## Grade debate

### 'A' students in Durham must really know their ABCs

The move to standardized report cards across the province has raised speculation that 'A' grades may become a rarity for elementary school students, but a local school board official says that's not necessarily so.

Cloyce Weaver, curriculum officer with the Durham Board of Education, says while the new report cards set a "very definite standard for an A...only time will tell if teachers have been marking easier than that standard or harder than that standard."

Students at 40 public schools and 37 separate schools in the region were this week to receive the new report cards, which Mr. Weaver says will establish consistency in pupil assessment across Ontario.

However, glitches with the Ministry of Education's computer software have delayed the intro-

duction of the new evaluations at pilot schools in Durham until the next set of report cards is released in March.

Currently, there are no specific regulations given to teachers regarding what constitutes an A, Mr. Weaver says. It's "very loosely defined."

He says under the new evaluation method students will have to exceed the provincial standard, which is set by the new curriculum, to receive an A.

That has some parents concerned it will become more difficult for their children to receive top marks, Mr. Weaver adds.

But, Jim Kohls, principal of Pickering's Elizabeth B. Phin Public School, says parents need to understand the coming changes so they don't place undue "pressure" on their children to

get an A.

## 'No oil' at Pickering nuclear plant

### Investigation a 'dumb decision': Hydro official

**PICKERING** — An expensive investigation for possible oil contamination in a landfill at the Pickering nuclear station has been a mistake, says one of the American experts brought in by Ontario Hydro to help turn around its ailing nuclear plants.

Robert Ferguson, vice-president of technical support for Hydro's nuclear division, told the Durham Nuclear Health Committee Friday that Hydro has spent about \$1 million on the investigation.

# Alcohol-related charges against drivers up 67% in Christmas blitz

The number of alcohol-related charges laid by Durham Regional Police RIDE units in the first two weeks of this year's campaign is up 67 per cent compared to last year.

Twelve motorists were charged in the second week of the program, bringing this year's total to 25, says Sergeant Rick Bates of the traffic management unit.

Sgt. Bates says officers are "bound to find more" drunk drivers as the department has doubled the number of RIDE teams on the road to two. "But 25 in two weeks is somewhat disturbing."

At this point last year RIDE officers had charged 15 drivers. Police also laid 14 charges as a result of spot checks for drug possession, assaulting a police officer, causing a disturbance, dangerous driving and breaching probation.

RIDE teams operating in Ajax, Oshawa, Port Perry, Whitby and Clarington during the week stopped 12,475 vehicles and issued 166 roadside breath tests. Of those, 27 blew into the 'warn' area, resulting in a 12-hour licence suspension. In addition to RIDE, officers on routine patrol also charged seven motorists with alcohol-related offences.

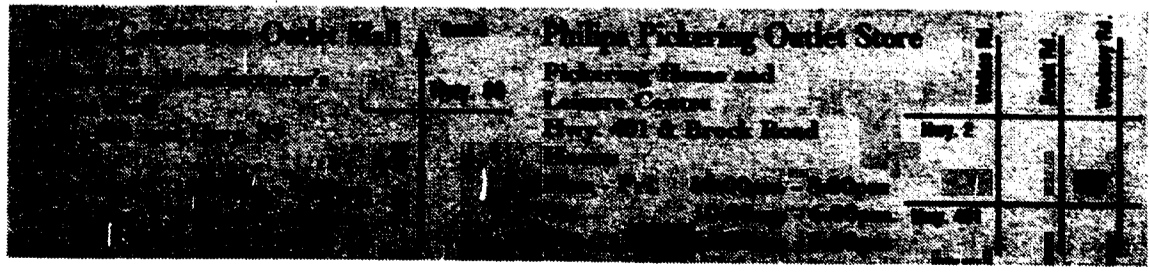
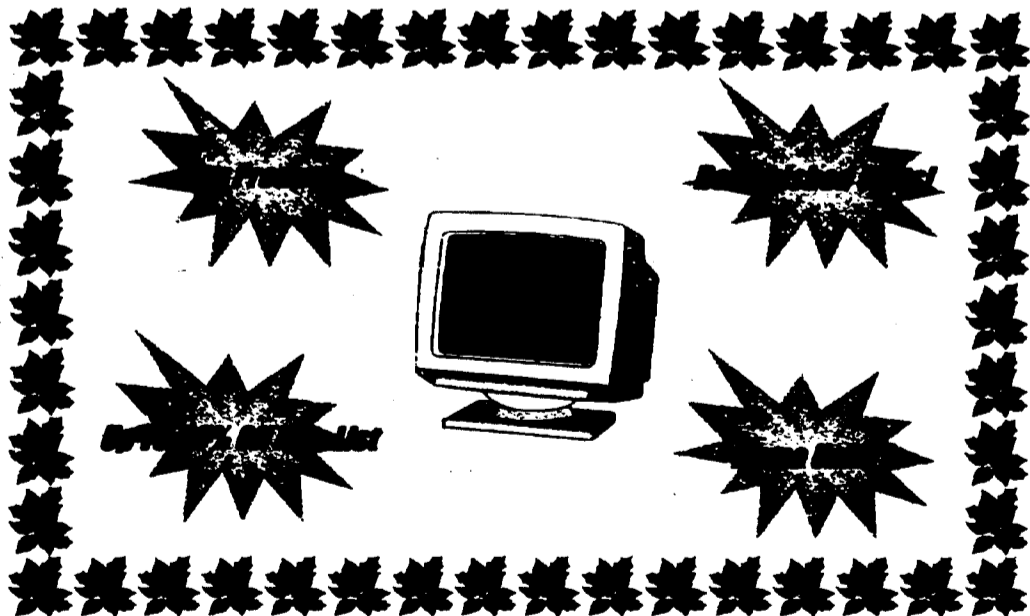

