Region delivers \$2.7-million 'surprise'

New parking woes; Durham could outgrow new home by 2007

DURHAM — An additional \$2.7 million is needed to expand the new garage at regional headquarters if there's going to be enough parking — and that doesn't include additional spots that will be needed as staff grow out of the new building by 2007.

"What more can be added onto this project?" asked Ajax Councillor Scott Crawford, adding that he gets the increased costs of the new headquarters constantly thrown in his face. "Are there any more surprises?"

The news comes as the Province announced it now wants the court to occupy and lease the entire existing regional headquarters after staff move out. And that means parking

spots that would have been revealed if portions of the building were torn down will remain covered.

Further parking strain comes from increased provincial court staff members who will be in the building, a report to Wednesday's joint finance and administration and works committee meeting said.

The Region has already approved a \$14.5-million parking garage that will provide 806 spots. Combined with surface parking, 1,436 spots will be available by the end of August. But increased court staff, visiting regional staff, the public and busy jury days mean a minimum 1,630 parking spaces are needed.

So staff are recommending completing a fifth floor on the garage, which will add 177 spaces and cost \$15,400 per spot, the report said. That would bring the total garage cost to \$17.2 million.

Staff are also looking at a temporary lot across the road from head-

No room for the inn proposed in Pickering

Council doesn't believe plan has right location in mind

PICKERING — They didn't agree with their reasons, but Pickering councillors did agree with area residents that a four-storey hotel doesn't belong in the Dunbarton area.

Citing traffic, transients and trains as reasons why the application should not be approved, about a dozen concerned residents were on hand for Monday's executive committee meeting.

"One of the main issues that was brought about the proposed hotel is the possibility of it turning into some sort of flop house," said resident Joe Murray, who first attended a public meeting on the application last June.

The original submission was

for a five-storey, 34-unit all-suites hotel with full kitchens to be located on Sheppard Avenue at Merritton Road. This triggered concerns from the community that the building would become home to longer-term tenants. The reworked submission brought to executive committee (made up of members of council) was for a four-storey, 37-unit building with a bar fridge, sink

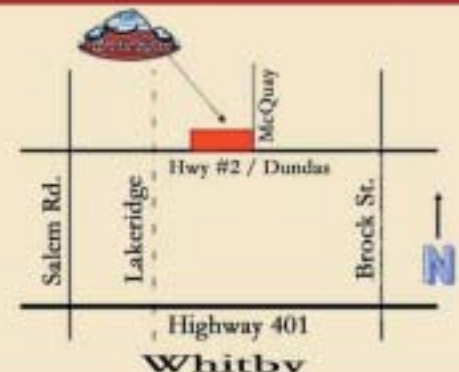

OPG refurbishing refurbishment after tube problems discovered

PICKERING — Although work to refurbish a reactor at the Pickering nuclear station was over-budget and behind schedule, Ontario Power Generation workers have had to go back and correct a potential defect.

John Coleby, site vice-president of Pickering 'A', said feeder tubes on Unit 4 are being inspected, tested and replaced because of thinning metal.

The problem was found when the feeder tubes for Unit 1, which are undergoing a refurbishment, were tested and found to be thin.

Speaking to the Community Advisory Committee on Tuesday, Mr. Coleby said the company decided to go back and check the tubes on Unit 4.

The reactor was shutdown April 2 "as a result of what we found on Unit 1. Improvements are underway," he

stated.

Feeder tubes carry hot, pressurized water from the reactor to the steam generators, or boilers. Steam from the hot water turns the turbines, which creates electricity.

If the tubes hadn't been checked, small pinholes would have been created. "We would quickly detect that and shutdown the plant," he said.

CAC member Liz Oliver questioned why the feeder tubes for Unit 4 needed to be checked, considering the amount of work done to the reactor prior to it being restarted.

Mr. Coleby said inspections were done "around critical elbows" in the tubes on Unit 4.

"It was all done and completed successfully. We did the same on Unit 1 and found some areas were thin," he stated. "We took what was a conservative decision" to

shutdown Unit 4 to inspect the tubes.

The tubes were sent to laboratories and technicians "found areas thinner than they were expected to be.

"These things are continually evolving. So far, everything looks OK," he added.

