Union a 'foundation of love and respect'

Minister welcomes same-sex ruling

DURHAM — It's not uncommon to hear people in love say they want to shout their happiness from the rooftops. But for gays and lesbians, theirs was once called 'the love that dared not speak its name.'

Now homosexual couples can declare their love for all to hear and are close to sanctioning their unions by marrying.

Three judges of the Ontario Superior Court made Canadian history July 12 when they ruled excluding same-sex couples from being

Vandals leaving their mark

Police say parks, schools hardest hit

DURHAM — Eggs, potted plants and even chalk are their weapons of destruction.

It's summertime and that's prime time for vandals who wreak havoc on property and aggravation for the owners.

"Kids are hanging out, being bored with little parent supervision," says Inspector Sherry Whiteway, of the Durham Regional Police Services (DRPS) Ajax-Pickering office. Parks and schools are the hardest hit areas so far this season but local residents have discovered eggs don't always come sunny side up, especially when they land on your house. Eggs seem to be one of the weapons of choice in the Ajax/Pickering vandals' arsenal this summer.

Some area homeowners have heard kids partying, particularly in walkways between homes, only to wake up the next morning to discover they've been egged, relates Insp. Whiteway. At least, egg is washable. Spray paint, markers and even chalk have proved a little harder to remove from schools and on back doors of commercial and institutional properties, she says. "Our recommendation is to get rid of it as soon as you can because you don't want them staking out their territory," says the inspector.

For a Courtice resident, the return from a vacation was the beginning of a nightmare Monday morning after vandals targeted his Glen Abbey Drive home using not only eggs, but his own plants to create hours of cleanup.

"We came home from our vacation around 3 a.m. and went to bed at 3:30," says Oudit Rai. "We woke up to find eggs on our main entrance, eggs and mud on our van and our left rear tire flat with a hole in it. Our back

Former Crown's next court date is Sept. 16

DURHAM — Former Durham Region prosecutor Bryan Davies, who faces 18 charges of fraud and theft, will appear in court Sept. 16 after his lawyer made a brief appearance in Oshawa court Tuesday. Mr. Davies, 43, was charged Monday, July 15, after a year-long OPP investigation into the alleged misappropriation of charitable funds originating from criminal plea-bargains. The assistant Crown attorney had been in charge of a high-profile pyramid prosecution of a number of Durham Region women several years ago. He is accused of failing to deposit trust fund donations arising out of plea bargains made during the pyramid cases.

Smile! Break-in suspect caught on camera

PICKERING — Three men accused of breaking into a convertible car were caught by the victim, but only on camera.

Durham Regional Police have recently released the picture taken at 3:30 a.m. Sunday, June 30, when a Pickering man heard sounds in his driveway on Grafton Court. He saw two men inside his son's parked vehicle and another one beside it. The suspects entered the vehicle by cutting open the canvas roof.

Both father and son went outside and detained one suspect while the other two fled. Several pictures were then taken of the suspect with a digital camera.

A few moments later another man approached and offered to help with the detainee. At that time the suspect broke free and both men fled. Nothing was reported missing from the parked vehicle.

Unitarian Universalist leader has united five or six gay or lesbian couples since early 1980s

able to legally marry is an indefensible violation of the Charter of Rights.

"The status and incidence inherent in the foundational institution of marriage must be open to same-sex couples," reads the unanimous decision.

Since becoming a Unitarian Universalist minister in 1995, Reverend Cheryl Jack says she has united five or six gay and lesbian couples. But Unitarian Universalism has hosted the ceremonies since at least the early 1980s, says the Ashburn minister.

"Since the early 1970s, we've been moving towards and encouraging non-discriminatory behaviour towards gays, lesbians and bisexuals," she says.

Rev. Jack says she supports the July 12 Ontario Superior Court ruling wholeheartedly, and doesn't agree with the federal government's stance up to this point — that procreation defines marriage.

"I don't think it should matter what a person's sexual orientation is as long as a foundation of love and respect is there," she says.

But the definition of who can get married in Canada is, finally, a federal jurisdiction. Ottawa has yet to issue its decision whether to appeal the recent Ontario judgment.

If federal lawmakers don't appeal, the Ontario court determined the necessary legislation allowing

gays and lesbians to marry be made into law within a 24-month timeframe. In turn, the Ontario Superior Court said it would also give the provincial government two years to provide its same-sex couples the same rights as when a man and a woman choose to marry.

