There's still time to cool off

City's waterfront spray pool open until Sept. 16

PICKERING — Local youngsters can continue to get some relief from late-summer heat at Pickering's Millennium Square.

Until Sept. 16, the spray pool and washroom facilities will remain open at the foot of Liverpool Road. The facility was opened as part of the refurbished waterfront earlier this summer.

Wind turbine launch fizzles

Blades idle when switch flipped in Pickering, but are expected to turn anytime

PICKERING — An elaborate ceremony to mark the launch of a wind turbine in Pickering generated a lot of attention Wednesday, but not much else.

Hundreds of residents joined local, provincial and federal politicians in Alex Robertson Park Wednesday afternoon for a start-up ceremony for Ontario Power Generation's (OPG) windmill, the largest of its kind in North America.

But, there wasn't enough wind under the wings of the unit to spin the turbine into action, leaving the crowd of onlookers gazing at three stationary blades following a countdown as politicians threw the switch.

"We're still in the process of commissioning this unit. The controls for the blades have not yet been proven out," Graham

Brown, general manager of OPG's Evergreen Energy, told reporters following the event. "For security purposes the blades are in a stalled position...we would need a higher breeze today."

However, he assured the crowd the unit would be operational within the next two to three days.

The 226-tonne windmill, which stands 30-storeys tall and features three blades that are 39 metres in length, rotated 180 degrees to face the wind coming in off the shores of Lake Ontario following the countdown to the start up. But, that was the windmill's only movement.

"We only got power to it (Tuesday)," Mr. Brown told the crowd, adding, "You will start to see this unit spin (over the next few days)."

The blades on the windmill will spin at about 16 revolutions a minute. The turbine is expected to generate enough electricity to power 600 homes a year.

"The best part is all this electricity is totally clear and totally green with no emissions whatsoever," OPG chief operating offi-

Free ride marks first day of new transit service

Merged Ajax, Pickering bus service hits the road Sept. 4

DURHAM — Ajax and Pickering residents are invited to hop on board for a free ride Tuesday morning, as the Ajax Pickering Transit

Authority (APTA) celebrates its first official day of service.

"It has been a long time in the works, and it feels great to finally see our two transit systems fully merged and ready to enter an improvement phase," said APTA co-chairman and Pickering Regional Councillor Maurice Brenner. "I must commend staff and board members involved in a long and

complex process, for their hard work and dedication in helping us reach this day."

The merger of the two transit systems was formalized in March 2000 and an interim board of directors was formed this past January. Under the final merger agreement, the transit service will be managed by a board of management. The Town of Ajax will provide human

resources and payroll services to APTA and the City of Pickering will provide financial, accounting, auditing, budgeting, internal control and corporate legal services.

"When two neighbouring municipalities work as hard as Ajax and Pickering have to merge into one transit entity, not only do our customers benefit but it should also

Green light for new Hwy. 407 extension

Durham officials on hand for official opening Thursday

DURHAM — Yesterday's opening of the Hwy. 407 eastern extension into Durham was lauded as a boon for traffic congestion and the road to further economic prosperity.

"It's going to be a great economic benefit not only to the Province but to Durham Region," said Pickering-Ajax-Uxbridge MPP Janet Ecker, who, along with her fellow Durham MPPs, has been pushing for the extension of the toll road into the region in recent years.

"It's certainly going to help to transport goods and people in and out of the rest of the Greater Toronto Area," said Whitby Mayor Marcel Brunelle, who represented the Region of Durham at the event.

He noted Durham has witnessed "outstanding growth over the last few years" and said he hopes "the economic development will continue" as one of the spinoffs of the highway.

The 15-kilometre extension from Markham Road to just east of Brock Road in Pickering, was opened to motorists Thursday at about noon.

The toll road now spans 108 kilometres from Burlington in the west to Pickering.

"I'm delighted the 407 construction schedule continues to go so well," Ontario Transportation Minister Brad Clark said. "In only a few years (Hwy. 407) has established a position as one of the most important transportation corridors in Ontario."

He noted that approximately

300,000 people travel the highway each day.

"If the 407 didn't exist, think of the traffic that would be on (Hwy.) 401 and the QEW," the minister said. "There is no doubt the 407 is a world-class success story."