The refurbishing work on

Unit 1 is 92 per cent complete. Testing on nuclear components is underway as the unit moves closer to returning to service.

"We're in the process of slowly completing all the construction-type work and laying off construction workers. More and more, we're

turning the work over to OPG workers," Mr. Coleby said.

On the 'B' side, Unit 5 is in the middle of a planned 120-day outage.

Mr. Coleby noted the company's financial picture "is significantly better than 2003."

In March, OPG announced a profit of \$42 million for 2004, compared to a loss of \$491 million in 2003.

Much of the loss in 2003 was due to the provincial government's decision to

close the coal-fired plants in 2007 and "obviously we need to reflect that in our financial statements," he said.

The company's financial picture should look brighter in the future, OPG reports, as it won't have to pay back rebates to customers. In 2004, the rebates cost OPG \$1.15 billion and over the life of the rebate program, the company had to pay back \$3.5 billion. "It will have a significant effect on our bottom line," he said.

and toaster oven or microwave in each room. Mr. Murray still had concerns.

"I'm not convinced the long-term housing issue has been successfully dealt with," he said.

Scott Currie, who had previously expressed his opposition to the project, also spoke at the meeting.

"That would definitely concern me that this type of facility is being geared towards longer-term stays that we see in Scarborough on Kingston Road, refugees and

such," he said. "Certainly, I don't think that's appropriate for the Dunbarton neighbourhood."

Several speakers also said the location was bad because it was close to a rail line.

"If I was renting a room in this building I'd ask for my money back because there is no way you'd get any sleep," said Vern Bruce.

Residents also expressed concern with the size of the lot and that the area isn't right for the application because it lacks the

amenities normally associated with a hotel, such as restaurants and shops.

Although not in support of the application, Ward 2 City Councillor Doug Dickerson expressed his disagreement with the speakers.

"I don't believe we can dictate whether someone can stay for a week or a day. Call them transients or whatnot, I call them human beings," he said, a tinge of anger in his voice.

Coun. Dickerson said his big-

gest issue was the size of the lot.

"What are the valid reasons for not wanting it there? The valid reasons are twofold: one, the over-development of the site and the parking issue," he said. "I'm not going to support this tonight. It's the right idea in the wrong spot."

Ward 1 Regional Councillor Maurice Brenner acknowledged Pickering needs another hotel, but not there.

"We'd be shooting ourselves in the head to put this on this site

when our goal is to intensify our downtown core," he said.

Other councillors did express the same concerns raised by residents.

"It's being sold to council as a hotel when the intent is for longer-term tenants," said Ward 3 City Councillor David Pickles.

No one spoke on behalf of the numbered company that made the application. No member of committee supported the application.

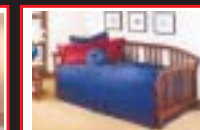

quarters, where police who work in the courts and some Crown attorneys maintain offices, said Glenn Kippen, director of support services. That could add an extra 130 spaces.

It's the third time additional costs have been added to the new headquarters at

Rossland Road and Garden Street in north Whitby. After council guaranteed Durham residents that the building would not exceed \$67.7 million, a \$1.9-million new phone system was added, along with the \$14.5-million parking garage, and now the addition onto the garage, for a grand total of \$86.8 million.

The move received a tie

vote at committee, and therefore lost, but will now go to council on May 4 to be debated.

Regional Chairman Roger Anderson insisted that the \$1.5 million the Province contributed to the new garage, plus the \$3.6 million to \$4.8 million in lease revenue from the courts remaining in the existing building (depending on how long they stay) are offsetting the cost of the garage.

Adding the spots on now, while all the equipment and

construction workers are in place, will save the Region almost \$500,000, the report said.

Some councillors don't buy it. Spending almost \$3 million to accommodate the extra staff for three or four years until a new Durham courthouse is built and the existing building is torn down to reveal more parking spots is

an overly costly short-term proposition they said.

"I see this certainly as something that was overlooked," said Clarington Councillor Charlie Trim.

Mr. Anderson maintained that the \$2.7 million would be "no tax increase, no tax impact to the residents of Durham."

But those funds — and

those used on all the other additions to the new building and garage — are coming from "raiding other regional accounts" of money that could have been used elsewhere, said Oshawa Coun. Brian Nicholson.

Even if the additional spots are built, it's not the last of the Region's parking woes: The new headquarters will be at maximum capacity by 2007.

