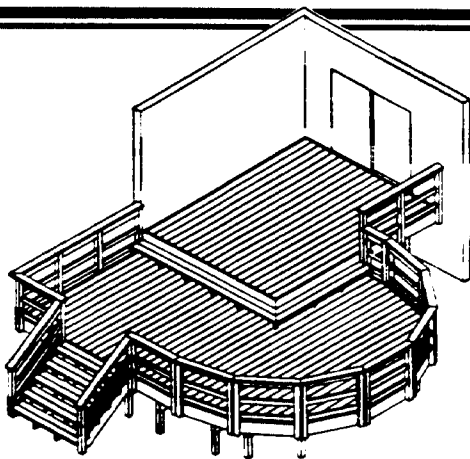
"The biggest challenge is the background noise, which isn't always in the background," says teacher David Lepp, now in a regular classroom after years in a pod.

Many students agree. "There's too much noise," in the opinion of one eight-year-old.

"Sometimes it's hard to hear the teacher because the other classes bug me," reports another.

Admittedly, life isn't that difficult at Woodlands Centennial, where temporary, folding walls separate pods and "work as well as they can," according to principal Trudy Deacon.

My comment to your reporter should have read "It's wiser to build a fence at the top of a cliff than pick up the pieces at the bottom!" Also another line should read "a salesman at the beer store who couldn't tell the difference

between 19 and 17."

Re picking up the pieces, I will remember losing four young teenage friends in horrifying accidents within a few months of the drinking age being lowered.

The following summer I came upon a carload of intoxicated and badly injured summer camp counselors in a roadside wreck, and drove them to Huntsville hospital. But these were only glimpses of a huge

canvass of legislation. Your editorial rebuttal "Age Matters Not" is admirably half right; we do urgently need more and better education programs to battle alcohol abuse. But at least as urgently, we need the law again — back where it was before the epidemic started.

At age 21, beverage alcohol becomes two years harder to get for teenagers tempted by teasingly televised booze ads. At 21, not only our

parents and schools but our police are given that much more legal muscle.

Finally, the strongest argument for the drinking age at 21 is that wherever it has been so restored, it works as strongly to save young life as lowering it did to kill and maim. We need your help! It should be an election issue.

On Oct. 7, 1982 Transportation and Communications Minister James Snow announced the design of the \$162-million Advanced Light Rail Transit system to serve Oshawa, Whitby and Ajax would begin immediately. Communicate!

The recent clamor at the separate school board over a sex education publication is for good reason.

The local board is upset that the ministry of health handed the publication, called Noise, over to individual schools for distribution instead of sending it to the administration first.

The magazine is full of fairly detailed information about birth control, masturbation, where to go for information on sex, planned parenthood, AIDS and other topics found to be offensive by the separate board; though it does include a passage on peer pressure, telling students that, "No matter what your friends say, a lot of people your age aren't ready to go all the way."

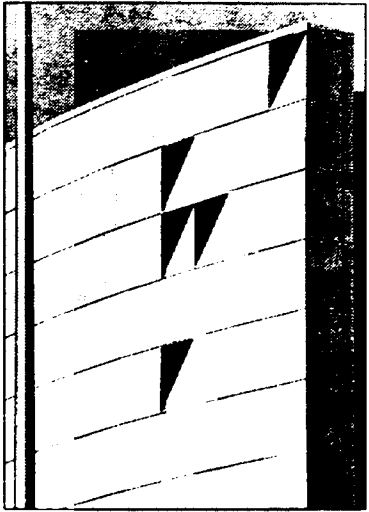
Board chairman Tom Oldman says this is the first time the ministry has bypassed the separate board administration. The Ministry of Health also distributed a pamphlet called Condom Sense to schools in 1992.

We believe sexual education is a good thing. These are dangerous times for young people, and trying to keep them blinkered to the ways of the world is not the solution. Whether parents like it or not, their kids are sometimes going to give in to completely natural urges. But young people aren't stupid — treat them with respect and give them complete information, and they will, more often than not, make wise choices. In this case, however, the ministry stepped on some toes in the process of trying to do the right thing. It is clear that, since this material was so obviously against the beliefs and teachings of the separate school board, it really should have been consulted. To do otherwise is discourteous.

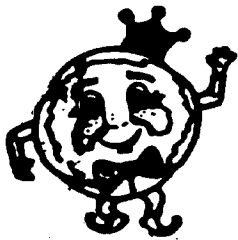

The scholarships handed out to students are nothing to sneeze at either, amounting to over \$8,000 altogether.

