


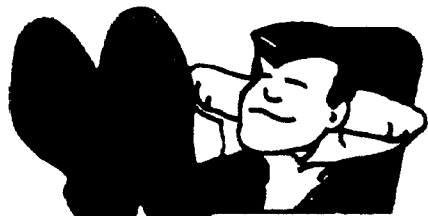

Sentence for drunk driver in death crash too light, says Pickering dad

PICKERING — The father of a young Pickering man killed in November by a drunk driver is unhappy with the jail sentence meted out to the motorist Tuesday.
"I was looking for a strong message to the public as a deterrent to drinking and driving," says John McCluskey, who went to Guelph with his family to see Thomas Thomson, 43, sentenced to three years in prison for criminal negligence causing death.
"I thought that in order to send out a message to the public, a more severe sentence would have been appropriate."
David McCluskey, 23, was killed Nov. 3, 1995 when the car he was driving was hit by Mr. Thomson's van on a road near Guelph. David was the designated driver for a group of young people returning to Pickering after visiting friends. Passengers Neil Rathe, Bill May and Everett Leach, all of Pickering, were injured. Mr. Rathe seriously.

Medical experts probe how Julie died

PICKERING — A "think-tank" of medical experts has begun an extensive examination of Julie Stanton's remains in the hope of finding clues which may reveal how the Pickering teen died.
A team of about 10 biologists, anthropologists, pathologists and chemists began an initial examination in Toronto Wednesday of the skeletal remains discovered in a wooded area of a farm near Pontypool last Thursday, Ontario Deputy Chief Coroner Jim Cairns said Thursday.
Following the autopsy, the Centre for Forensic Sciences will begin the "slow process" of conducting a series of toxicology, biology and DNA tests on any suitable tissue.
The initial exam, forensic exam and subsequent analysis is expected to take between two and three weeks, at which

Worried mom pleads for help finding teen

Police don't think girl victim of foul play

DURHAM — A distraught Oshawa mom fears her 14-year-old daughter who left home Friday and hasn't been heard from since may have encountered danger.

Tanya Evans celebrated her Grade 8 graduation from Central Park senior public school last Thursday night.

Friday afternoon, Tanya, her mother Janice and seven-year-old sister Jenny were preparing to leave for a long weekend excursion.

"We were getting ready to go and she was helping me clean the car and pack up, when at the last minute the car broke down," says Ms. Evans.

When she went back into the house, Tanya had left with her bag

which contained her belongings for the weekend.

Ms. Evans says Tanya's disappearance — for any length of time — is out of character. "She would never go anywhere without me knowing. She was always responsible and would be home by 4:30 after school every day to babysit her sister.

"She's never done anything like this before, ever."

Ms. Evans says she "may have been a little bit short" with Tanya when their weekend plans were put on hold, "but she should have been home a long time ago."

She fears Tanya may have run into danger. "I've exhausted every lead possible," adds Ms. Evans, who has notified the missing person agency Child Find, with which Tanya was registered.

"It's been (six) days now. If she was upset, she should have come

home by now. She looks quite a bit older than her age; some people say she looks 18 or 19. I'm just worried someone may have picked her up."

Mr. Evans made an emotional appeal to friends who have seen her to call police, and for Tanya to call home.

"Jennie and I both love you very much and need you. Please, call home."

Friends contacted by police and family have reported no contact with Tanya since she left, and she didn't play softball league games Tuesday at Woodview park, where she has participated in twice weekly matches in

recent weeks.

Police are actively investigating Tanya's disappearance and visited her friends in Ajax and Toronto during the week.

"We don't believe she is in any imminent danger or that she ran into foul play," says Durham Regional Police Staff Sergeant Sandy Ryrice.

He says police anticipate tracking down Tanya soon.

Tanya, is 5'8", has tanned complexion, dark shoulder-length hair and dark brown eyes. She was last seen wearing black Nike shoes, cream-colored jeans and a black T-shirt with the "Starter" logo.

Sentence doesn't send strong message on drunk driving

Mr. Thomson, who had almost three times the legal limit of alcohol in his blood at the time of the accident, will also have his driver's licence suspended for five years after his release from prison.