That means the new headquarters will have to be expanded to accommodate any more people.

Land deal falls through

DURHAM — Land that could have prevented some of the parking fiasco in the first place is now available.

When the \$14.5-million parking garage was first being debated, staff proposed spending only \$3.7 million on a temporary lot across the road from headquarters on land owned by the police and Province.

But Whitby Mayor Marcel Brunelle said a "world-class established business" wanted to build office towers there,

and that his council would not approve any site plans for parking. Now, the mayor said, the deal has fallen through.

"I talked to the regional chairman about getting development there and he said no," Mayor Brunelle said. "Those people have decided to go elsewhere."

Regional Chairman Roger Anderson denied the statement, saying he only said it would be very hard to get the police and Crown attorney off the property.

What a difference a day made. Thanks.

Tower, bridge would bring financial boom

The sky could be the limit where the Pickering city core is concerned.

The downtown core has received plenty of attention the past few years, with the latest bit of vision unveiled recently amidst a tower of optimism. Pickering's corporate promotions and economic development office has gone public with a proposed 20-storey high office tower for the southwest parking lot at the Pickering Town Centre.

Offering more than 200,000 square feet of space, the concept is no doubt a long way from reality, but taken with a number of other projects, it could be an important piece of an economic boom for the city.

Pickering has found itself in a tough spot the past few years, given the lack of developable land available to it as compared to other municipalities in Durham. Which, of course, means the tax base upon which to draw City revenues will remain virtually stagnant until the Seaton community eventually takes shape.

Hence the City's focus these past few years on intensification in the core area.

Already that has paid off with the new office building to the east of the town centre and some infilling of new residential units all around that area.

The final and probably most important link in the whole puzzle, however, is the proposed pedestrian bridge over Hwy. 401 from the Pickering GO station to either the proposed office tower or to the town centre parking lot.

Councillors recently added \$300,000 for the bridge to the budget and if they can find the necessary private partnership to go with provincial funding, it could bring untold economic benefits to Pickering.

It will turn upside down the old standard of Pickering residents commuting to Toronto each day. With a fixed link over the highway, Toronto residents (for that matter, those in the east end of Durham too) could hop off the GO, skip across the highway and be at their desk without fighting crowds, traffic or any other morning hassles. It will also certainly bring more foot traffic to the area for shopping, dining and any of the many cultural events held each year around the civic centre.

Pickering has much to gain by developing a strong downtown core area. It will bring more dollars to the tax base, boost the local economy and allow Pickering residents to live and work here at home.

Residents have one last chance

Speak before Pickering budget is passed Monday

For municipal taxpayers in Pickering, Monday is one of the most important days of the year.

It's when council passes the 2005 budget and decides how much taxes are going to be, as well as what projects are going to be funded.

How much do residents want to pay? What services do they want the City to offer? What capital projects do they want done this year? Time is running out to let council know.

In the draft budget released a month ago, staff recommended a 6.7-per cent increase, which would have meant a \$60 increase on the City portion of tax bills. Council wants that decreased to 5.5 per cent and on Monday we find out if that was achieved and at what cost.

Did staff decide to fund more of the capital projects through debt financing? Did road repair work in the north get deferred for yet another year? Is the City going to use a chunk of the \$2.5 million it received as part of a legal settlement to remove agricultural easements from some properties in the agricultural preserve?

The last option was the one advocated by many councillors to not only lower the tax increase, but also to pay for a wish list of additional projects. Projects such as \$300,000 for design work on a proposed pedestrian bridge over Hwy. 401. The design and construction is expected to cost \$3 million, with the City already having received a \$1 million grant from the provincial government.

Ward 1 Regional Councillor Maurice Brenner has been advocating for the proj-

ect for years and said the money is needed to get the project moving and spur intensification in the downtown core, such as an office tower the City recently began marketing.

But the decision on whether the bridge gets the money isn't a done deal yet. Residents can still let their councillors know if they want the equivalent of about a one per cent tax hike going to help fund the project.

Residents can also let council know if they want half of the easement settlement spent all at once or if it should be spread over several years or kept for a specific project.

Council makes the final decisions Monday night but they make them based on what they have heard from residents and what they feel are the best decisions for Pickering and its citizens.