The Province also has the right to appeal the judges' findings. Rev. Jack points out the divorce rate is high, adding a heterosexual marriage doesn't necessarily guarantee a loving, committed marriage with longevity. More and more heterosexual couples are deciding not to have children at all, she says.

Under the procreation stipula-

tion, those marriages wouldn't be considered legal either, Rev. Jack points out.

But while she expects the couples she has joined in the past would have appreciated their union being considered legal, Rev. Jack doesn't feel the experience was any less meaningful for them.

A service of union is for all intents and purposes a wedding, she points out.

There is music chosen, and a processional. Rev. Jack even issues a certificate of union to the couple in place of signing a marriage licence.

The Ontario ruling came in

sponse to a lawsuit launched by Joe Varnell and Kevin Bourassa, a gay couple, after the Ontario government refused to register their marriage last year.

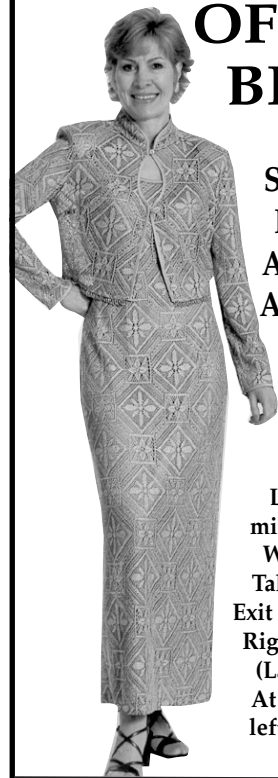
The Human Rights Act, which applies to all individuals, provides protection from discrimination based on sexual orientation. The law already extends bereavement leave to gay federal employees living in same-sex partner relationships. In simple terms, same sex couples currently have the same rights as those living in common-law unions.

"Lots of couples in general today don't have a legal marriage. We know lots of people who live together, but they've still said their commitment to one another," says Rev. Jack. "Pieces of paper don't necessarily make a loving couple. They have nothing to do with what's in the heart."

Rev. Jack doesn't expect the new legislation to be retroactive but there should be nothing to stop those five couples she has joined from applying for a marriage licence once the ruling is fully in place.

"For me, it's an absolute joy to be able to do this," says Rev. Jack, who is looking forward to uniting her next same-sex couple in August.

Mixed local reaction to court ruling

DURHAM — Area members of Parliament were mixed in their views of what the federal government's next step will be on the licensing of same-sex marriages.

Whitby-Ajax MP Judi Longfield doesn't support licensing. She noted she voted against a bill that would permit same-sex couples from receiving benefits.

"I voted for a man and woman to the exclusion of all others," she said. "I'm hoping Ontario will appeal it. Marriage is a man and a woman. I have no problems with gays and lesbians. That's not the issue."

As for the Liberal government appealing the ruling, she said, "If the federal government is listening to the views of a majority of its members, I think they should."

However, Pickering-Ajax-Uxbridge MP Dan McTeague said the Liberals aren't planning on making changes anytime soon. "I'm not in support of re-defining the definition of a spouse," he said in an interview.

In fact, Mr. McTeague said the feeling he gets from the few calls he's received from constituents on the issue is the majority support the status quo.

At the municipal level, applications for same-sex licences haven't been an issue in Ajax and Pickering.

"I've never had that inquiry," said Pickering clerk Bruce Taylor. "There have been no phone calls and no one has come up to the counter."

If someone does arrive, Mr. Taylor said there is still a law in place he would have to follow.

"At this point we're not issuing marriage licences to same-sex couples," he explained. "There was a section of the marriages act stating a marriage is between a man and a woman that was deemed discriminatory, but it's my understanding they gave the legislature two years to amend it. Until it is amended we have to follow what's there right now."

Ajax clerk Marty de Rond agreed. "The law doesn't allow us to issue one," he said, noting he, too, cannot recall anyone coming to Town Hall seeking such a licence.

"They can fill out an application, but the licence itself will not be issued," he added. "It's not that I'm being obstructionist, but the law doesn't permit me to issue one."

windows were egged and about five large potted plants were dumped in our pool.' The pool had to be drained to repair the damage.