Mr. McCluskey says he understands the reasons for the three-year term, agreed to by the Crown attorney and defence lawyer in exchange for Mr. Thomson's guilty plea. This was Mr. Thomson's first drinking and driving conviction, he has voluntarily entered rehabilitation and he had several character witnesses citing his dedicated community work, Mr. McCluskey says.

"Based on the constraints that the legal system operates under, it is an acceptable sentence. My personal feeling is it doesn't send out a strong enough message. My feelings are much more subjective."

The maximum sentence allowed under the Canadian Criminal Code is 14 years.

Mr. McCluskey says the sentencing of Mr. Thomson is another phase in the difficult task of dealing with David's death.

"We did not have to show up. The sentence would have been carried out without...our

family. It was important for our family to be there.

"It's simply one more phase of the process. When you lose your son, it's never over. One of the comments the judge made was that our family died with David. We're just now trying to rebuild our lives."

David was a student in his second year of a new environmental studies program at Centennial College in Scarborough at the time of his death.

"One of the things he felt very proud of was that there were 700 people who had applied for that program and he was one of 60 or 70 who were accepted," Mr. McCluskey says.

"He saw it as a great opportunity. He never had a chance to fulfill that."

David was an avid baseball player and had planned to raise money for the Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) Society with a slo-pitch tournament. His friend Aubrey Gonsalvez is carrying out that dream, planning the David McCluskey Memorial Tournament for this fall, Mr. McCluskey reports.

A scholarship in David's name has been established by the Knights of Columbus at St. Mary Secondary Catholic School, which he attended.

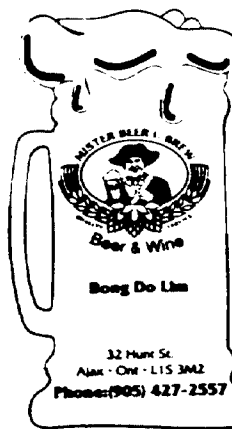

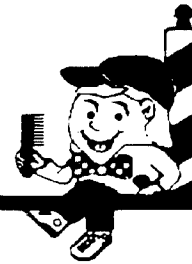

Pickering eatery boss threatens waiter's life for serving free pie

AJAX-PICKERING — A free dessert nearly cost a waiter more than his job after his angry boss put a knife to his throat and threatened to kill him, Durham Regional Police say.

The owner of a restaurant in Pickering "took exception" after he saw a 21-year-old waiter, from Ajax, serve a free piece of pie to a patron Sunday afternoon, police say.

As the waiter went into the kitchen to pick up his jacket after he was fired, the owner punched him in the side of the head and held a knife to his throat, threatening his life, says Staff Sergeant Sherry Whiteway of 25 Division.

The waiter fled the establishment and reported the incident to police.

Ramachandran Venu-gopal, 43, of Scarborough

was charged with assault, assault with a weapon, making a death threat and possession of weapons dangerous to the public peace.

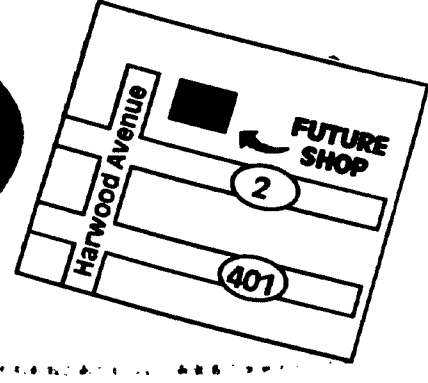

time Julie's remains will be released to her family for burial, Dr. Cairns said.

Whether the remains will reveal any clues about her murder hinges on numerous factors, he said.

"This obviously isn't a typical autopsy. Depending on whether there are useful tissues which can be sampled, it may or may not be possible to determine the cause of death," he said.

"The longer period of time, the more difficult it becomes to answer these questions. But there will be a very thorough process and we will go to great pains to try and find the answers to these questions, given the importance to the justice system and to the Stanton family."

Julie, a popular 14-year-old honors student at Dunbarton High School, vanished from her parents' Maury Crescent home Easter Monday, April 16, 1990.

Peter Stark, the father of Julie's best friend, was convicted of her murder two years ago.

Police blitz nabs 70 careless drivers

DURHAM — Seventy drivers were dinged for fines during a two-week crack-down on aggressive motorists but Durham Regional Police are hopeful thousands more got the message to be more careful.