But, environmentalists who attended the opening ceremonies at the York/Durham line, maintain the highway is simply a route to urban sprawl that won't solve traffic gridlock.

"Expanded commuter highways will not solve our traffic problems, they will only make traffic and pollution worse," said Jim Robb of the Better Transportation Coalition.

He noted, "Suburban highways open up new areas for urban sprawl, allowing land developers and big construction companies to make windfall profits."

Mr. Robb maintained the govern-

ment needs to focus its investment in transit services rather than highways.

He also said the provincial government should add 10,000 acres of its publicly-owned land in Markham and Pickering to a regional green-space system that would protect the Duffins Creek watershed.

Meanwhile, members of the Whitevale and District Residents' Association are demanding interchanges planned for North Road and Sideline 24 be removed from ETR's plans. Both of the interchanges are currently slated to open in 2004.

But, association president Lloyd Thomas said Thursday there's simply no need for the highway to empty into the Hamlet of Whitevale, which has a population of about 250 people.

"Opening an interchange on North Road would dump copious amounts of traffic into a heritage village," he said.

cer, also named Graham Brown, told the crowd before the switch was thrown.

He reported the windmill is only the beginning of a \$50-million investment the company is making in its green energy program over the next four years.



Room for improvement in moraine report

Panel members must hear residents' strong points for revamped policy

If at first you don't succeed... listen to the public and try again. That's our advice to the advisory panel set up by the Province to tackle one of Ontario's biggest issues in recent years: how to manage the future of the Oak Ridges Moraine.

Uxbridge played host to what could be the most important environmental meeting in the history of the township Tuesday night when the advisory panel came to town for the first of four open houses and the only one to be held in Durham. For the most part it was clear residents, hailing from all over the region, felt the panel's first effort is in need of a lot of work.

First and foremost, the loopholes present in the panel's report, 'share your vision for the Oak Ridges Moraine', released earlier this month, have to be plugged up rock solid. As one community leader suggested, lawyers and developers have a way of driving bulldozers right through any loopholes they find.

The panel wisely recognized shortcomings in its initial report and promised at the meeting to take residents' concerns to heart when it releases its final report in the fall. The first report was formulated over the course of seven meetings in July.

"We knew as a group... we couldn't get it all right in that period of time," Ron Vrancart, the chairman of the 14-member stakeholder panel, said Tuesday night.

Expect the second, third and fourth verse to be much the same as the Uxbridge open house at the subsequent meetings scheduled in other regions over the coming weeks. And if it does hear a familiar message, the panel must be prepared to take all of the observations and complaints and incorporate them into its final report.

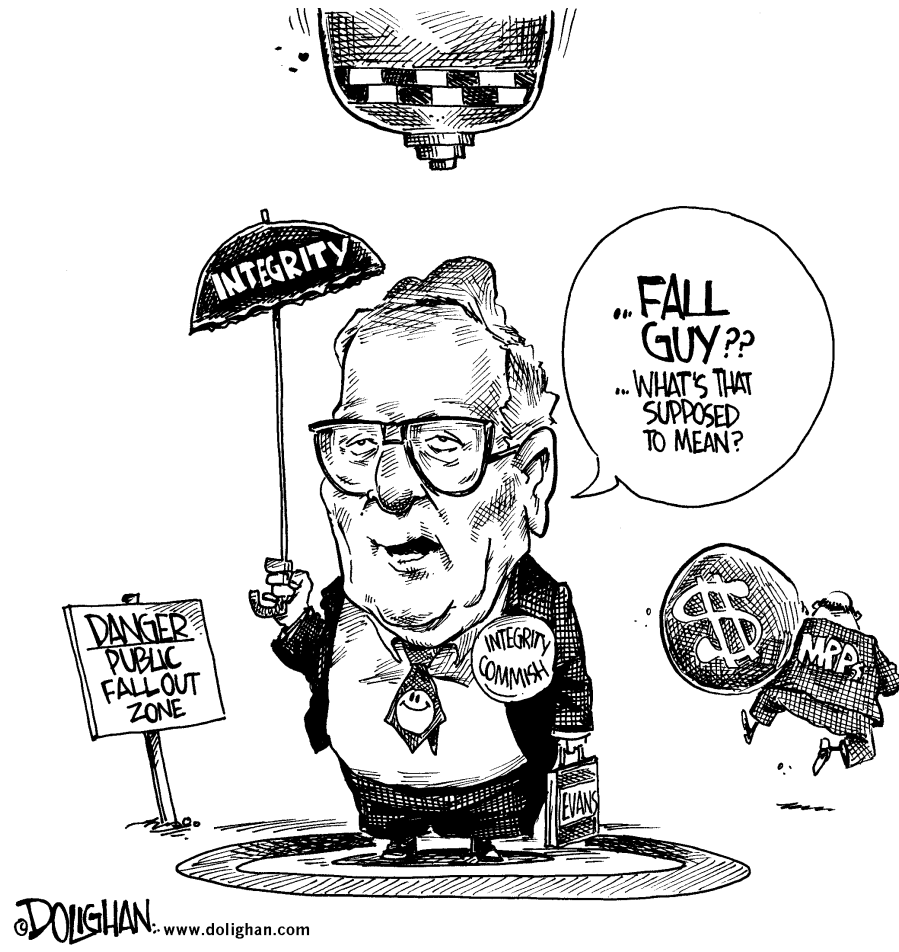
Residents' concerns were backed up by politicians like Uxbridge Mayor Gerri Lynn O'Connor, who spoke against allowing any more aggregate pits in Uxbridge.