In Mr. Rai's case, the vandalism may be a personal attack, he believes, possibly related to his work as a criminal lawyer and with the Children's Aid Society. But, often it is more a crime of opportunity. Parks are common targets, says Inspector Whiteway who says an increased police presence is helping alleviate the situation.

"We have bicycle officers go out. It's amazing what they can ride up on." As well, school liaison officers, who know the local youth, have been reassigned for the summer, in the community and parks and a target team, used to assist where the policing need is greatest, have also been assigned to the parks, she says. "Basically we have a zero-tolerance policy."

Sometimes, vandalism creates more than a mess. It can instil fear as well. In Port Perry a Catholic seniors' residence, Immaculate Conception, adjacent to a park, is battling repeated incidents of rocks and BB pellets being thrown or shot through its windows. Aside from the four windows the residence has replaced in the past six months, the actions have shaken the seniors, some of whom have been hit by rocks as they careened through the glass.

No motive, other than youthful trouble-making has been attributed to the incidents at the Port Perry seniors' home.

Across the region, mischief crimes, including vandalism to cars and property, was up about 10 per cent in 2001 with 4,485 incidents compared with 4,075 the year before. Over the past five years, incidents in Durham have held around the 4,000 mark. In the first six months of this year, mischief related specifically to property actually declined from 459 reports in the first half of 2001 to 398 in 2002, says Dave Selby, spokesman for DRPS.

Residents hoping to take proactive

measures to protect their homes and communities can invest in good lighting around their property. As well, suggests Insp.

Whiteway, reporting vandalism to police is key. "We have to know where it's happening to put out target patrols. If you see

anything, report it immediately. The sooner we put out the message there's zero tolerance, the more effective it will be."

We must either use it or lose it

Reports offer blueprint to ensuring healthy future for Carruthers, Duffins

It was one of those potentially troubling scenarios that brought a large gathering of environmentalists out to the edge of Duffins Creek last week.

Officials with the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority were unveiling two reports that they hope will guide planning around Duffins and Carruthers creeks for many years to come. The implications are huge. Future decisions about the watershed will touch on everything from our drinking water, to air quality, fish habitats and public use.

The 'living documents', as TRCA watershed specialist Gary Bowen so aptly described them, were two years in the making after it was discovered Carruthers Creek, which flows from Concession 8 in Pickering through Ajax and into Carruthers Marsh "was going downhill fast". It was at that time the TRCA decided to study that watershed, as well as Duffins.

Among the findings was that the Duffins, flowing from the Oak Ridges Moraine in Uxbridge and Whitchurch-Stouffville through to Pickering and Ajax and into Duffins Marsh, is one of the healthiest watersheds on the north shore of Lake Ontario. The reports also detail what makes the areas work and examines signs of decline and opportunities for improvements (the Carruthers rehabilitation is coming along just fine).

Based on this information alone, the time and investment was a worthy one for the two communities.

It's the next step in the process, however, that really holds vast amounts of potential when discussing the future of the Duffins and Carruthers. It's the creation of task forces — made up of experts, local stakeholders and municipal representatives — that will go about ensuring the years ahead are bright and healthy.

The teams will develop management strategies, expected in September, and then an implementation task force, which in turn will ensure regular monitoring of conditions and updates on progress. When you consider only 10 per cent of the total area surrounding the watersheds is developed, there's a vested interest in ensuring they are protected as the communities encroach and grow up around them.

For the studies to make maximum impact, Mr. Bowen pulled no punches: support is needed from municipal decision makers, both present and future, to ensure recommendations move forward and a close eye is kept on progress being made. That circle of assistance must also be extended to community groups and residents at large.

As Ajax Mayor Steve Parish noted, "We should take this wisdom and apply it every day. We can keep this the most beautiful watershed around if we do the right thing. If we don't, we could lose it."

It's not as though Durham would be alone in taking such a bold step.

Our neighbours to the west and north-west, Toronto and York respectively, as well as Hazel's fiefdom to the west of Toronto have all been smoke-free for over a year. Toronto will further implement its bylaw to include all clubs and bars by 2004. That alone should be the "reasonable period of implementation" restaurateurs are now clamouring for in Durham. Let's hope the powers that be heed his warning and have the foresight to enact a bylaw in September and make the legislation effective immediately. This would not only allow for a healthier environment in which to eat, but may also have the added benefit of giving a few people the needed impetus to kick the habit.