A special enforcement team designated to target locations around the region with the highest accident rates charged 53 drivers with running red lights and stop signs, and 17 for speeding and other moving violations during the blitz.

"It is our belief the tickets issued represent a potential collision prevented," says traffic management unit Staff Sergeant Rick Bates.

against 100 drivers for speeding and other moving violations during the campaign.

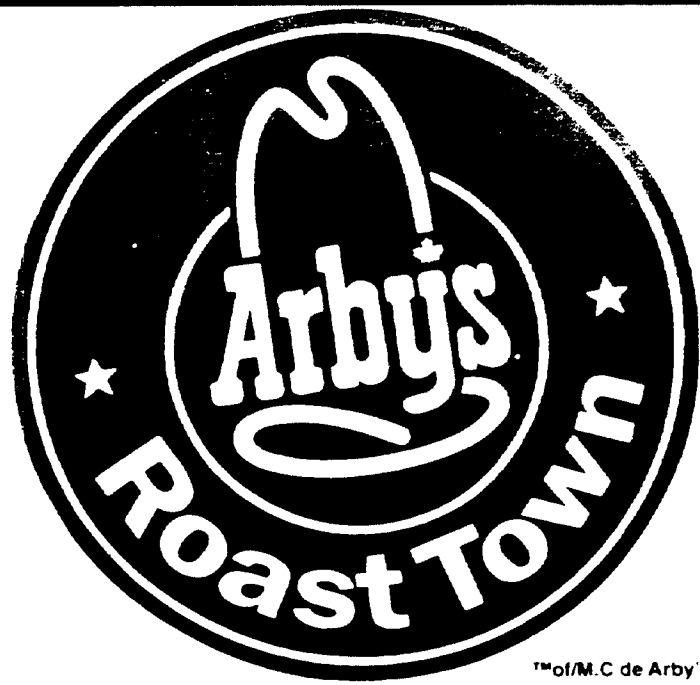
The campaign was aimed at making people "more aware of their driving habits and preventing injuries and deaths which occur on

our roads."

Last year in Durham, 24 people were killed and more than 2,000 injured in car crashes. Eight people have lost their lives so far this year, compared to 12 through the first six months of 1995.

"It looks like the numbers may be a little lower this year. Maybe the message is getting out there," says Staff Sgt. Bates.

During the 1996 campaign — part of a province-wide program — there were slightly fewer accidents in the region compared to the same two-week period last year, "possibly due to the increased enforcement and public awareness," says Staff Sgt. Bates.

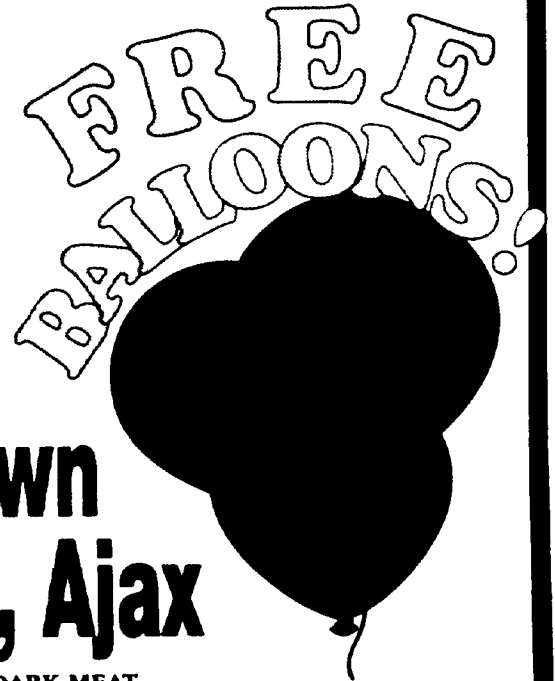

Shore thing!

Picture this: Your municipal council sits behind closed doors, quietly debating with a local developer who wants to build housing, or a plaza, or a condominium complex.

Voices may be raised when the negotiations hit a rough spot but, ultimately, a deal is reached and the process begins.

That scenario came and went in the communities of Ajax and Pickering in recent weeks and this is the consequence: a better waterfront for the citizens of Ajax and Pickering.