And when experts from the Region like Alex Georgieff, Durham's commissioner of planning, points out areas that need work, the panel should listen.

Mr. Georgieff and his staff have recommended a clearer indication of how long the four proposed designations of restricted land use on the moraine will be in effect. It was a point that didn't get by residents like Citizen's Alliance of Uxbridge co-ordinator Wynn Walters either.

"The perspective on the moraine should be in terms of generations and not, as some will see it, in terms of election cycles," Mr. Walters said, earning a loud round of applause from the audience.

All excellent points to issues that will need to be heard and resolved by the panel.

Memories bubble back to surface after close call

Sweet, precious air! Terrifying scare in the pool a reminder of scary incident from years ago

I was fighting for air. Water was flooding my eyes and I couldn't see. My right heel hit concrete with a thud. The left calf scraped a wall. It can't be this far!

Clawing the face mask, and losing my precious air, I raised my head and hit the ledge above me. I started to yell and the chlorine poisoned my throat. A little further and my head broke free. I whipped off the mask and choked with gratitude. I can breathe. I made it! I am reborn!

This frightening episode brought me back to the past when, as a pre-teen, I nearly drowned.

It was in an outdoor pond in cottage country. The river ran under the county road. On one side was a wetland with signs posted saying 'No

swimming. Dangerous undertow'. On the other side of the road, the townsfolk had dammed up the river with a concrete wall that had a dam built in it so they could "open the flood gates" if necessary, to lower the water level in the pond. There was a sand beach on both sides. The water gradually deepened in the middle from either end.

I had taken swimming lessons at the dam in my hometown and felt pretty comfortable in the water. I got it in my head that I could walk through the water from one end to the other. No big deal you may say. But, I was carrying a boy who was several years younger and he was a non-swimmer.

The water started getting deeper and the sandy bottom became softer and not so stable under my toes and heels as I moved out with him.

I wobbled, the water was at my chest, and my passenger began to panic. He climbed upward on my back to my shoulders. I couldn't get my footing right away. My head and shoulders bent under the weight. The rest of me went under water.

I couldn't lift my head. I wanted to throw him off my shoulders or kick to get away, but he was already handling that department.

Bubbles. Dark. Murky. Can't see. Water went up my nose. I felt all prickly inside my forehead and water filled up all the empty space in my brain. Somehow I made it into the shallow end of the pond

Once I was free again, I shivered and shook and cried. I was so mad: at him, obviously, but mostly at me. I was so glad to be alive!

Today, I lived that terrifying event all over again. This time in a pool.

I admitted to my daughter, after an hour or so, that I had panicked a little bit. I just had had an extra passenger on my back, complete with baggage.