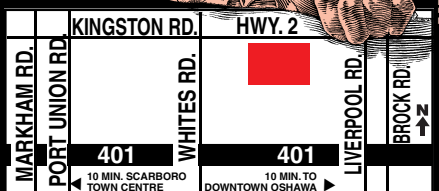

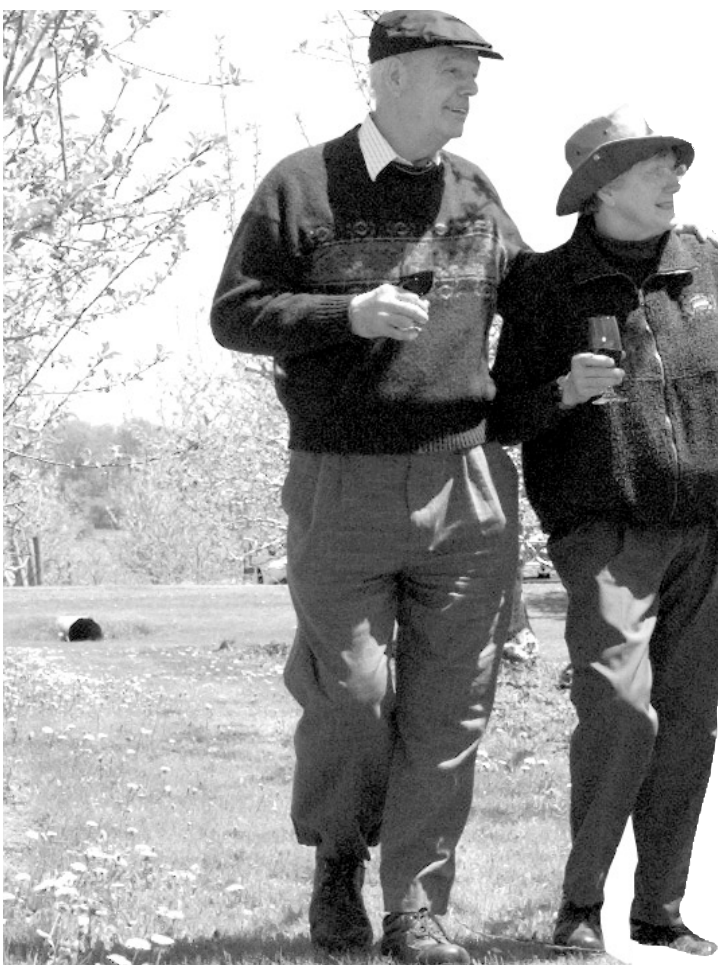

Welcome to Durham

DURHAM — It's a little known but very significant part of Durham Region's economy.

You may not think of this area as a Mecca for tourists, but 2.5 million people came to Durham in 1998. On an annual basis, tourism contributes about \$93 million to the economy.

It's everything from tours of Parkwood Estate and Cullen Gardens, bombing down the waterslide at Pleasure Valley, whacking a golf ball (hopefully to somewhere it can be found) on one of the dozens of courses in the region, visiting a multi-purpose conservation area such as Petticoat Creek in Pickering, or angling for a big catch in Lake Ontario, Lake Scugog, Lake Simcoe or one of the many creeks.

Those are just some of the summer activities available.

Surprisingly, given our proximity to Toronto, getting folks to visit Durham rather than the big city, isn't a problem, according to those in the know.

Asked if it's hard to market the Region, Durham's tourism manager Patti Watson says, "To be honest, it's not. We have a great product here. A lot see the urban sprawl and the industrial base" in Durham. But she points out there are 15 museums and art galleries, 40 bed and breakfasts and 50 golf courses here. "It's quite significant."

Alissa Smith of Ocala Orchards Farm Winery in Scugog, says it's not a tough sell attracting visitors. "No, not at all. People interested in wines love to travel."

The winery draws people who have been at other local attractions, such as Cullen Gardens in Whitby or Parkwood Estate in Oshawa. Also, there's the attraction of Port Perry being on Lake Scugog. "It's not specifically the winery, but the things around us. The winery is an add-on to a day trip or a weekend."

Alison Sheppard of the Ajax economic development services, says being close to Toronto is "a plus. There are few things to do here and it's so close. Toronto is an easy commute... there's access to the big city without paying big city prices."

While at the town's waterfront last year, she met a couple from Detroit.