In Ajax, the deal involved land owned by a local developer. The end result is 10 acres have been preserved for lakefront use by Ajax residents. No condos or plazas, just wide-open green space. The developer is happy (the deal involved a land swap), the Town is happy and citizens are the beneficiaries.

In Pickering, Town officials have conditionally inked a deal with the owner of a parcel of land on the east side of Frenchman's Bay. In that case, Town officials have promised to seek public input into potential uses for the land. Preserving it as open space for use by area residents is likely going to be high on many lists.

In any case, each municipal council deserves credit for providing the option to its citizenry. In Ajax, Town officials have kept a promise to help preserve a wonderfully unique and attractive portion of the lakefront. In Pickering, officials have managed to preserve a small portion of bay land Councillor Sherry Senis has referred to as "Pickering's jewel".

These moves by the two Towns should weaken criticism levelled at both municipal councils in the past suggesting they are primarily interested in sprawling development.

In each case, Town officials worked hard -- often in the background -- to preserve an important feature of their communities for use by the people who live in the communities.

Ajax and Pickering have seized the opportunity to create more attractive lakefronts. For their efforts, we should give credit where it's due.

Now that baseball season is upon us, we can see families and friends cheering on their young ones as they learn about teamwork, fair play and the game of baseball.

This also means that the influx of cars to this area will cause parking problems to the surrounding neighborhood; the Church of Christ and the Queen's Court apartments have already erected signage in an attempt to prevent illegal parking on their property.

The Town of Ajax also has "No Parking" restrictions on Cedar Street, both sides from Tudor Avenue to Beatty Road, and on the west side of Tudor Avenue abutting the park.

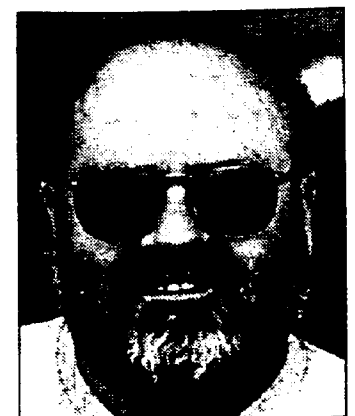

Durham wants to stop you from flushing money down the drain

DURHAM -- You're flushing good money down the drain each time you use the toilet.

To help homeowners save hundreds of dollars a year, Durham Region is slated to start a toilet and showerhead-replacement program in September.

The Region will offer the replacements through its water-conservation program. The goal of the \$5-million project is to replace 10,000 toilets over two-and-a-half years.

Water efficiency co-ordinator Glen Pleasance says an average house could reduce annual water usage by about 20,000 gallons, which translates into savings of about \$225 a year.

The Region will replace toilets now using 13 or 20 litres of water

with each flush with a unit using six litres. And, low-flow showerheads will be installed.

Mr. Pleasance says the cost of a low-flow showerhead is between \$6 and \$40, while the most inexpensive six-litre toilet he's seen retails for \$130.

"The payback is less than a year," Mr. Pleasance points out.

While the final cost to homeowners hasn't been set, Mr. Pleasance says a participant could save about 40 per cent on the cost of the toilet and the installation. "At 40 per cent off the wholesale price, it will certainly be attractive to a homeowner."

Anybody on the regional water system who lives in a house will be eligible for the project, he adds.

In a pilot project in Port Perry, Uxbridge and Beaverton in 1994-95, 191 homes participated, with 295

six-litre toilets and 130 low-flow showerheads installed. Water usage was reduced by an average of one-quarter per household, while some cut use by more than 50 per cent.

Mr. Pleasance notes, "86 per cent of participants polled found that the six-litre toilet was as good or better than what was replaced."

Beginning in January of this year, the provincial plumbing code was changed to make the six-litre toilet standard for new homes. Switching from a 13 or 20-litre toilet to a six-litre unit means "a significant reduction in water use. Forty per cent of water used in a house goes down the toilet," Mr. Pleasance says.

Showers and toilets combine for 75 per cent of indoor water use in a home.

"A six-litre toilet and a low-flow showerhead are the two most productive methods you can take to lower use," he notes.

Another benefit is lower energy costs because less water needs to be heated for a shower. The replacement program will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

More information on the program, including how and when to

sign up, will be released in August.