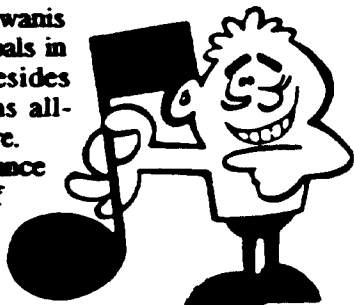
The festival's opening ceremony is on April 18, beginning at 1 p.m., at Eastdale Collegiate in Oshawa.

The 20-year-old organization that sponsors the African Children's Choir, Friends in the West, aids prisoners of conscience and impoverished Third World children.

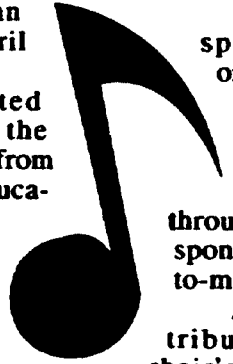
It has organized this tour specifically to help those orphans in Rwanda.

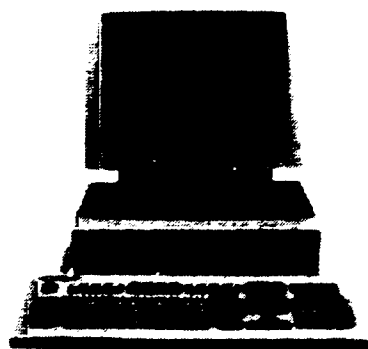

Missing Oshawa woman found

OSHAWA — An Oshawa woman who has been missing for over a week says she left for Nashville after being sexually assaulted.

Missing since March 31, 30-year-old Darleen Steeves finally telephoned her current boyfriend to let him know where she was, and to say she was OK. She made the call around 11 p.m. from a hotel in Nashville, Tennessee.

Her boyfriend then notified Durham Regional Police, who contacted officers at the

Metro Nashville Police Department. Officers there went to the hotel to verify her identity.

According to police, Ms. Steeves said she had suffered a sexual assault and that was the reason she left.

Ms. Steeves was last seen picking up her cheque from work. When police officers arrived at her apartment they found her door had been forced open. She said the broken door was connected to the sexual assault.

Ms. Steeves was scheduled to arrive at Pearson International Airport Friday afternoon where Durham Police will speak to her regarding the alleged sexual assault.



March sales decline for GM

OSHAWA -- General Motors of Canada dealers delivered a total of 34,161 new vehicles, down almost 5,000 from the same month last year.

The 12.7 per cent decline from March 1994 includes a 15.9 per cent decline in passenger cars and a 7.6 per cent decline in truck sales.

"Typically the early months of the year are softer sales periods in Canada, and we anticipate an upswing in customer showroom traffic as we move into the spring selling season," said Tom Mason, GM vice president of marketing.

Mr. Mason also noted there

was strong customer demand in key segments of the market.

"We're extremely pleased with Saab's performance - with total sales in March up over 39 per cent compared to the same period last year, March was a record breaking month," Mr. Mason said. "For the 1995 calendar year to date, Saab 900 sales are up 53 per cent."

Overall GM sales have decreased by 8.6 per cent over the first three months of 1995 compared to the same period of 1994. For the model year

which began on October 1, sales have decreased only 0.4 per cent compared to model year 1994. Car sales are off by 6.6 per cent while trucks have increased 9.2 per cent.

Some models also show strong sales. Chevrolet Lumina - Monte Carlo sales have increased 477 per cent while Corsica - Beretta sales have jumped 157 per cent since March 1994. Blazer - Jimmy Sport jumped 83.5 per cent, Saab 39.5 per cent and Suburban 14.5 per cent. Several other models also achieved more modest sales gains.

DURHAM — Durham cops really know how to throw their weight behind a project.

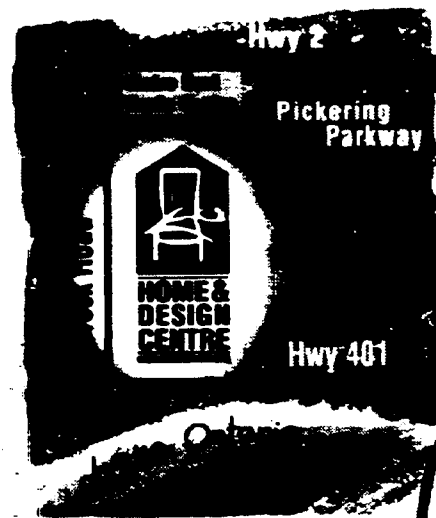
The defending champions in the Weight Watchers Battle of the Badges came in just shy of taking this year's title.