It's too late to complain Tuesday — Monday is your last chance.

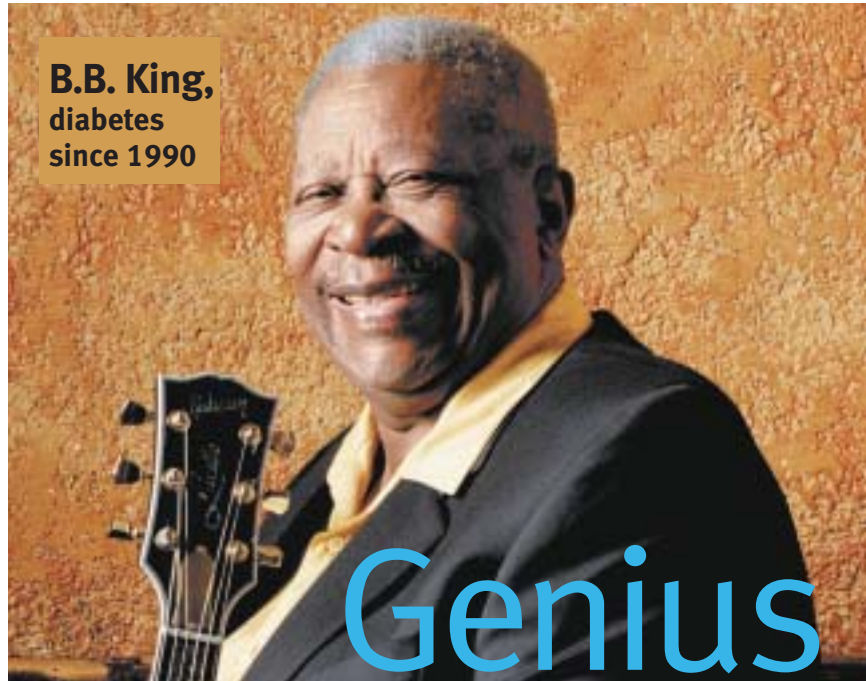

Smoke-free Ontario advocates bring fight to Durham

Local hearing one of only four in the province

DURHAM — Supporters of the Province's proposed smoking ban flocked to Oshawa last Friday to voice their opinions at one of four public hearings on the controversial legislation.

Members of the Economic and Finance Committee, including Durham MPP John O'Toole, heard from high school students, business owners, health-care providers and lobby groups over the course of the six-hour meeting, with the majority speaking out in favour of the Smoke Free Ontario Act.

If passed, the act would prohibit smoking in all Ontario workplaces and public places, including bars, restaurants, casinos and legion halls. Advocates are also pushing for a ban on the "powerwall" tobacco displays found at most convenience stores.

"Tobacco products featured alongside candy and snack foods create the impression that smoking is socially acceptable," said Carolyn MacDonald, speaking on behalf of the Durham Lives! Council for a Smoke Free Durham Region. "There is also evidence available to show that tobacco advertising and promotion does actually increase tobacco use."

As well as addressing the advertising issue, members of the local council are hopeful that province-wide legislation will close some of the gaps in Durham's bylaw, such as exemptions for long-term-care facilities, bingo halls, casinos and legion halls.

In a letter submitted at the hearing, Don Vipond, president of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 152, in Brooklin, dismissed concerns from those who say legions should be exempt from the ban, citing the success of a total smoking ban implemented at his branch last June.

"It's worked out great for us.... our revenue is up, we have members who left com-

ing back, we have spouses coming in that wouldn't come in before," he said. "There are always a few objections to these things, but people get used to it. The government should go ahead with the legislation."

While all presenters agreed on the need for some kind of legislation, many had amendments to offer.

Douglas Needham, president Canadian Restaurant and Foodservices Association (CRFA), which represents hundreds of local members, stressed that those business owners who have already built designated smoking rooms to comply with municipal bylaws, should be allowed to keep them until 2010.

He also asked that government-sponsored

smoking cessation programs be given more time to take hold.

"There is still 20 per cent of the Canadian adult population that smokes, and a higher proportion of them are the clientele found in bars, pubs and taverns," he said. "The industry is in a terrible slump right now.... It would make more sense to reduce the number of smokers before we implement legislation like this."