The Province forced the Region to start a water-conservation program as one of 21 conditions imposed in September, 1992 when Queen's Park approved the location of a new water supply plant on the Ajax lakefront.

The Region has a goal of cutting water usage by seven per cent over the next three years.

Ajax, Pickering beaches safe for swimming

Region tests find lake water OK

DURHAM — Area residents looking to spend a day at the beach this weekend won't have their plans cancelled. The Durham Region Health Department

has finished its initial testing of area lakes and swimmers have been given the green light to take a dip.

Provincial standards state any reading that of excess E. coli in the water constitutes unsafe conditions and the beach is then closed.

Tony Wong of the health department says levels were low and on pace with past years and should stay that way until there is a change in the weather.

"It's about the same as in previous years at the same time," says the manager for environmental health. "When summer comes on and the heat comes on, they will go up. The water is still pretty cold right now, so as the temperature goes up and the bather loads increase, they will go up a little more, but right now the beaches are fine."

Frenchman's Bay East and West in Pickering, Rotary Park in Ajax, Whitby Beach East,

Lakeview Park in Oshawa, Elgin Pond in Uxbridge, Port Perry's Kinsmen Beach, Goreski's on Scugog Island and Clarington's Newcastle Beach were all tested near the end of June, but results were only made available early this week.

Testing will now continue on a weekly basis, and any beach that exceeds the standard will be contacted and signs will be posted about a day later.

Pickering bank heist accused acquitted

PICKERING — A jury has acquitted a man accused of armed robbery in a 1993 heist at a Pickering bank.

After 10 hours of jury deliberations, Stephen Pellerin, 26, of Toronto was found not guilty last Thursday of robbing the TD Bank at Amberlea Plaza at 1822 Whites Rd. June 10, 1993.

In that robbery, a masked bandit armed with a machine gun made off with cash and fled in a stolen vehicle, which was found two miles from the bank.

A trial last year ended in a hung jury.

The jury in the most recent trial wasn't allowed to hear evidence that Mr. Pellerin was

AWOL from a federal halfway house at the time of the robbery, says Crown attorney Bryan Davies. Mr. Pellerin is currently serving a six-year sentence for an armed robbery in the Toronto area, Mr. Davies reports.

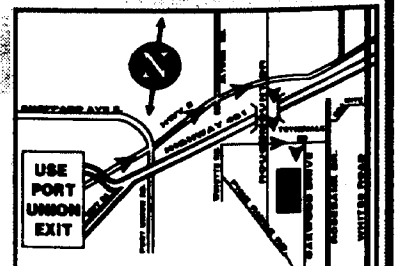

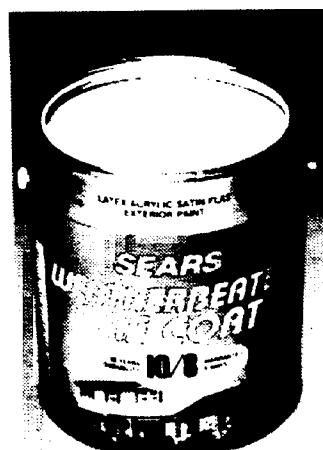

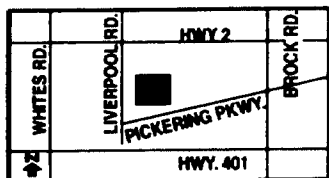

Private firm hired to run Oshawa airport

OSHAWA -- Management of the Oshawa Airport has been put in the hands of a private company. City council voted 9-4 Tuesday night to pay Serco Aviation Services \$1.6 million to manage the airport for a five-year period beginning Sept. 1, 1996. City officials say they'll save \$420,000 by turning airport management over to the private sector.

"It's not just a financial benefit, we'll also lower demand on City services," says Mayor Nancy Diamond. "This firm could give us additional business opportunities."

But Ward 6 Regional Councillor Bob Boychyn wondered why staff members familiar with the deal weren't on hand to answer questions at Tuesday's council meeting.

"This is a major contract being let by the City of Oshawa," says Coun. Boychyn. "Surely staff people should be here. Three hundred thousand dollars (annually) for services and no one here to answer questions -- I find that highly unusual."