Durham ponders cost-sharing as Whitby moves to paper bag yard waste collection

But Region works committee wants more information before deciding

DURHAM — Regional staff has been directed to establish the guidelines for future cost-sharing agreements with municipalities on waste-management initiatives. Members of Durham's works committee voted Wednesday to direct staff to form a policy statement that would set the rules for financial agreements between the Region and municipalities that are embarking on new waste-management projects. The motion was passed

following a discussion on a new program being adopted in Whitby this fall. As of Oct. 1, Whitby residents will be required to use paper bags for their leaf and yard waste materials instead of clear plastic bags. The Town has requested financial assistance from the Region through reduced waste disposal fees for leaf and yard waste delivered to the compost site in paper bags.

Whitby also requested assistance from the Region for the purchase of the bags. "We should be partners," Whitby Mayor Marcel Brunelle said.

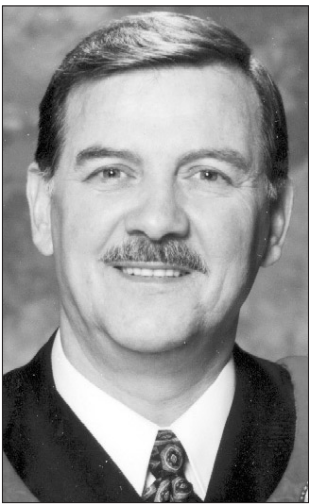
But, works commissioner Jack McCorkell said he's had no direction from coun-

cil on cost-sharing or with help in purchasing bags.

"I don't have approval to do it. My concern is if you approve it here and the rest of the Region implements paper bags, we're not just going to be paying for Whitby, but for the other seven municipalities (programs) as well," he said.

However, Mayor Brunelle noted the Whitby project is only one waste management initiative that's being looked at.

"This is not the end of the road of new things that are coming along," he said, adding he believes it's "reasonable" for the Region to share the costs for waste-diversion programs with its member municipalities.

CRTC Reviewing Rules for Local Telephone Service Prices

Regulatory rules regarding local telephone service prices are now under review by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) as part of Public Notice CRTC 2001-37 - **Price Cap Review and Related Issues**. As part of this process, Bell Canada has filed proposals with the CRTC that are intended to:

- Ensure that competition is maintained and encouraged in Canada's healthy, competitive telecommunications market;
- Encourage investment in the communications industry, ensuring continued innovation and leading-edge technology;
- Extend and improve local service in many remote areas; and
- Ensure prices for local service remain affordable.

Canadian Industry Facts

Today, Canadians benefit from a world-leading communications industry with some of the most advanced and lowest priced telephone services anywhere.

- Canadian prices for basic local service are lower than comparable services in other major industrialized countries.
- Long distance prices in Canada have fallen more than 40 per cent since the introduction of competition.
- Close to 99 per cent of Canadians have basic telephone service, a higher percentage than in the U.S.
- Canadians benefit from the world's lowest prices for Internet access (both dial-up and high-speed).

For many services, such as long distance, wireless and Internet access, Canada's low prices are a direct result of competition and clearly demonstrate the benefits of reliance on market forces.

Highlights of the Bell Proposal

While the prices for many services are subject to market forces alone, local telephone services, such as the basic connection to the home and office and payphone services, are subject to a number of regulatory rules. Bell's proposal, which would come into effect over a four-year period beginning in 2002, does not call for specific price changes for regulated services. Rather, it recommends a framework that would limit any local service price changes, subject to CRTC approval, based on the following:

- Monthly prices for basic local residential and business services in most areas could increase, on average, by no more than the annual rate of inflation;
- Monthly prices for basic service in rural and remote areas - where prices today are far below the cost of providing the service - could increase by no more than \$2.00 each year, to a maximum monthly charge of \$29.65 at the end of the four-year period;
- Ongoing monitoring of the effects of price increases on affordability would continue;

- Customers would receive rebates if CRTC-mandated quality of service indicators were not met; and
- The flexibility to increase prices of payphone service (affecting indoor payphones only, where the price could increase over the four-year period to 50 cents per call). Payphone prices have not changed since 1981.

And with our latest Service Improvement Plan, Bell is proposing to invest \$41 million to connect, over two years, more than 500 remote localities in Ontario and Quebec where basic local telephone service is currently unavailable.

Through gradual and moderate increases in basic residential service prices, service would remain affordable, while encouraging greater competition and innovation.