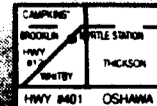

# Investigation nearly complete, no oil found at Pickering nuclear plant site

"Quite honestly there's no oil," said Mr. Ferguson, suggesting the provincial utility had acted over-conservatively in ordering an investigation without first obtaining some kind of verification that oil had indeed been dumped at the site.

"I'm just as guilty, more guilty than most," he told the committee. "The point is it was a dumb decision."

On Aug. 27, Hydro announced up to 40,000 gallons of waste oil may have been disposed of between 1977 and 1982 in a landfill for construction debris on the site of the nuclear station. The utility said use of the site for liquid industrial waste by Hydro construction crews had been brought to Hydro management's attention by a long-time employee. The utility admitted the site was not licensed for liquid industrial waste disposal and accepted full responsibility for the dumping and promised a proper clean-up of the site.

The consultant hired by Hydro to oversee the investigation of the landfill on behalf of the Town of Pickering, at the Town's request, confirms there does not yet appear to be any significant oil contamination at the site.

"To date we have not found any major concentration of oil," says Frank Paznar of Corporate

and Government Consultants Canada, explaining the investigation of the landfill by Hydro's consultant, Wardrop Engineering Inc., was about 75 per cent complete. However, Mr. Paznar maintains it's too early to conclude there is no significant oil contamination problem.

"I wouldn't make that statement yet. We did find some slight

traces of oil." He notes it could be oil that was used to suppress dust on dirt roads years ago, but no conclusions can be drawn until everything is looked at. "The investigation is still continuing."

About 30 boreholes have been dug at both the suspect site on the east side of the nuclear station and another landfill on the west side which is being looked at as a

precaution. As well, 34 wells have been dug which will be used for long-term monitoring, and test pits have also been excavated.

For the most part, says Mr. Paznar, the landfills contain construction rubble such as wood, steel, asphalt, concrete and plastic sheeting. Some materials which were routinely tossed into construction landfills in the 1970s but are no longer put there, such as oil filters, paint cans, oil or grease drums, a fuel can and a fuel tank, have also been found.

About 350 soil samples have been taken and sent to independent labs for testing. The results are not yet available.

Wardrop has also decided to dig some boreholes in parts of Alex Robertson Park just north of the nuclear plant that were apparently used to burn construction rubble.

"We've had a thorough investigation and Wardrop has been given an independent hand in determining where and what they're going to dig," notes Mr. Paznar.

The Town's consultant was scheduled to provide Pickering Council last night an update on the landfill investigation. Work at the site is expected to wrap up by the end of December, and Mr. Paznar expects to have his final report to Council by the end of January.

## Neighbour helps cops nab burglars

**PICKERING** — Two burglars who broke into a Pickering home while a couple and their children slept upstairs were found hiding in the dining room after a neighbour alerted police.

A Stonepath Circle resident called 911 after spotting two men breaking into vehicles on the street then forcing their way into a neighbour's residence at 2:30 a.m. Monday, Durham Regional Police said.

"When officers arrived the door was answered by a man who lives there who said he was asleep in bed with his wife, and children in another room," Sergeant Jim Grimley said.

"When the officers went inside the house they found two males hiding in the dining room."

The family "had no idea" their home was being burglarized, Sgt. Grimley said.

Police recovered a large quantity of various items stolen from three cars on the street and took two suspects into custody.