"We're expected to approve a contract tonight and then ask questions in the future to see if we made the right decision -- it's quite silly."

But Mayor Diamond told Coun. Boychyn, "We can answer reasonable questions." Council also learned the City's airport co-ordinator, Noel Hutchinson, was ill and couldn't attend the meeting.

Serco employs 15,000 people and manages 40 airports in 30 countries, including London's Heathrow Airport, but also brings a strong local knowledge of the Oshawa Airport, City officials say. Serco currently manages one airport in Canada, in one of the western provinces, council was told.

The company plans to bring in former Oshawa Airport manager Sam Kincaid to oversee the transition process and the proposed new airport manager is Jeffrey Hunter, currently the manager of Niagara District Airport, a City report says.

An official with Enterprise Air is optimistic the move to private management will benefit the airport.

"I'm hoping it will be a plus," says Doug Robertson, Enterprise Air's chief flight co-ordinator. "On the surface it seems great, it's definitely a step in the right direction."

Under the terms of the contract, Serco will perform all administrative tasks at the airport, administer commercial leases, oversee financial affairs, supervise airport operations, maintenance and assist the City with marketing, promotion and public relations.

Massive redevelopment of Oshawa General Hospital is under way

The shovels are in the ground to begin the massive redevelopment at Oshawa General Hospital.

City council approved a \$1-million reconstruction of Alexandra Street at Tuesday's council meeting, which is the first step in the \$160 million redevelopment of OGH, hospital officials say.

"It's a fundamental step in the hospital's redevelopment plans," said Bruce Mackey, outgoing chairman of OGH's Board of Governors.

"This important next step will allow the hospital to commence the parking garage, perhaps as early as August. Our patients deserve and need the best health care, which includes adequate parking."

As part of the redevelopment, a

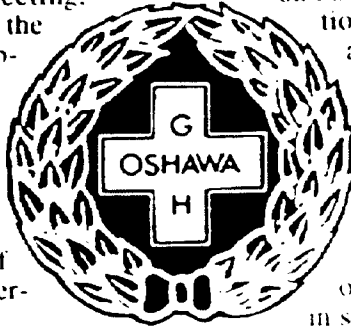
new emergency-critical care wing is scheduled to open in October, 1999 and the Durham Community Cancer Centre is slated to open in 2000, says Mr. Mackey.

Hospital-area resident Joy Wawrzyniak urged council to hold off on Alexandra Street reconstruction until all provincial approvals and commitments are in place and the Province's Health Services Restructuring Commission visits Durham Region.

But Mr. Mackey told councillors "the Ministry of Health approves projects in stages."

OGH president David Home added, "There's no difficulty in this construction from the Ministry of Health's point of view."

OGH board member Marianne Sholdra, who spoke on behalf of Citizens for a Cancer Centre, told council,



Whitby blamed for holding up Hwy. 407 progress

DURHAM -- Whitby is to blame for the lack of progress on Highway 407 in Durham Region, says Oshawa Mayor Nancy Diamond and City council.

"They've stalled it," says Mayor Diamond, adding "Whitby is being a dog in a manger. They could hurt every municipality in Durham, cause us to lose significant jobs. I think the Region as well has to stand up and say 'Whitby, we have done everything to answer your concerns'."

City council voted unanimously at its meeting Tuesday to urge the Province to authorize construction of Hwy. 407 to Courtice Road. Oshawa's motion took a jab at its neighbor, suggesting "certain actions taken by the Town of Whitby and its council have resulted in the

highway project being delayed beyond all reasonable time frames."

Whitby Mayor Tom Edwards calls the attack "nonsense."

"I urge Oshawa to get off its high horse, look after its own affairs and leave Whitby alone," he says, adding Whitby is in favor of Hwy. 407's construction to Courtice, but wants to ensure the town is not divided by a proposed roadway linking Hwy. 401 with Hwy. 407.

Mayor Edwards says the provincial government-preferred DMZ link (east of Regional Road 23) would isolate residents in the Almond Drive subdivision and create "disaster for the western portion of the town."

Instead, Whitby wants Regional Road 23 (Lakeridge Road on the Ajax-Whitby border) to be used as

the link, to avoid disruption to residents and future development.