Initiated in March, 2001, the **Price Cap Review and Related Issues** proceeding follows up on key regulatory decisions that opened up Canada's telecommunications industry to competition in the 1990s.

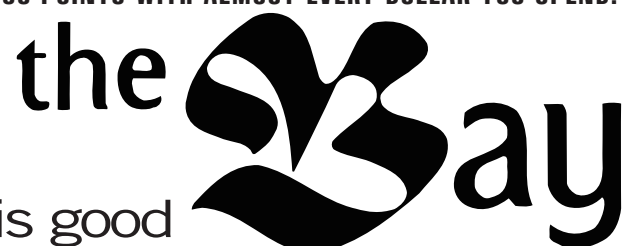

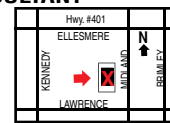

About ALS and ALS STATISTICS

ALS, or also known as Lou Gehrig's disease is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease that attacks the motor neurons making even the simplest movements - walking, speaking, swallowing - impossible. People with ALS are generally paralyzed in the later stages of the disease. In most cases however, the mind is unaffected. The disease was named for New York Yankees first baseman, Lou Gehrig, who played in a record 2,130 consecutive games before ALS forced a premature retirement in 1939. Lou Gehrig died in 1941.

ALS can strike anyone. It can hit at any time, regardless of age, sex or ethnic origin. The usual age of onset is 55-65, but people under 20 have been diagnosed. In at least ninety percent of cases, ALS strikes people with no family history of the disease. The cause is unknown and there is no known cure or treatment that prolongs life significantly - yet.

Between 1,500 and 2,000 Canadians currently live with ALS and ninety percent of people with ALS die within five years of diagnoses. However, some people live much longer. A person with ALS will require an average of \$127,000 in equipment. Nursing care can exceed ten times that amount.

Durham College gets \$1.4 million boost from Province

DURHAM — The Province has announced Durham College will receive over \$1.4 million in funding to improve the college.

The money will come from this year's \$140 million SuperBuild renewal initiative, designed to help Ontario colleges and universities renovate and otherwise improve their facilities.

"It's more than we usually get, it's double what we used to get so I'm very grateful to the minister (of training, colleges and universities), Dianne Cunningham, and the government," said Durham College president Gary Polonsky.

He said the college is "a 33-year-old shop, by and large" and experiences the same wear and tear as any similarly-aged facility.

Mr. Polonsky said the money would go towards roof repairs and sidewalk and curb improvements. The latter, he noted, will make it easier for students, especially those in wheelchairs.

"(The sidewalks) had begun to heave and crack so we want to make them safer," said Mr. Polonsky.

Some of the money will be spent on refurbishing classrooms to a hi-tech-friendly state. Mr. Polonsky said this is important, "especially in this age where our students rightly expect our classrooms to be outfitted with the latest e-ware."

"SuperBuild benefits many communities across Ontario," said Whitby-Ajax MPP Jim Flaherty,

responsible for the fund as minister of finance, in a press release. "It is gratifying for me as a Durham MPP to see some of these funds being put to good use at Durham College. It's good news for Durham College and good news for the students in our community."

Durham College has received over \$4.7 million in SuperBuild renewal initiative funding since 1999, Durham MPPs noted in the press release.

The college has also received \$60 million in capital funding from the Province, announced in this

year's budget, to create the Ontario Institute of Technology, Durham Region's first university.

Last year the Province gave the college \$28.75 million in SuperBuild funding that will result in four new academic buildings, slated to open in 2003.

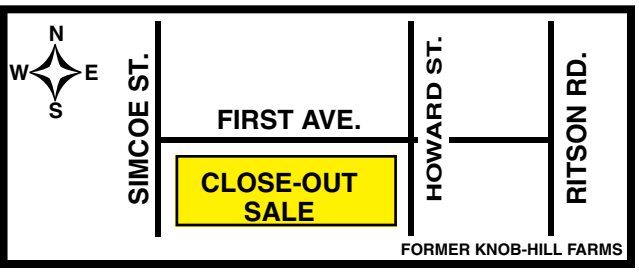

AJAX — Almost 50 years after he first started building and flying model aircraft as a young boy, Jim Moseley hasn't lost his boyish enthusiasm for the hobby — tempered, of course, with experience.