PICKERING — Young hero Danny McCarthy is at it again.

For six years, Danny has participated in the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) five-mile Walk For a Cure for leukemia. He was the number-one fund raiser in Canada in 1994. This year Danny has already started to raise money for the walk.

The energetic 11 year old has been winning the hearts of Pickering residents with his unrelenting drive to raise money to fight the disease he's been battling since he was three. Now in his second remission, Danny is determined to double the \$11,907 he raised last year. That would represent almost as much as Danny's total in the last five years, which is just over \$20,000.

Why is the youngster so successful in raising money for this killer disease?

"Danny is a fighter and he never gives up," says Mrs. McCarthy. "Even when he is sick he makes himself go outside and collect pledges."

Danny's dedication to funding research into the disease was proven in November, 1993, when a relapse almost prevented the youngster from

walking. Not only did he participate in the fund raiser, he delayed going into the hospital for three days.

Fortunately, Danny is in remission again, which means he's back in hockey and loving every minute of it. When he's not rollerblading or playing hockey, Danny likes to watch his favorite player, Mario Lemieux of the Pittsburgh Penguins, who was stricken with Hodgkin's Disease a few years ago.

"Danny has incredible willpower and strength," says Mrs. McCarthy. "He keeps himself busy even when he is in the hospital by helping the doc-

tors and nurses."

Danny will participate in the June 11 Walk For a Cure in Scarborough.

He's being sponsored by UFCW Locals 1755 and 6339 and along the way has got support from people like Ken Baumgartner of the Toronto Maple Leafs and the St. Louis Blues' Glenn Anderson.

"This year we are hoping to get some support from local businesses," says Mrs. McCarthy.

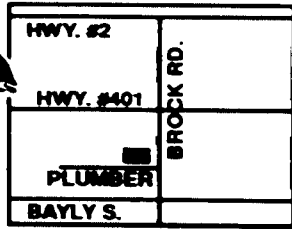

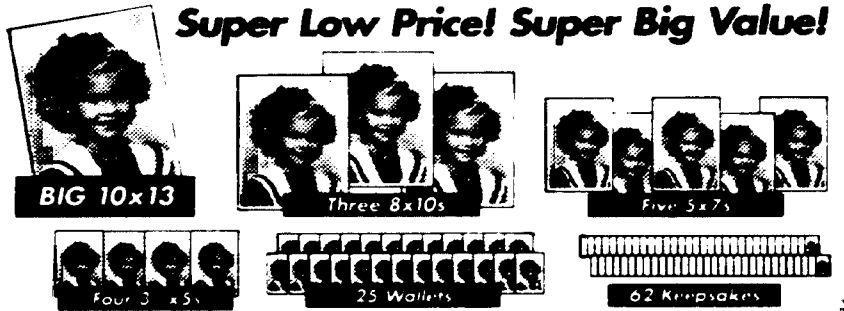

Pine Ridge rakes in medals at skills challenge competition

DURHAM — For the third consecutive year, Pine Ridge Secondary School in Pickering collected the highest number of gold medals at the Durham Skills Challenge.

Twenty-eight of its students earned first-place finishes at the seventh annual competition. That allows the school to retain the Durham Skills Challenge trophy, which it has held onto since it opened its doors three years ago.

The competition tests the technology skills of secondary school students and provides an opportunity for them to demonstrate their trade, problem-solving, decision-making and individual skills.

"Technology touches every part of our lives," notes David Gould, technology project facilitator at the Durham Board of Education.

"It's not a computer screen alone or a hammer and chisel alone. The focus of technology is changing. For instance, knowing about your car is now a life skill," he believes.

"Before, students didn't take (auto mechanics courses) unless they were planning on becoming a mechanic," but today it's a "smart choice" for consumers who must take their cars to repair shops, Mr. Gould notes.

This year's meet was held at high schools throughout the region from March 27 to 31. Medals were handed out at an awards ceremony at Pine Ridge on April 5.

First-place winners may have the opportunity to compete at the Ontario Skills Competition in Hamilton on May 2. Gold-medal winners there proceed to the Vocational Industrial Clubs of America competition in Kansas City, Missouri, at the end of June.