"They happened onto Ajax and they found it beautiful. They discovered our waterfront and found it so beautiful, they wanted to stay a few days," Ms. Sheppard adds.

Ms. Watson says the Region has an "extensive marketing program" and she targets two areas — leisure travel and travel trades, such as tour operators.

For the leisure market, there's the Durham Region Visitors' Guide, which is distributed worldwide. There's also the fishing map, outlining the hot spots for anglers. There's a brochure for the bed and breakfast market, as well as the trail map.

Ms. Watson also pushes the area to travel writers.

Helping her is the Tourism Association of Durham Region (TADR).

"Our mandate is to work with Patti," says Darlene Brown, the group's president.

"She (Ms. Watson) brings people into the region from outside. We expose them to as many tourism association properties as possible. We do it through a variety of different things. Our Web site, map, driving routes, historic routes."

TADR began a drive in May and now has about 50 members. In the past, membership fluctuated between 30 and 90.

"It's up and down with the economy and tourism in the area," Ms. Brown says.

Those in the association are involved in the tourist business, such as Ocala Winery and Tyrone Mills in Clarington.

"Patti does a marvellous job. She's made Durham Region a tourist attraction," Ms. Brown notes.

Like everything else, tourism was affected by the terrorist attacks on the United States of Sept. 11, Ms. Brown adds.

People may be reluctant to travel to the U.S., she says.

"There's a big decline in earnings and they're watching their pocketbooks. We hope that's good for the region. They're less inclined to go outside the area. They won't go to Wonderland but they'll go to

Cullen Gardens or to the Bowmanville Zoo," Ms. Brown states, adding by staying closer to home, people will save money on gas.

The tourist association does more local promotions, while the Region does promotions provincially, nationally and internationally, Ms. Watson says.

She'll purchase advertising space with a provincial government publication and in turn sell space to the association.

"We need a critical mass. That's what I'm working with," says Ms. Watson. "Even within Toronto, we try to make ourselves as unique as possible. We need to get into people's minds."

Among the ways of getting into people's minds is learning to drive a race car at Mosport or going to the only wheelchair accessible farm in Ontario — WindReach Farm in north Whitby.

"We need something to set ourselves apart. It's all important to the area," Ms. Watson says.

The association helps with promotion and co-ordination of events.

"Our biggest job is identifying who we are and what we are," says Ms. Brown. "Next to Scarborough is Pickering. We're not looked at as a destination, but as a gateway" to

cottage country.

Corporations may look to Durham for accommodation if Toronto hotels are full or to save money. "It's helped with GO (Transit) going out to Oshawa."

One of the difficulties is the view Durham is divided into the urban south and rural north. "It's a real marketing challenge," Ms. Brown admits. Another challenge is "pushing Durham Region to Durham residents. It's unbelievable what Durham residents don't know about their own backyard. It's incredible. They don't know what's going on," she says. "The attitude is if it's near you, it's not worth it."

There are three wineries in Durham — in Scugog, Uxbridge and Clarington — with a fourth in Markham, but right on the Pickering border. "They're international award winners" that match up with wines from around the world.

"Most people don't know we had wineries. They'll go to Niagara for a winery tour," she notes.

Ms. Smith says Ocala gets about 10,000 tourists a year and they are "very important to us."

The winery is classified as a "tourist winery", and doesn't sell its products to the LCBO.

"We bring tourists to sell our

winery. Mainly, our winery is a small family-run business," she says, adding "There are a lot of big players out there."

"Because of our size, we're limited to the number of bottles we can produce. We keep it small and manageable."

They do some advertising locally, but also do some outside the area. TADR and Ms. Watson's department are "a tremendous help."

"The idea is to bring visitors into the region as a whole. We help each other out."

Ms. Smith adds, "The tour bus industry is a large part of our business. We go out to wine events, to expose people to our wines and hopefully they'll make the trip back to our winery."

Bus operators "work on trade shows with Patti," Ms. Brown adds.

"We go target the Toronto crowd. Forty-five minutes and they're out here."

Ms. Watson notes, "There's a significant business market, with General Motors and the industrial base in the region. We have people in offices who need places to stay."

Last year on the Canada Travel Web site, there were more than 1,000 inquiries about Durham, she adds.