The committee held four public hearings on the proposed legislation this month: two in Toronto, one in Oshawa and one in Tillsonburg. Written submissions are still being accepted until Friday, April 29. Visit www.ontla.on.ca for more information.

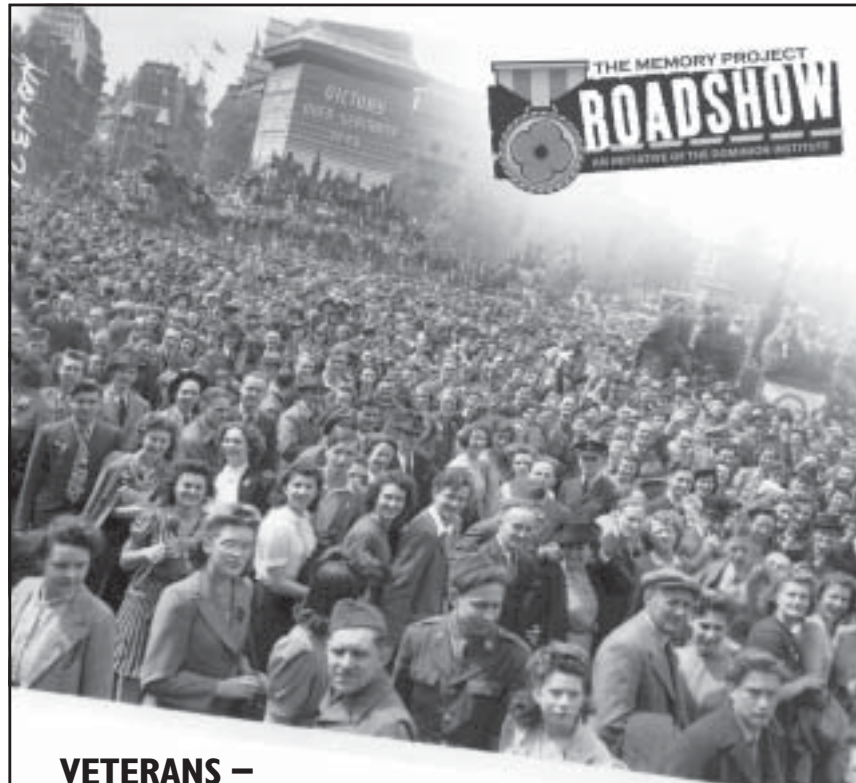



Durham Region Health Department will launch their 1st ever meningitis C community vaccination campaign on May 7th, 2005. Grade 7 students and youth aged 15-19 years who are born between 1985 and 1990, will have the opportunity to receive the newly funded meningococcal C-conjugate vaccine (men C).

The Health Department will be holding meningitis C community vaccination clinics across the Region to offer the vaccine to eligible youth who were not able to receive the vaccine at a school clinic. These clinics will be held on:

Saturday May 14th
 at Pickering Town Centre from 10am-4pm

Eligible youth who are unable to attend any of the community clinics can also receive the free men C vaccine from a family doctor or medical clinic.

Meningococcal C disease is uncommon, but can cause meningitis or a severe blood infection which can rapidly lead to death. The bacteria are spread by the sharing of saliva. Youth are at higher risk of being infected because they share more food, drinks, cigarettes, lipstick and kisses.

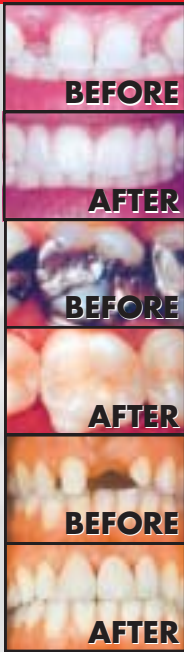

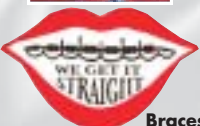

UOIT, college budgets rely on variables

Higher enrolment, provincial dollars needed to balance

DURHAM — Durham's post-secondary institutions are counting on more provincial funding and higher enrollment to produce balanced budgets for the coming year.

The Durham College and University of Ontario Institute of Technology boards of governors approved the 2005/06 budgets at a recent meeting in Oshawa. However both will come back to the boards to formulate a Plan B if the university does not receive \$5.5 million and the college \$1.8 million from the government in transition and Rae review funding, as the budgets assume. In addition, to help eliminate a projected \$3.26 million DC deficit, The PIC Group, DC's quality-training company, will have to kick in \$2 million.