Anthony Couto, 27, of Sharon, and Jamie Aparicio, 42, of Toronto, are both charged with three counts each of mischief under \$5,000 and theft under \$5,000 and one count each of possession of stolen property over \$5,000, break and enter and possession of burglary tools.

## Crown wants robber declared a dangerous offender

The prosecution started legal proceedings last week in an attempt to have the man convicted of shooting three policemen during a bloody bank heist declared a dangerous offender.

Bound by leg irons, Mitchiel "Micky" McArthur was led into a Whitby courtroom under guard of members of Durham Regional Police's Tactical Support Unit.

Micky McArthur, 44, was one of two masked bandits who, armed with a high-powered military rifle, burst into Port Perry's Bank of Montreal on Oct. 20, 1994, shot bank manager Alan Knight and opened fire on police during the getaway.

He was found guilty of 17 offences, including the attempted murders of constables Mark McConkey and Warren Ellis - both shot in the head - and Detective Paul Mooy, who was shot in the arm.

The shooting spree claimed a fifth victim, realtor Debbie Taylor, who was struck in the back by a stray bullet while in her office across the street.

The money stolen, \$50,000, and the weapons used in the heist were never recovered.

Angus Junior McArthur, Mitchiel's younger brother, was also accused in the robbery, however, he was acquitted of all charges by a jury.

Prosecutors Lori-Ann Turner and Michael Hill yesterday filed an application in the Ontario Court, general division, asking Mr. Justice Harry LaForme to grant a court-ordered psychiatric assessment of Mitchiel McArthur.

Under amendments passed last summer to the section of the Criminal Code dealing with dangerous offender applications, the assessment is required before the Ministry of the Attorney General can support such an application made by the

Crown. Dangerous offenders can be imprisoned for life, with periodic reviews of their case.

The hearing, however, was sidetracked by a motion made by Mr. McArthur's lawyer, Greg Lafontaine, to have the new dangerous offender amendments declared unconstitutional. Arguments on the application were expected to take up most of the day.

Should the application to have Mr. McArthur assessed go forward, the Crown was to begin calling evidence today that would include testimony from the lead investigator in the Port Perry case, Detective Rolf Kluem, as well as a psychiatrist who has had previous dealings with Mr. McArthur.

Mr. Justice LaForme ruled at the start of the proceedings on issues of security concerns raised by Assistant Crown Attorney Michael Hill, who said "the public was at risk" during Mr. McArthur's trial in the same courthouse earlier in the year.

Mr. McArthur, the author of a 1990 autobiography titled, 'I'd Rather Be Wanted Than Had - The Memoirs Of An Unrepentant Bank Robber', has a long criminal record for crimes of "escalating violence" and previously gained notoriety for escaping from the maximum security penitentiary in Kingston.

"I am well aware of the background of Mitchiel McArthur, his history, the book. . . The concern about Mitchiel McArthur is very real," said Mr. Justice LaForme.

## Infrastructure projects ready to dig in

**PORT PERRY** - A section of North Street is in for some improvements, thanks to a infrastructure project involving the federal, provincial and regional levels of government.

The federal government announced Nov. 28 that eight Canada/Ontario Infrastructure Works (COIW) projects worth more than \$4 million had received approval in Durham, including a sanitary sewer and water main replacement job along North Street between Perry and Water streets.

The program calls for the three levels of government to equally share the cost, although only \$87,000 of the local project, which will

cover the water main work, will be funded by COIW money. The remaining \$253,000 for sanitary sewer construction is being paid for by the Region.

Durham engineering technician Peter Ufniak said both areas needed the work, and since the water application was approved, Region officials decided to take care of all the work at once.

"It makes sense to do them both at the same time so we're going to do them both at the same time," said Mr. Ufniak. "That way it will mean less disruption and it will be more economical at the same time."

## Witnesses wanted to fatal accident on Hwy. 401

**OSHAWA** -- Police are looking for witnesses to a rush-hour pedestrian accident on Highway 401 which claimed the life of a 37-year-old Courtice man Friday.

Alan McDougall was killed when he stepped on to the east-bound roadway east of Harmony Road and was struck by a tractor trailer at 5:20 p.m., Ontario Provincial Police said.

Mr. McDougall's vehicle was found parked on the shoulder with a flat tire, OPP said.

The accident remains under investigation, however, provincial police officials said no

charges are expected against the 32-year-old man who was driving the truck.

### Teens charged with possession of stolen property

**OSHAWA** -- Durham Regional Police officers who became suspicious of a driver when they "could only see the top of his head" ended up arresting two teenage boys, ages 13 and 14, on auto theft charges.