Mr. Moseley said 66 contestants were registered in the New York event, with most of them hailing from New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. The hobbyists generally all know one another, he said, and bring their spouses to competitions to enjoy the atmosphere.

It may not be for everyone, but once the hobby gets hold of you, "you stick with it for your life," said Mr. Moseley.



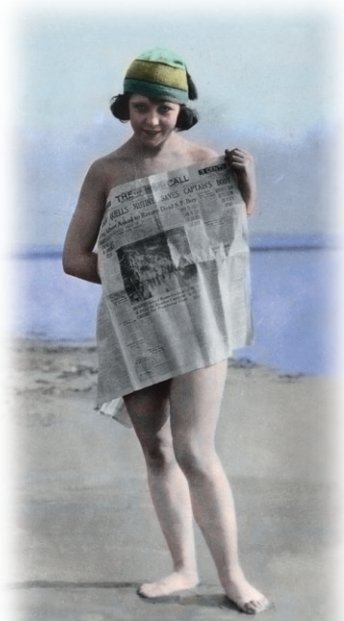
Jim Moseley shows off his free-flight model plane after winning honours.

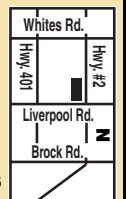

Durham orchestra hits high note

Trillium grant will help boost group's presence in communities across region

DURHAM — The Oshawa Durham Symphony Orchestra (ODSO) is expecting a lot more people will soon be facing the music, thanks to a \$175,000 boost.

The orchestra recently received the funding from the Trillium Foundation to help with growth and expansion over the next three years.

"One of the biggest problems is many people in the area don't know the orchestra exists or the quality of it," said Tim Slocombe,

executive director of the orchestra.

The \$175,000 will be used to advertise orchestra events and activities and allow it to move from its current 400-seat home at the Salvation Army Temple on Thornton Road, to the 1,000-seat Calvary Baptist Church auditorium on Rossland Road East in Oshawa.

"Those extra 600 seats will require a focused and strenuous promotion campaign," said Mr. Slocombe.

Bill Swan, chairman of the ODSO board of directors, agreed it's important to expand the orchestra's presence.

"Our first aim is to make sure everyone knows the orchestra exists," said Mr. Swan. "The next will be to bring people to hear the orchestra. Once people hear the orchestra play, they are impressed

and return."

The City of Oshawa recently proclaimed Sept. 23 to 29 as 'Oshawa Durham Symphony Week', which leads into its first concert of the season, Sept. 29. A display at the Oshawa Centre Sept. 28 and 29 will also highlight the orchestra.

Mr. Slocombe said one of the biggest reasons the orchestra has evolved so much is its current conductor, Marco Parisotto. The 38-year-old is about to start his sixth season with ODSO and was also named principal conductor and artistic advisor of the Shanghai Symphony Orchestra last year.

"Here we have a first-class conductor and one of the best regional orchestras and we're playing for small audiences and they (many residents) don't know about us," said Mr. Swan.

Mr. Slocombe agreed Mr.

Parisotto has had a big impact on ODSO.

"He has transformed this orchestra into one of the best in Canada that's not professional," he said. "We're hoping to make it one of the top regional symphonies in Canada and we're pretty close to being there."

Following the season-opening concert, the orchestra has shows Dec. 1, Jan. 19, March 9, and April 20, all at Calvary Baptist Church. There is also a special concert with guest conductor Howard Cable and the Mantini Sisters May 11 at Carruther's Creek Community Centre in Ajax. Tickets are \$25 for adults and \$10 for children and full-time students.

YOU MUST MAKE A FORTUNE HERE WHY DO YOU CHARGE FOR EXTRAS?

This is a common perception. Just last year a customer asked for more strawberry on their Banana Split and was told that there was an extra charge and he said he wouldn't be back.

All of the DQ's in Canada are individually owned. This customer said he'd always gotten extras for nothing at other places. This dilemma has plagued the franchise business for years. Consistency. If we tell our staff to give one free scoop someone will want two, if we say two free scoops someone will want three. Confusion would rein and we would be out of business.