"The (UOIT) budget as presented here is balanced if, and only if, there is transition money," Sheldon Levy, vice-president of finance and strategy, told the board.

However, the university budget also hinges on an enrolment estimate of 2,841 full-time-equivalent students next year and \$1 million resulting from Bob Rae's review of the post-secondary system. UOIT officials believe the latter is a lock, since it assumes the upcoming provincial budget will provide 25 per cent of the Rae funding recommendations.

Officials acknowledge that the enrolment estimate is a bit optimistic. In making its case to the Province for more transition funding, next year's UOIT student estimate has already been lowered by about 250 students since last July. Lower student numbers would create a multimillion-dollar shortfall due to reduced grants and tuition revenue.

"It's not a big stretch; it's at the ambitious end of the range we expected," Richard Levin, vice-president of strategic enrolment management, said in an interview, noting that UOIT's population is growing at 10 times the rate of the rest of the university system.

The budget offers an option for the board if the \$4.5 million in transition funding isn't forthcoming, suggesting the money could be borrowed from the capital funds set aside to complete the engineering building. If that were to occur, the budget document states academic areas would receive less funding than required in 2006/07, resulting in "radical changes to course delivery."

However, that's a worst-case scenario and Mr. Levy said even if it played out, there would be no impact on finishing the engineering building.

"It would have no effect because right now we have the funding for the engineering building but you're not going to use it all right now," he said in an interview.

He stressed that the board of governors would have the final say on the course of action.

Mr. Levy told the board Premier Dalton McGuinty recently indicated the Province will present a "post-

secondary budget", expected next month, that would see the facilities receive much more than the conservative amounts the budgets forecast.

Terry Caputo, director, financial services, at the meeting said the PIC contribution to the DC budget "bridges the gap of what we are funded and what we should be funded."

In last year's provincial funding, DC's balanced budget was actually a hindrance, officials said, as colleges with a deficit received a larger funding share. The boards unanimously approved the budgets, with the understanding that both will come back for approval if the assumptions don't play out.

Affordable housing does make a difference

However, demand far outweighs supply

DURHAM — Ian McKenzie's weathered face reflects off the greasy glass table where he sits.

At 55, his rail-thin body shows a lifetime of struggles. But it is here in a filthy but tidy one-bedroom apartment on Bloor Street East in south Oshawa that Mr. McKenzie finds security, safety and stability.

This is home for him.

Mr. McKenzie can't handle large groups of people, and has held more than 100 jobs in his life. He used to be married. He doesn't see his two children, 26 and 23, anymore.

"I used to be a proud man," he said. "But it's kind of disappeared."

He's been through the shelter system, and lived in rooming houses where he'd come home from work and find all of his possessions stolen. He's lived on the street, too, keeping out of sight at night to avoid getting beaten up. But he prides himself on having never been arrested or done drugs.

Now, living on disability support and receiving help from the Canadian Mental Health Association, he ekes out a meagre but seemingly happy life with his two cats, Buddy and Storm. They, and once-a-month treats such as ribs or hamburger, and reading seven books a week, keep him sane, he says.

Mr. McKenzie is just one of thousands in Durham living in subsidized housing. But, as many as there are who have roofs over their heads, there are more on a huge waiting list, and it can be years be-

fore an affordable home becomes available.

"We have not built housing for people on fixed incomes in 10 years," said Ed Goerz, executive director of Cornerstone Community Association, which provides support and housing services to the homeless and those out of prison. "The private sector really cannot make a profit — there's no return on investment."

There are 6,374 subsidized units in the region, plus some run through private landlords. The Region of Durham owns and manages 1,276, with the rest owned by non-profit organizations and co-operatives that receive funding from the Region, said Shirley Van Steen, director of housing services.

The units are a mix of low- and high-rise apartments and townhouses, and people from diverse backgrounds live in them, she added. Social housing was made a local responsibility by the provincial Conservatives in the late 1990s. In 2004, it cost the Region around \$31.7 million to run the program, and will cost \$32.1 million in 2005.

And, what the Region received when housing was downloaded was not pretty — or cheap.

