



Save open spaces, say Pickering residents

PICKERING — Pickering residents are most concerned about saving their neighborhoods and natural areas. At least that's the case if the approximately 80 residents who attended the official unveiling of Pickering's proposed new Official Plan Tuesday are representative of their town. They wanted to know what the Town is going to do to preserve agricultural lands in north Pickering, protect the Rouge Valley system and save their neighborhoods from infill development.

North Pickering resident Lorne Almack of the Green Door Alliance urged council to wrest control of the northern airport lands back from the federal government.

"They do what they like and we have no appeal," said Mr. Almack, adding citizens are being "denied the benefits of municipal government" and that the whole airport issue has been dragging on for 24 years. He maintained an airport never will or should be built in north Pickering and the thousands of acres of land expropriated by the federal government for it should be returned to private ownership for agricultural use. Mr. Almack claimed the area could generate millions of dollars worth of production in crops such as soya beans, which could provide significant economic benefits to Pickering.

"Try to do something about clearing this up," he told Town officials.

Town Council's position has been to support the designation of the lands

Snobelen should resign: public school board boss

Education minister 'doesn't have an idea of what education is about': MacLean

DURHAM — Durham Board of Education's chairman is calling for Education Minister John Snobelen to resign over his suggestion that school boards may be eliminated in a major overhaul of the school system.

"The minister should resign because he obviously doesn't have an idea of what education in this province is all about," says Audrey MacLean, chairman of the board recently named by a German-based group as the world's best education system.

She says Mr. Snobelen's focus in education is money while school boards are concerned about students.

Last week, during a provincial cabinet retreat, Mr. Snobelen said an education overhaul could see the Province take over school curriculum and funding of edu-

cation and school boards would be eliminated or drastically reduced in size and importance.

He said municipal councils could take over the education responsibilities not looked after by the Province. That would include the location of new schools and how provincial programs would be adapted for each community. He said local political bodies are needed to make political decisions about schools.

"If the minister can prove that the change...is going to increase

Public board reviews school closure policy

DURHAM — A Pickering trustee heading a committee to review Durham Board of Education's school closure policy wants to make one thing clear — no schools are slated to shut.

"No schools are being recommended for closure," Colleen Jordan says. "The committee is just looking at the policy."

Seven small schools, including four in Oshawa and one in Pickering, were identified in a report by board staff as meeting the criteria for consideration for possible closure under the current board policy.

But that policy has been suspended while Ms. Jordan's committee reviews and possibly revises it. The review was ordered by the board after the report was released in April

and met with fierce opposition from local trustees, parents and Oshawa Council.

"I'm strongly opposed no matter what school it is," says Oshawa trustee Mike Nicholson, a member of the review committee. "This is not good for education."

Taking 200 students from one school and putting them into another puts a strain on classrooms, gyms and washrooms and classrooms. Mr. Nicholson contends. It also means more portables, he adds.

The committee has met once and will hold more meetings Sept. 25, Oct. 1 and 21. At the first meeting, the committee reviewed the current policy and members were given information about other school boards' closure policies. Ms. Jordan says she's seen

nothing "dramatically different" from Durham's procedures.

Durham's policy, adopted in 1984, simply states the procedure for closing schools is to be consistent with Ministry of Education guidelines.

Regulations dictate that schools with consistent under-enrolment and high maintenance costs should be considered for closure by a committee made up of trustees, parents, ratepayers and school officials. This committee would study all options, including closure and changing school boundaries, for at least six months before reporting to the board.

"I think that is only wise," Ms. Jordan says. "We do look at build-

ings and facilities to make sure they are being used efficiently. I don't think the taxpayers would want us to have buildings that are empty or require substantial renovations if there were alternatives."

The seven schools listed in the April report are Valley View in Pickering, Cedardale, Harmony Road, South Simcoe (winner of a national award last year) and Mary Street Public schools in Oshawa, R.A. Hutchison in Whitby, and Epsom in Scugog Township.

The staff report states the board could save \$1.1

million annually in operating costs and \$6.8 million in planned renovations if the schools were "consolidated" or closed and their students sent to nearby schools.

the learning and support of students in the class and of teachers and if it means taxpayers won't pay more, then I'd say I want to see it," Ms. MacLean says. "But I don't see how it can."