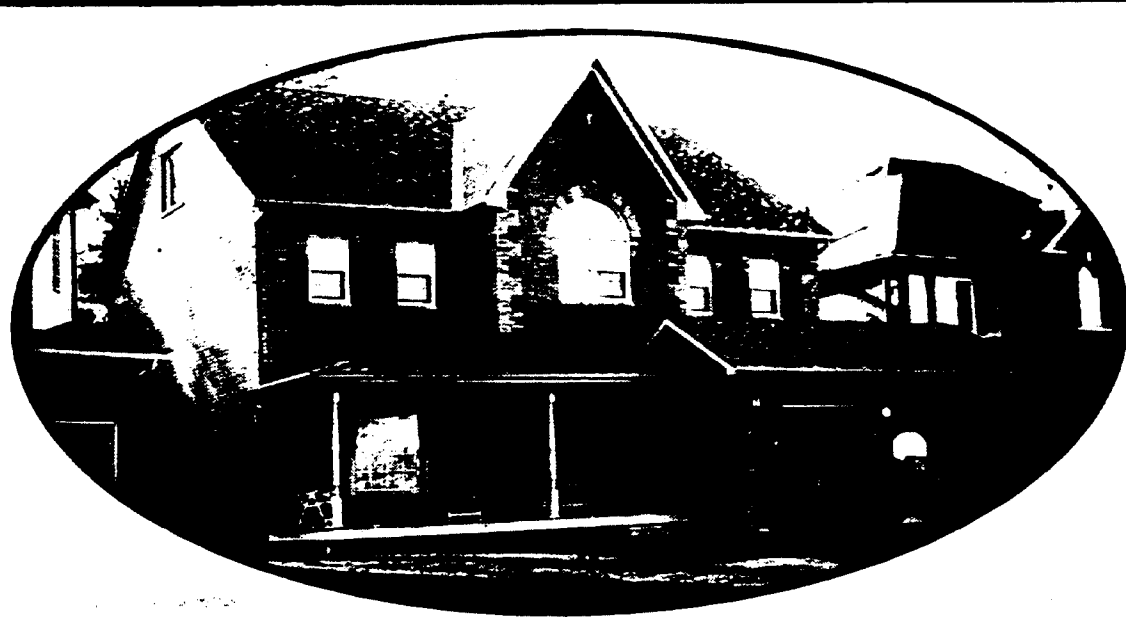

Applecroft principal retires after 35 years as an educator

□ Alan Jones has memories of teaching in one-room schoolhouse

AJAX — After 35 years of teaching in Durham Region, Alan Jones has retired from his beloved profession.

Mr. Jones, 54, retired as principal at Applecroft Public School in Ajax March 31.

During his last few days, Mr. Jones was treated to an assembly by Applecroft's staff and students, then later to a party at the Annandale Golf and Curling Club in Ajax.

"I will miss it. Especially the interaction with the children and the teachers," he said. "Although, I know I will not miss the responsibility."

Mr. Jones does have a lot of plans, but he's certain of one thing: "I'm going to enjoy retirement". He and his wife of 27 years plan to travel to Florida for a vacation. Upon his return, he'll have a "jar full of jobs to do at home".

He's also planning a trip back to his native Australia in the future. "I have not been back since I left when I was eight."

Mr. Jones began teaching at the School Section No. 5 in Whitby in 1960. He admits he was a little weary of the job because teachers did not last long at the little one-room school where he taught eight grades under one roof. In addition to being a teacher, he's also served as a vice-principal and finally as a principal during his career.

He's witnessed numerous changes in the school system. However, the one constant has been the children. "The children have stayed the same. It is the environment around them that has changed," he adds.

Mr. Jones notes schools were smaller and closer knit than those of today. "Today, the schools are larger and, because of that, it takes longer to develop a sense of community."

Being a principal is a little different than teaching, says Mr. Jones, who became a principal five years into his teaching career. He's feels he provided effective leadership during his years as a principal.

"When you are a principal you have to be a leader," he explains. "You have to keep an orderly school or nothing will get accomplished."

Mr. Jones has some useful advice which he offers to budding teachers.

"Make sure you have everything planned, remember that your first teaching job is a learning experience. Treat children firmly and fairly," he adds with a hint of wisdom.

Caribbean beckons student environmentalist

PICKERING - Why would a Pickering university student spend a month of his summer holidays working on a tiny island in the Caribbean?

"I've always had an interest in wildlife and the environment in general," says Ken Sylvan, a 19-year-old first year neuro-sciences student at the University of Toronto's Scarborough Campus.

"We need to have animals in our ecosystem because when you destroy animals it destroys the (food) chain and that affects us in the long run. I'm not an extremist, but we have to do things that will benefit our children in the future," says Mr. Sylvan, who'll embark on a month-long trip to Montserrat, near Antigua, May 3.