Oshawa is pointing fingers at Whitby because "council is so desperate for issues to take off their own problems," says Mayor Edwards.

But some Oshawa councillors say Whitby has gone too far in its battle with the Province.

"To use Regional Road 23 is nuts, it doesn't make sense to me," says Ward 5 Regional Councillor John Gray.

"The notion Whitby is peddling is going to put this project in jeopardy. Let's get on with it - that's what this boils down to."

Ward 1 Regional Councillor Brian Nicholson accuses Whitby of holding Oshawa hostage in the process.

"I believe Whitby is

"The whole expansion project has taken too long. It's time for the silent majority to stand up and be counted."

The hospital applied to the City to amend the official plan for the expansion in July, 1992.

The O'Neill Community Ratepayers Association took the issue to the Ontario Municipal Board. A decision granting approval for the project was handed down in January of this year.

"I absolutely share the frustration of residents of Oshawa and Durham Region over lack of construction at OGH," says Ward 8 Regional Councillor John Aker.

Construction will start immediately on Alexandra Street, but the hospital will "maintain all services," says Mr. Home.

Visitors and patients can park in the Alma Street parking garage during the construction period and OGH employees will park at the Mary Street parking garage and a shuttle bus will take them to the hospital.

entering a delay and stall mode," he says.

"When two (provincial) governments say 'you're wrong', you don't go into the stall mode. We're not going to be held ransom in a fight between the Town of Whitby and the Province."

Mayor Diamond says the 407 is critical to Durham Region's transportation system because "the east end of the Greater Toronto Area is so poorly served."

Oshawa could potentially lose "millions in investment" if the new highway ends at Brock Road in Pickering and doesn't continue through to Courtice Road, says Mayor Diamond.

Copies of Oshawa's position on the issue will be sent to the Premier, Transportation Minister Al Palladini, all Durham MPPs, Durham Region and all its member municipalities.

Oshawa woman jailed for swindling her mother

OSHAWA -- A "cold-hearted" Oshawa woman who cheated her elderly, now-destitute mother out of her home and life savings wept in court as a judge sentenced her to a 15-month jail term Wednesday.

Lori Junkin, 40, forged her adoptive mother's signature on numerous documents between 1987 and 1992 in what was described as "a callous, deliberate, well thought out" scheme.

Court heard Mrs. Junkin took out three mortgages, amounting to \$115,000, on the 85-year-old woman's Manvers home without her knowledge, and withdrew more than \$60,000 from her mother's personal bank account.

She was arrested in 1992 and convicted in October, 1995 of three counts of fraud, forgery and theft.

"The message has to be sent out to the community that this form of elder abuse is not to be tolerated," said Mr. Justice Barry MacDougall as he sentenced Mrs. Junkin in a Whitby general division court.

Mr. Justice MacDougall said the crime in itself, Mrs. Junkin's "lack of remorse" and her denial of guilt — during her trial she accused her mother of concocting the scheme — warranted a minimum two-year sentence.

But out of compassion for her family, "which has supported you in an absolutely amazing manner... and is going to be punished by your conduct," he reduced her sentence to 15 months.

"I expect that they expect to see a different person and that the community is entitled to expect to see a different person on your release," he said, urging her to "make a solemn

commitment to your family and self to tell the truth from now on."

Mrs. Junkin was also given three years' probation and ordered to undergo psychiatric treatment.

Crown attorney Bryan Davies, calling it an "evil crime," said the scam was "the worst example of fraud I've ever been involved with."

The "cold-hearted breach of trust" was deserving of a minimum two-year sentence, he argued in his submissions.

"This fraud wasn't just a one-shot deal, it persisted in a number of ways over a period of years."

"This isn't just a situation of a mix up of money or family dispute, this was a systematic, well-thought-out plan involving a significant amount of money... in which a large number of people were cheated," he said.

The Pirates were clawed by the Agincourt Tigers 8-2 in their first game.

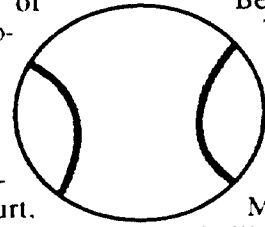
But the local team used timely hitting and tight defence to build up a nine-run lead against Cambridge before winning 11-6.