The officers stopped the 1988 GMC pickup on Laval Drive in Oshawa last Saturday evening and noticed the ignition had been punched out, police said.

The vehicle was stolen earlier from the GO Transit parking lot in Oshawa.

Sergeant Jim Grimley said the 14-year-old driver and a 13-year-old passenger were both arrested by officers at the scene. Police seized a screwdriver.

They teens were both charged with theft, possession of stolen property and possession of burglary tools.

The 14-year-old was also charged with breaching probation conditions.

### Surveillance ends in robbery arrest

**OSHAWA** - Durham Regional Police have arrested and charged a suspect in the robbery of a Seven-Eleven store in Oshawa last Tuesday.

A 33-year-old man was arrested late Friday following surveillance of a Nonquon Road housing complex by robbery unit detectives, police said.

The early-morning heist occurred when a man and a woman entered the store at Nonquon Road and Mary Street and the man, with his hand in his pocket, gestured to the clerk he was armed, police said.

The robber demanded and received cash and cigarettes before he and his accomplice fled the store.

No weapon was seen. Colin Cameron Zimmerling of no fixed ad-

dress appeared in Oshawa provincial court last Monday charged with robbery.

Durham Regional Police are still seeking the female accomplice, who was described as white, five-feet five-inches and wore a beige hooded coat.

### Senate overhaul long overdue

When is the only time you ever hear about Canada's upper chamber, the Senate? Answer: only in a negative light and only when that light shines on some form of abuse of power, of public money or of public respect.

The latest Senate embarrassment rests squarely on the shoulders of Sen. Andy Thompson, a 72 year old who was appointed to his post in 1967 by then-Prime Minister Lester Pearson. A one-time Ontario Liberal leader, Sen. Thompson has shown up just 12 days in the past 459 sittings of the Senate, a term that extends over the past seven years. For that Sen. Thompson, who lives in La Paz, Mexico for six months a year for health reasons and who will not be forced to retire his Senate seat until Dec. 14, 1999 when he hits the mandatory retirement age of 75, is paid a salary of \$64,400 per year. He also receives a tax-free allowance of \$10,100 per year, has office expenses of \$90,000 per year, a \$38,000 personal government paid-for secretary at his disposal and gets 64 free business-class airline trip tickets per year. He receives this largesse if he appears just one day out of every two consecutive sessions of Parliament.

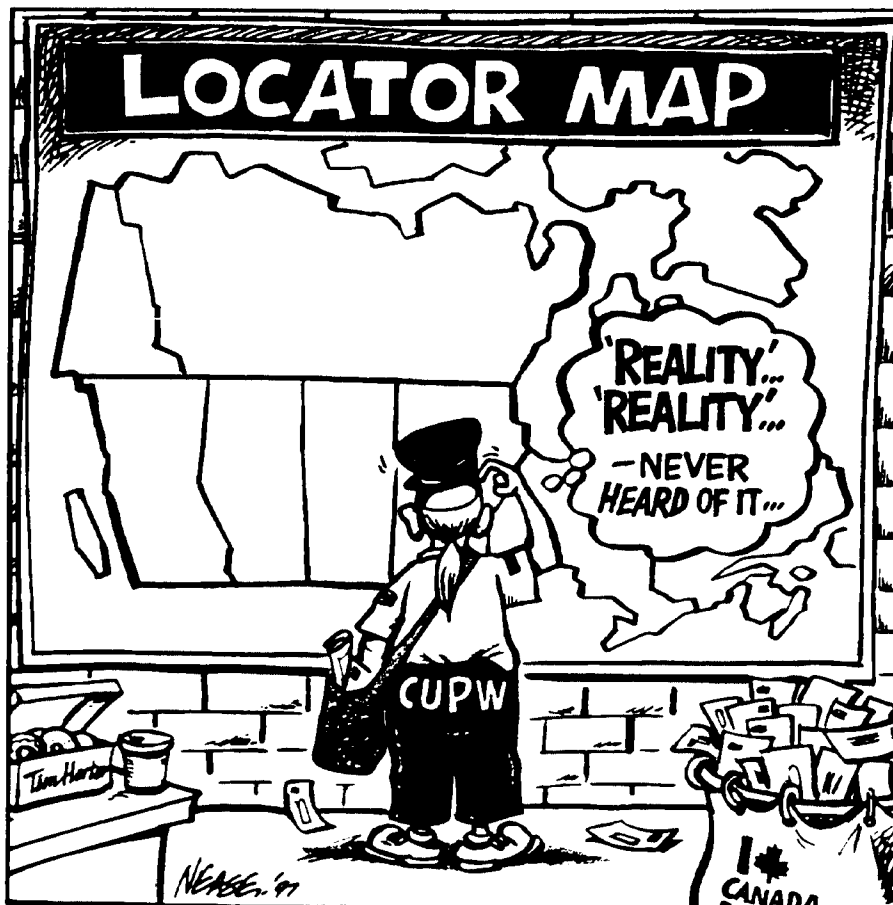
Sen. Thompson is only one example of many senators who do not take their jobs seriously but certainly have no trouble cashing taxpayer-funded cheques for doing next to nothing. Other senators certainly work hard at their jobs, putting in long hours on committees and providing a review of legislation that can help when final reading comes along.