Pope's arrival rekindles memories for Ajax man

Michal Fineczko has met 'greatest man we have on earth' on three separate occasions; plans to attend mass Sunday

AJAX — It's hard to see him now, bent and bowed by illness and age, but Michal Fineczko remembers Pope John Paul II when he was younger, robust and eager.

The Ajax resident has met the Pope on three different occasions and seen him about 12 times.

A refugee of communist Poland, Mr. Fineczko was in Italy in 1986 when he met the Pontiff for the first time.

"I have nice memories of Italy," Mr. Fineczko said. While there he met Miran Konoeka, a leader with Solidarity, the Polish union. He did some apartment renovations for Mr. Konoeka and was introduced to a priest, Konrad Drawacz, who arranged Mr. Fineczko's first meeting with the Pope.

On the day he met the Pope, "six people before me

was Lech Walesa," the Solidarity leader who went on to become the president of Poland.

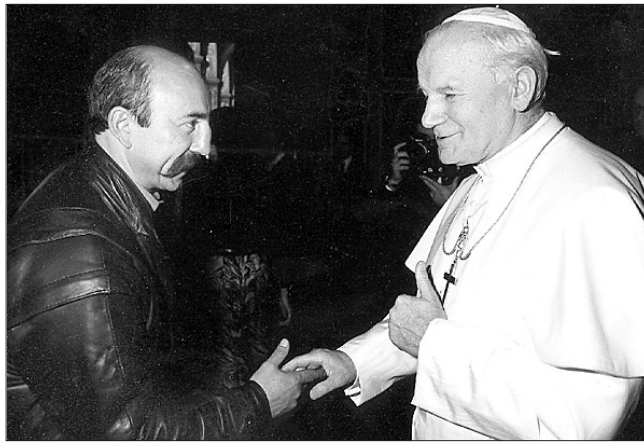
"I met him also," Mr. Fineczko said, adding, "I think I'm a modest guy. It's a very huge memory for me" to meet the Pope.

"The first meeting was unbelievable. In front and behind me, everyone almost had a tear in their eye," he noted, adding he met the pontiff twice in 1986 and again in 1987.

He praised the Pope's "warmness. It's unbelievable. He's always smiling. I think he's smiling when he's asleep.

"I feel so sorry, he's human, sick and old. He wanted to be in the best shape, but the body doesn't respond. Inside, I think it's very painful."

"He's the greatest man we have on earth. To understand

what he is, I swear to God, gift only a few people on Earth have."

Mr. Fineczko planned to

go see the Pope, who's in Toronto for World Youth Days, yesterday and Sunday for the large outdoor mass in Downsview.

Mr. Fineczko "escaped from Poland in 1986. You cannot get a visa for the West like you can today. The easiest way was to run away, to go to Italy."

When he first arrived in Italy, he was sent to a refugee camp with others who had escaped other communist countries. He was eventually moved to a hotel in Rome, "a place where you could live and survive."

While there, he and other refugees were offered the opportunity to pick the visa from one of three countries — Canada, the United States

and Australia.

"Of course, I chose Canada," he said.

After a year of waiting, he had an interview at the Canadian embassy. He arrived in Canada March 17, 1987. Two days after, a friend living in Ajax contacted Mr. Fineczko. Shortly after first coming to the community, he moved here.

His wife Urszula, son Jakob and daughter Julia arrived later in '87, "two days before Christmas. It was the happiest day of my life," Mr. Fineczko said.

Two-and-a-half years after arriving in Canada, Mr. Fineczko and his wife opened the Ajax European Delicatessen on Monarch Avenue, which remains open.

Vehicle emissions test about to clean more from your wallet

DURHAM — Green is not only the colour used to represent the environment; it also represents the money of a planned increase to emissions tests and repairs this fall.

Effective Oct. 1, the current maximum fee of \$30 per test will be raised to \$35 on Drive Clean vehicle emissions tests. The maximum re-test fee will rise from \$15 to \$17.50.

The ministry says none of the money will go into the government's wallet, but instead, will help fuel the eco-friendly engine

of the Drive Clean program. Results of new revenue, the ministry says, will include compensation to small businesses offering the tests, the government's computer monitoring systems, and an increase of on-road emission enforcers.

Many critics suggest they are wary of the Drive Clean program's proposed changes.