"The Province turned over a portfolio that has a severe underfunding in capital reserves," Ms. Van Steen said, adding that more than \$100 million is going to be needed for repairs to buildings in the near future. "This is an emerging issue the Province hasn't dealt with in any meaningful way.

"We've heard absolutely nothing from them. It's kind of a code of silence."

While serving the existing stock is one issue, new buildings are also

desperately needed; there are 4,000 households waiting for housing in Durham, 200 of those being victims of family violence.

"If everyone moved out of those units today, we still wouldn't be able to house all those on our waiting list," Mr. Goerz said, calling the situation a crisis.

And, as people toil away while on

a waiting list, they live in substandard housing, or housing that's too expensive. They couch surf with friends and family. Some run out of options and end up on the street, where their situations can quickly deteriorate.

There are emergency shelters and motel programs, and organizations that help with rent arrears and utility bills in the winter months, but these are considered short-term, band-aid solutions to the real issue of not having enough units, officials say. Housing was a big election issue and budget promise of the federal Liberals, but nothing has been announced yet. The Liberals did announce recently that \$150 million in what was once allotted to affordable housing will now be used as rent supplements, but the Province has to match the funds — and it hasn't yet.

"It's not just people who are on social assistance — they're on pensions or making minimum wage," said Susan Hanley, manager of housing operations for the Durham Non-Profit Housing Corporation. "If they had a half-decent place to live that they can afford, then the sky's the limit."

Spending a good part of her childhood in subsidized housing changed the life of Rhonda Jessup.

When she was seven, Ms. Jessup's parents divorced, suddenly leaving her stay-at-home mom in need of a job to support two young children. Working as a waitress brought in funds, but it was not a "living wage," Ms. Jessup said.

She remembers the day when the family found out they got into subsidized housing near downtown Oshawa. Her mom got off the phone, jumped up and yelled, "We

got it!"

"Without that, we really would have been in some tiny place, some roach-infested place, or we would have had to move around a lot," said Ms. Jessup, now the public services manager at the Whitby Public Library.

She's always been grateful for living in a place with market rent units as well — nobody except immediate family knew they were in subsidized housing and it really helped with the prejudice.

"Low rent doesn't mean criminal," Ms. Jessup said. "Especially if you're a child and you hear all the time that it's a self-fulfilling prophecy."

Sara Belfour calls her subsidized unit on Ritson Road in south Oshawa a lifesaver.

Six months pregnant with twins, she, her husband and young daughter were flooded out of their Oakville basement apartment in 2000. Left with no insurance and no belongings, the family was forced to move in with her husband's family in Oshawa and luckily got into their rent-geared-to-income townhouse shortly afterward.

"We didn't have any savings to begin with. We were living paycheque to paycheque," she said. They gave themselves five years to get back on their feet, and are planning to move out by the end of the year.

They've dug themselves out of debt, are about to finish school and have secured new jobs, all while taking part in community programs such as preschool, reading groups and summer camps.

"You do what you have to do to get by and survive," she said.

How safe is your garage door opener?

When was the last time you performed a routine preventive maintenance on your garage door opener? Although your garage door opener is a great convenience and works well, almost all home owners take it for granted and overlook a monthly maintenance check. Neglecting regular maintenance of your garage door opener could potentially cause severe injury to family members. Dan Hill from Autograph Door Systems brought this very interesting fact to our attention: According to a recent US survey, 45 per cent of homeowners who have a garage use the garage door as the primary point of entry into their home. In addition, a separate survey indicates that 71 per cent use their garage door openers (GDO's) to enter their homes. This seems like enough evidence to convince anyone about the importance of regular maintenance for their garage doors and openers. An important thing to remember is that a GDO can easily raise a 150 to 200 lbs. (65 to 90 kg.) residential door. Therefore, when a door reverses as it is closing, does it not seem logical that the door opening mechanism be in top notch shape? Listed are routine preventive maintenance tips from Dan Hill:



- 1.) Keep remote controls away from children and do not let them play with the wall control panel.
- 2.) Twice a year, you should deactivate the automatic opener (while the door is in the closed position). This can be done by pulling on the red cord or pull rope.
- 3.) Balance test: once the door is in 'manual mode' check to see if it is properly balanced. You should be able to lift the door easily with only two fingers. If this is not the case you may have a cable or spring malfunction. Call your local Garaga

dealer or speak with a qualified garage door installer immediately.
4.) Visual inspection of rails, chain/belt and mounting brackets include horizontal rails which should always be parallel to insure that the door operates properly.