Our solution. First we prepare our products strictly to DQ standards. The amount of product when done to these standards is very generous.

What about those who like extra product. No problem! Every extra is charged for. From 39 cents to 50 cents you get a uniform upgrade and it's the same for everybody. That's peanuts. That way we keep our prices low for the majority and for a small charge the less than 1 in 10 can have extra. And it's consistent for all! Area golfer off to good start at prestigious junior tourney

Futurelinks championships wrap up today

AJAX — Golfers from Orangeville and Stouffville sat atop the leaderboard in their respective divisions after the first round of the American Junior Golf Association Futurelinks Junior Championships.

Ninety-nine of the top junior-aged players from across North America are playing the prestigious event at Deer Creek Golf Club. U.S. collegiate coaches use the event to scout top talent for their programs.

"It's a great chance for kids to showcase their talents," said Stuart Brindle, director of golf at Deer Creek. "And it gives (U.S.) college coaches a chance to see who the good kids are. It's an excellent vehicle to get a scholarship."

Brad Moulton, of Orangeville, fired a three-under-par 68 Wednesday to take the lead in the boys' category after the first of the three-round tournament.

Meanwhile, Seema Sadekar, of Stouffville, scored a three-over-par 74 to lead the girls' bracket.

Moulton set the tone early with a birdie on the first hole and a par with a difficult 209-yard, par 3 second hole.

"That's always a good start," said Moulton. "Getting the par on number 2 was good because that's a tough hole."

The 17-year-old continued to make par until he added another birdie on number 7 to move to two-under on the front side. Moulton negated a bogey on number 12 with two birdies on the back nine, including one on the 531-yard, par-five 18th hole to secure a three-shot lead heading into the second round.

Daniel Kreindler of Danville, California is three shots back at 71. Justin Bratkovich of Hamilton, Andrew Parr of London, Andrew Gallo of Thornhill and Jesse Dixon of Ann Arbor, Michigan are tied in third place with a one-over-par 72.

Axle Riley, of Ajax, is one of five golfers tied for sixth-place with an

opening-round 75.

In the girls' division, Sadekar saved par on 15 of 18 holes and rolled in a 15-foot birdie putt on the 356-yard, par-four 11th hole.

The second round was completed Thursday afternoon, after the News Advertiser's press deadline.

The 54-hole championships conclude Friday.

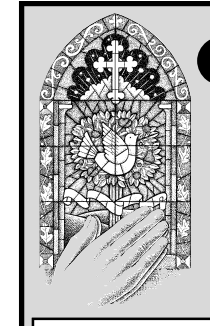

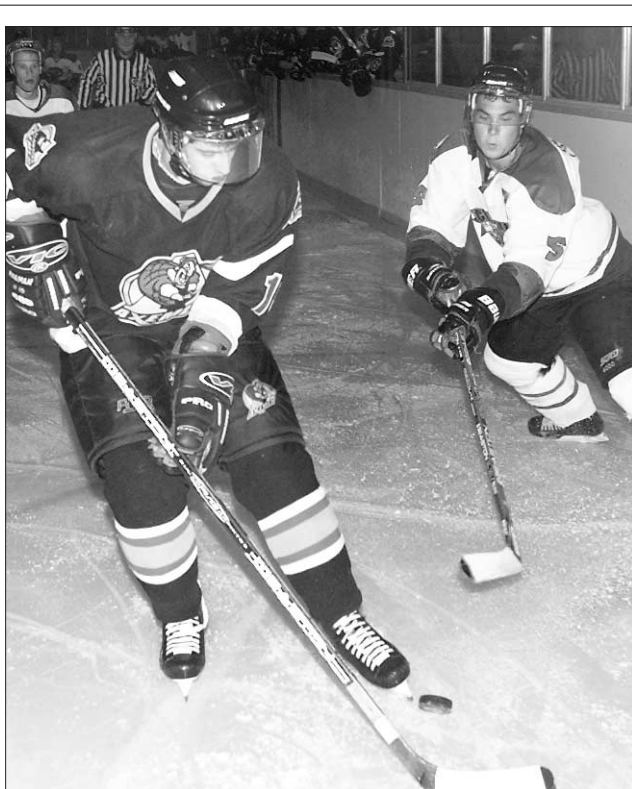