"It would take 25 years, 25 tests, seven days a week to pay for the machine," says Richard Alexander, an Oshawa auto and emissions testing centre employee. He says after the initial cost of the equipment (many small businesses have paid up to \$80,000 for equip-

ment), about \$5,000 to \$10,000 each year is spent on maintenance. "I'm all for a clean environment," he explains, "but (the ministry) is going the wrong way about it."

Mr. Alexander says he doesn't think the consumer should be the one to pay, especially when so many other factors are contributing to pollution from vehicles. He suggests a safety check, along with the emissions test, might be better. Leaking coolants and overheating engines are bad for the environment, he says, and although most cars pass the emissions test, the number of cars on the road that wouldn't pass safety tests is high.

A Drive Clean equipment auditor, visiting Durham to assure area test facilities were up to standard, had no comment on the subject of increased costs.

However, Ministry of Environment spokesman Charles Ross says the increase is necessary, and the costs should encourage drivers to take care of their car's exhaust systems. The Drive Clean program has been quite successful so far, he adds. It has had an 11.5 per cent reduction in smog-causing emissions from vehicles in the Greater Toronto Area since the program began in 1999. He says smog patrols will be intensified in the fu-

ture. To date, the smog patrol has conducted over 13,000 vehicle inspections in the province, and issued more than 2,200 tickets. The patrols are not restricted to a certain region, says Mr. Ross, and blitzes may take place in different areas with or without assistance from the Ontario Provincial Police or regional police. New revenues will allow the number of patrol staff to be raised from 20 to 30, the ministry says.

Museum village church has vintage look thanks to Pickering man

collections officer at the village, said Benjamin Moore would stain the pews for an authentic look. He noted a grant through a Benjamin Moore heritage funding program enabled the museum to fund the project.

"Some people on the board said it could be cheaper if we asked a manufacturer and we looked at what they had. They said they had this that was close and that that was close, but I said 'hold on a minute, we don't want it close'," he explained. "We had the original and we asked Bill to recreate it."

Although the old chapel's official dedication is planned for August, it has already been used for two weddings this summer. In fact, Mr. Marlowe said his

niece was married there.

He said everyone walking in the chapel takes a big sniff and smiles when they smell the old pine.

"They just love it," he added. Mr. Gosse noted his work with the museum doesn't end with the pews. He'll be back on the grounds redoing the floors of a few of the older buildings.

When asked if he could picture some future newspaper reporter and a carpenter walking around Pickering Museum Village 150 years from now looking at a piece of one of his pews being used as a template to make new replicas Mr. Gosse smiled.

"I guess they will be," he said. "Just like we are now."

PICKERING — The 1853 church at Pickering Museum Village reeks of old pine — the smell of history.

For the last year and a half, the museum and City have worked together restoring the building to its original state. Now that the structure is complete, some finishing touches are required inside the chapel. When some folks from the museum asked Bill Gosse to build some replica pews he was glad to oblige.

"When they asked me to do it I said 'I'll take a shot at it and do the best I can do'. I like doing it. I can't just sit around and watch TV," said the 72-year-old retired south Pickering resident and self-proclaimed jack of all trades and master of none. "If I could keep doing this till I was 150 I'd be OK. Then they can bury me."

Museum staff provided Mr. Gosse with a piece of an original pew and he went from there.

"Some of the wood I used is 100 years old. The newest is still 10 years old," he said. "Look, there are cracks in the wood, and knots. They add to the history, it's all a part of it."

Working a minimum of 10 hours a day for a recent period of 10 days, Mr. Gosse put together 15 replica pews with a bit of a modern twist — just to make them last a little longer.

"These old ones had square head nails, and you can see from all the holes how many times they had to put them back together," he said while turning a new pew over. "I used cleats, they're glued and screwed locking them together, but they're not visible, they're just to hold it together, you can't see it."

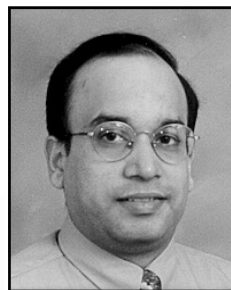

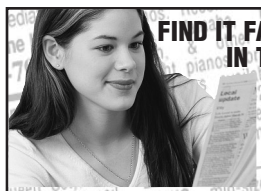

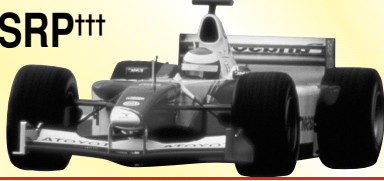