Even if the Province takes over most of education and its funding, property taxpayers won't notice any drop in their tax bill. Municipal Affairs Minister Al Leach made it clear that municipalities would be expected to pay the full cost of other provincially-funded services, such as roads, sewers and child care, in exchange for giving up education costs. School taxes currently account for more than 50 per cent of the total municipal tax bill.

Teachers aren't too happy about Mr. Snobelen's comments regarding school boards and the need for a further \$900 million in education cuts either.

"AT OSSTF (Ontario Secondary School Teachers Federation), we believe in a democratic, locally elected school board," says Patricia Jerney, president of the federation in Durham.

"We believe in finding the local solutions to fit the needs of local taxpayers, local parents, local students and local communities."

Any further cuts in the system will damage the quality of education, Ms. Jerney says.

"It's not a matter of funding, it's not a matter of costs, it's a matter of power," says Mike O'Connor, president of Durham's elementary school Catholic teachers.

"It's not something that will improve (the system)."

He said if the minister had stayed in school and learned to read and listen, he'd be able to read Premier Mike Harris's speeches given in England where he praised Ontario's social system.

"It's very demoralizing and very confusing," says Tony White, president of the secondary school division of the Ontario English Catholic Teachers Association in Durham.

Chrysler CAW members expected to ratify contract Sunday

□ Hundreds of Ajax and Pickering Chrysler employees cast votes at Denis O'Connor

About 700 Canadian Auto Workers' members who work at Chrysler's Ajax trim plant vote on a tentative contract agreement with the company today.

The members of CAW Local 1090 are expected to approve the deal, which president John Gatens says will "send an echo around

the world in terms of job commitments and what companies and unions can share."

Chrysler and the CAW reached the agreement just shortly before a strike deadline of 11:59 p.m. Tuesday.

Under the terms of the contract, Chrysler's 12,600 employees in Canada are

expected to get wage increases of two per cent during each year of the deal. CAW officials say the tentative deal also includes 10 additional paid days off over the life of the agreement, an increase in the vacation bonus to \$900 and additional pay for skilled trades of 20 cents per hour. The controversial issue

of outsourcing was also resolved to the CAW's satisfaction, notes Mr. Gatens.

The ratification vote is at Denis O'Connor High

If the deal is approved, the CAW is expected to announce Monday whether Ford or General Motors is its next strike target.

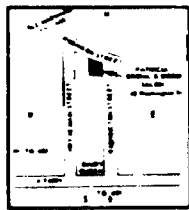

Pickering's proposed confidentiality bylaw not intended to gag councillors: Brenner

PICKERING — Town Council will soon be asked to pass a bylaw making it illegal for politicians to publicly discuss matters dealt with in closed-door meetings.

A motion for the new bylaw is being brought forward by Ward 1 Councillor Maurice Brenner.

"This bylaw is not being written as a gag order," says Coun. Brenner. "It's being written to spell out the rules. It's not to be used as a vehicle for cover-up."

Right now in Pickering there is no penalty for councillors revealing information discussed in-camera by Council, as long as it doesn't involve privacy requirements imposed by the provincial Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. For example, if a councillor reveals information about an individual employee discussed in-camera, that councillor could be charged with violating the information and privacy act.

But it is legal for a councillor to reveal information about, for example, Town property negotiations even if those negotiations have been discussed in-camera as allowed under the Municipal Act.

"Councillors have the permission in law to discuss the issue in private," explains Paul Jones, local government policy manager with the provincial Ministry of Municipal Affairs. But that doesn't require them to discuss it in private, and doesn't prohibit councillors from revealing what Council discussed in private.

Under the Municipal Act, however, municipalities can pass bylaws governing their own proceedings which forbid revealing the contents of confidential Council discussions, according to Mr. Jones. A fine of up to \$5,000 could be imposed on any councillor

who violated a Pickering confidentiality bylaw. Prosecution would have to take place through the provincial court system.

Pickering can't pass a bylaw that forbids councillors to publicly discuss matters that were discussed in-camera if Council did not have the right or obligation to discuss those matters behind close doors. Items councillors do have the right to discuss in private include matters involving property negotiations, personnel or litigation.