The obvious problem with the Senate is that its role and the job of its members is ill-defined. There are two options: either scrap the Senate completely, or radically reform it so it has a vital place at the centre of public life in this country.

Reform ideas (and it can be said they really are 'Reform' ideas) included the triple-E senate: equal, elected and effective. A senator from Alberta, Stan Waters, was elected in the 1980s, died shortly after and was replaced in the old-fashioned way, by appointment. An equal Senate would have equal numbers of senators from each province. As for being effective, the Senate's duties could be expanded. These ideas were on the table along with many others in the Charlottetown Accord in 1992 but went away when the Accord was defeated.

The first step is that senators must have much more stringent attendance and committee work requirements. If senators can skip Senate work, why have a Senate at all? The Senate can be a force for good work in this country, but the House of Commons must ensure a Senate that in fact, does work, is put in place. Canadians deserve no less.

### Spin on Bill 160 story making me dizzy

The coverage given to this event by your reporter, Linda White, was difficult to believe. Hundreds of parents and other constituents had their first — and for many — only opportunity to speak to their provincial representative. It should be remembered that were it not for the opposition parties, Bill 160 would have passed third and final reading the very afternoon before Ms. Ecker "faced" her constituents.

The clear and overwhelming majority of these residents wanted to let Ms. Ecker know they did not agree with her government's cuts to education nor did they accept its illogical reasoning. Many were fully aware of both sides of the issue and did not come to hear the "party line" simply

repeated. For your reporter to focus on a parent in the distinct minority does a disservice to the many frustrated, concerned parents who were in attendance.

My wife and I have tried for three weeks to speak with the Minister of Community and Social Services. Home and work numbers have been left with Ms. Ecker's office assistant. We have made reminder calls to attempt to communicate. To date, no response from Ms. Ecker.

"Ambushed", the word used in your headline, implies hiding. Someone has been hiding and it's not the constituents of this riding. But after reading your paper's coverage one might think, "Those Durham West constituents, they just won't listen".

Excuse me, I'm getting dizzy from the spin on the story.

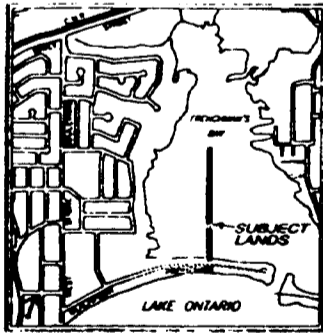

## Hard-working Panthers split weekend games

**PICKERING** — The Pickering Panthers managed one win in two league contests on the weekend when they turned in workmanlike efforts in both games.

Sunday afternoon, the Panthers turned in a solid effort against the Wellington Dukes at the Wellington and District Community Centre, widely regarded as the toughest place to play in the loop, but were defeated 4-1.

The loss followed a 7-5 victory over the visiting Pittsburgh Junior Penguins at the Pickering Recreation Complex Friday night.

The score in the Panthers' defeat in Wellington was not indicative of the play of the Pickering juniors who outworked the opposition and also outshot them 42-28. However, the Panthers were unable to finish their scoring opportunities and the powerplay was a woeful 0-7.

Despite the team's inability to convert its scoring chances, the Panthers' effort had head coach Rod McGillis beaming.

"We gave one of our best efforts in a long time. The work ethic was exceptional," notes McGillis.

Chris Hunter and Trifon also scored for Pickering in the final stanza. The other scorer wasn't known.

Panthers' goalie Joel Cameron had to make a few late saves to record the win in net, including one on a breakaway from centre ice.

The Panthers return to action this weekend with three important divisional games. Pickering plays rival Oshawa Legionaires at the complex Friday at 7:30 p.m. The Panthers travel to Port Hope's Jack Burger Sports Complex for a game against the Buzzards Saturday night, then end the weekend with a Sunday afternoon tilt in the U.S. against the first-place Syracuse Junior Crunch.

The Panthers are currently in fifth spot in the league's Eastern Division with a mark of 8-14-5 for 21 points.