Mr. Sylvan will join about 30 other students, mostly from Eco-House, a residence for students interested in environmental issues at the University of Guelph, on the ecological and humanitarian trip to the island, ravaged by Hurricane Hugo a few years ago.

The Fox's Bay Bird Sanctuary on the island was devastated by the hurricane and will take

years to repair, Mr. Sylvan explains.

"The iguana and bird population there have been dying out, so we're going down there to keep track of them. There used to be a lot of birds and wildlife there, but a lot of it has been built over by construction and damaged by Hurricane Hugo."

To make matters worse, cattle have been allowed to roam free, further damaging the environment, Mr. Sylvan says.

"We're going down to help repair the damage and clean up the ponds as well. A lot of farmers' cattle are roaming around. We're going to help

build fences in the area they're in."

He's asking for the community's support to help make the trip a reality. Individuals and organizations can get involved by making a financial donation, donating items to be auctioned off to raise money for the trip, or just providing moral support.

"I'd like to hear from anyone who cares about the environment. It can just be letting me know that people are aware of the problem."

Pickering strikes up the banned

Town council will continue to oppose jet skis on Frenchman's Bay

Region Conservation Authority (MTRCA), which owns property around the bay, to continue to ban the launching of personal watercraft into the bay from its property.

The MTRCA has received letters and calls from personal watercraft users and manufacturers who want the ban lifted.

The issue will be discussed by the MTRCA's conservation and land management advisory board on April 21 at the Black Creek Pioneer Village visitors centre (Shoreham Drive, east of Jane Street in Downsview), at 10 a.m.

The MTRCA's decision to reopen the debate has left Pickering councillors and bay-area residents scratching their heads, according to councillor Senis.

"Users of these particular watercraft do not heed the rules of operating away from

the marshes, thus endangering wildlife," she said.

"(Personal watercraft) operators create noise pollution for all residents living on or near the bay by running them with open ports, removing the mufflers, and creating safety hazards for other watercraft that don't enjoy the easy maneuverability that these watercraft employ," she said.

Councillor Senis noted in her motion that the MTRCA supported the Town's request of the federal government for a lower speed limit on the bay by banning the launching of personal watercraft from its property last year.

The speed limit was lowered to five knots, or nine kilometres per hour, last fall for all motorized watercraft to provide safe boating and lower the noise level on Frenchman's Bay.

Hockey association facing ice-time shortage

PICKERING — The same amount of ice time and a sudden influx of new players for the 1995-96 season is making life increasingly difficult for the Pickering Hockey Association, says its long-time president.

Len Quigley says players who live in Pickering, but who played house-league hockey in Scarborough in past seasons, turned up at a recent PHA open registration session. He contends the association won't be able to absorb more players into its crowded ranks.

He estimates 200 Pickering youths played house league hockey in North York and Scarborough last season. With the

City of Scarborough getting tough on non-residents using its arena facilities, that could spell trouble for the PHA.

"The word out of Scarborough is it's clamping down (on out-of-town kids signing up for hockey) and that has created an influx of kids coming back to Pickering," says Quigley.

During the PHA's pre-registration session for next season for those who played last year, the event yielded 1,105 registrants. At the first open registration of the season last Thursday, about 100 signed up to swell the ranks to more than 1,200 players, even before the association holds summer and fall sign-up sessions. Quigley believes many of the 100 who

signed up last Thursday were youths who played in Scarborough last season.

In total, 1,370 players were registered in the PHA last year. This season, that number could swell to beyond the 1,400 mark, which would mean a waiting list would have to be created — a first for the PHA.

"This is the first year we've had this type of predicament to overcome," says Quigley, who aimed the problem squarely at the feet of Town council. "I talked to Town council before they built the new ice pad at the complex to convince them to add another pad (at Don Beer Arena) at the same time. I told them one pad at the complex wouldn't be

enough."

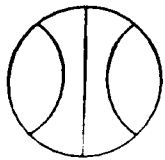
However, Quigley says the association plans to once again make its case for another ice pad with Town council. The PHA hired an architect six months ago to draw a site plan to determine if Don Beer Arena could house a third ice pad.

Preliminary reports seem to indicate the current arena site could handle another ice pad, but "it's going to be tight", says Quigley, adding that some property may have to be secured from Ontario Hydro which owns land to the west (rear) of Don Beer Arena if a new ice pad were to proceed.

Quigley also wants to pursue corporate funding for the ice pad, if the site plan is approved by Town council.