Mr. Brenner maintains, for example, that even if Pickering already had a confidentiality bylaw no councillor could be punished for revealing in-camera discussions about its \$1-million investment loss with Confederation Life, since that is not a matter the Town is allowed to keep secret under the Municipal Act.

"I'm not talking about things people call confidential but are not," says the councillor. "This is not to restrict the rights of the public."

Coun. Brenner maintains a confidentiality bylaw is needed to stop leaks of information about property negotiations and legal matters the Town is involved in.

"Historically there has been that problem in the Town," he says, citing as an example the leak of information concerning Town negotiations for the \$1.15-million purchase of the Port Pickering Marina site on Frenchman's Bay for parkland.

Mr. Jones says the kind of bylaw Pickering is contemplating is not yet common in Ontario but has been adopted in several municipalities over the last three years. What municipalities have to consider in passing such a bylaw, he says, is that it might on occasion keep matters of public interest out of the public domain.

Mr. Brenner's motion is expected to come before Council Oct. 7.

for use only as a smaller, regional airport rather than the international one originally planned by the federal government.

Stephen Marshall of Save the Rouge Valley System commended the Town for recognizing and taking some measures to protect the Rouge Valley in its new Official Plan, but maintained more needs to be done. He urged Pickering to add policies to the plan to recognize and preserve scenic roads as part of the town's cultural heritage; discourage commuter traffic along roads such as Townline Road where motorists pass through sensitive natural areas; and to better protect environmental-

ly sensitive areas everywhere.

Residents from several ratepayers associations urged the Town to protect their neighborhoods with limitations on lot sizes and the cutting down of trees.

Town staff are still accepting public input before the recommended Official Plan goes for consideration before a special meeting of Pickering Council's executive committee Thursday, Nov. 7 at 7:30 p.m. Copies of the new plan may be purchased from the Town or viewed at local libraries.

Kerfuffle over Town of Pickering restructuring

PICKERING -- It appears the restructuring of the Town's administration -- in the wake of the recent departure of the Town manager, a series of financial errors by staff and complaints from councillors about not being kept informed -- is going a little less than smoothly.

The latest controversy is a disagreement over whether certain changes have actually been approved by councillors.

During an in-camera meeting at the end of August councillors passed a number of resolutions regarding the appointment of a new human resources director, the creation of a new chief administrative officer position to replace that of Town manager and the development of a job description for a new position of financial services director.

However, at the end of the meeting, a motion to ratify the actions of Council during the closed-door session was defeated, raising the question of whether the resolutions were still in effect. Town clerk Bruce Taylor was asked for an opinion and in a memo to councillors, after consulting relevant legislation and the Durham Region clerk, he concluded the resolutions were still valid.

That didn't sit well with Ward 2 Regional Councillor Doug Dickerson, who fired off his own memo a few days later explaining why he didn't think they were valid.

"As far as this councillor is concerned," he wrote, "our vote on ratification stands and no actions taken on Aug. 28 are in effect."

Coun. Dickerson agreed there may be nothing in the rules that necessitates the ratification of Council's in-camera proceedings, but argued that process has been followed in Pick-

ering for years and should be respected. Noting the mayor was "upset" the majority of councillors did not want to ratify their own actions, Coun. Dickerson wrote, "The mayor asked the clerk for a finite opinion that the mayor knows will enshrine what had been passed, ignore

what was not ratified and throw years of process to the wind."

Even though Mayor Arthurs says the advice of the clerk has been accepted and staff are proceeding on the restructuring resolutions passed at the meeting, Coun. Dickerson says he plans

to raise the ratification issue again when councillors resume discussions on restructuring. Coun. Dickerson says he's more concerned about "the larger principle" involved in the issue of ratification rather than in nullifying any of the resolutions passed.

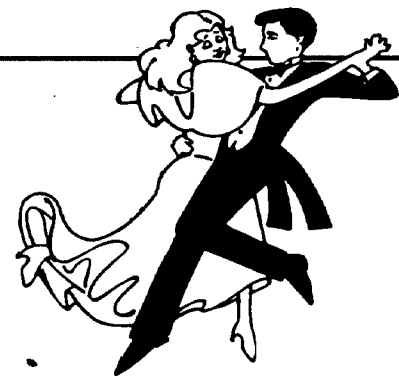

DURHAM -- Volunteers are needed to oversee visits between the children of split-up parents and their non-custodial parent. The Durham Supervised

Access Program, run here in Durham Region by the YMCA, has been operating in the region for four years with funds from the provincial Ministry of the Attorney General.

After custodial parents drop off children prior to the visit, volunteers pass the child on to the non-custodial parent. The parents do not meet.

During visits, volunteers observe and keep notes on the activities for court purposes.

While three or four families gather at each visit, a volunteer is only responsible for observing one family. Each weekly visit is a maximum of two hours.

Volunteers must be at least 18 years old and should have some experience working with children.

They're required to provide three references, undergo a criminal record check and attend orientation and training

sessions, ongoing workshops and meetings.

The YMCA has four sites where visits take place -- two in Oshawa and one each in Pickering and Port Perry. Visits in Oshawa are Tuesday nights and Sundays, while families get together in Port Perry Saturday

mornings and in Pickering Saturday afternoons.

Volunteers must commit at least three months before receiving a reference from the program.

Train track trespassers derailed in Durham safety blitz

DURHAM -- People trespassing on railway property were the target of a joint safety and enforcement blitz this past week.

Canadian Pacific and Durham Regional Police co-ordinated a safety blitz Wednesday and Thursday to crack down on people illegally trespassing on railway property. Similar blitzes are being held this month at other locations in the province.

"We're just trying to save lives," says Detective Sergeant Don Ross of the CP police service. "Someone could slip and fall and hit their head on the rail, or they could twist an ankle or break an arm. A couple of years ago a person was found frozen in a ditch by the Albert Street tracks (in Oshawa). He was alive, but apparently was intoxicated and had fallen down the hill."

The Durham stretch of the St. Lawrence and Hudson Railway, a division of CP, is one of the worst for accidents, says Det. Sgt. Ross.

"Durham has 20 per cent of the track and 33 per cent of the incidents."

One of the worst areas for people illegally crossing the tracks is in the Albert Street area in Oshawa.

Other trouble spots include the area by Harmony Creek in Oshawa, Thornton Road by the Oshawa-Whitby border and Garden Street in Whitby.

Since 1990 there have been 13 accidents along the CP rail in Durham, which covers a 40-mile stretch. Four people have been killed and eight hurt.

Canadian National reports similar numbers in Durham.

Already this year there have been one death and two injuries. CN officers have charged 30 juvenile trespassers and issued 74 warnings to young people and charged 67 adults and warned 160.

The blitz was originally to be targeted at students, but a number of recent accidents involving adults has broadened the scope of the campaign.

A few years ago Mr. Ross watched a mother push her six-month-old child in a stroller across the tracks.

"She put her hand on the no-trespassing sign to get over."

During a media information session held Wednesday five people were spotted trespassing along the tracks. CP Constable Richard Ridge caught up to one man who received a warning and was escorted off rail property.

"On an average day I'll stop two or three people," Const. Ridge said. "I have stopped as many as 15 to 20 people in one day."

Trains and freight cars average 5,000 tonnes in weight, and train engines have 3,000 horsepower.

"A train travelling 80 kilometres an hour takes two kilometres to stop," says Sgt. Ross.

Wednesday's blitz will be followed by spot checks of key problem areas, but people shouldn't expect only a slap on the wrist.

"The first time we will issue a warning," says Det. Sgt. Ross. "The second time they'll be charged. If they have a bad attitude the first time they might be charged."

The maximum penalty under the Trespassing Property Act is \$1,000, but first-time fines are \$65. The names of people caught illegally on rail property are registered on a computer and anyone convicted under the Railway Safety Act will also have a

criminal record.

The Young Offenders Act doesn't pertain to railway offences. Anyone over 12 can receive a court summons.

"I've caught four year olds walking

down the tracks," says Det. Sgt. Ross. "Sometimes their parents aren't home and sometimes they tell us it's OK."

Besides trespassing, a major area of concern is motorists trying to illegally

cross the tracks at level crossings ahead of oncoming trains.

Already this year there have been 53 accidents on railway property in Ontario resulting in 12 deaths.