5.) Lubrication of all metal parts twice a year with proper metal lubricant (not WD-40) same applies for weather seals making sure to use a silicone based lubricant. This will add years of worry free operation to your garage door.

6.) Reversal test: Make sure that the reversal mechanisms of your garage door opener are functional. Since 1996, all garage door openers are equipped with two safety systems. The first one is a photo cell system that will stop and reverse the motion of the door whenever a person or an object passes through the light beam. The second system will stop and reverse the door automatically if it senses any resistance while the door is closing.

"Regular maintenance for a home owner should cost about \$70 for a tune up (cost for parts is additional)," says Dan Hill from Autograph Door Systems. He concluded

with the well-known saying: "It's better to be safe than sorry". More tips on door maintenance are available on the Garaga web site www.garaga.com or call your local Garaga dealer at 416-410-9209.

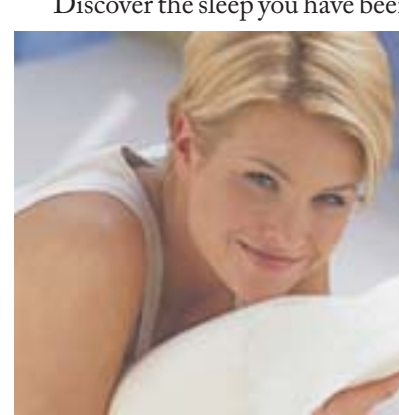

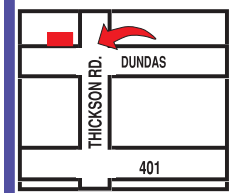

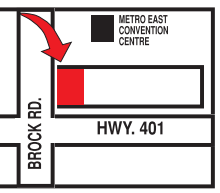

"This is a fabulous event for youth in our region," says Clifford Azavedo, vocal music director at the school.

"It is wonderful to see so many opportunities available to them."

English and media teacher Greg Kieszowski says the event points to a strong community.

"It is wonderful to see the Durham community care about the future of our young people," he says.

Among the booths were the YMCA Employment Services, Ajax and Pickering fire services, UOIT and Ryerson universities, and the News Advertiser.

"It is a good chance for the students to discover non-mainstream careers such as mine, the trapper, and the funeral director,"

says Melissa Church, a teacher of the deaf with the Durham Catholic District School Board.

"It really opens up doors for students; they might not have even heard of these careers before."

Due to the success of the day, preparations are already underway for next year.

OMB appeal moving ahead

PICKERING — Despite a pending legal battle, Berrywoods Farms Inc. is getting an Ontario Municipal Board hearing on its plan to quadruple the size of Greenwood.

The hearing for the Berrywoods expansion that would see the addition of 381 homes in the hamlet has been scheduled for Nov. 7. It is expected to run six weeks.

At a pre-hearing conference Friday morning Tom Lederer, Berrywoods' lawyer, argued an OMB hearing should be scheduled to get the issue moving.

"Our client has rights too, the right to a reasonable hearing date," he said. "To simply sit on this for another three months or six months is simply inappropriate."

Stan Stein, the lawyer representing the Greater Toronto Airports Authority, asked for a time to be reserved in November but not set, in order to give enough opportunity for the application filed in divisional court to be settled.

The issue has been delayed since an earlier Superior Court application was

abandoned in February. It had been asking the court to say the OMB shouldn't be hearing the matter because of the Province's greenbelt legislation. The new application was filed in divisional court earlier this month by the GTAA and Transport Canada. They are asking for a declaration that the applications made by Berrywoods "are a nullity and no effect" under the Greenbelt Protection Act 2004.

"We do have the right to choose the appropriate forum in which we think the matter should be heard," Mr. Stein said.

Berrywoods, also known as Tribute Homes/Runnymede Development Corporation, filed applications with the City March 19 to amend a zoning bylaw and to request approval of a draft plan of subdivision.

Pickering never dealt with the application because it felt it fell under the Province's Greenbelt Protection Act and the moratorium on land-use planning changes outside urban settlements that accompanied it.

The legislation was introduced in December 2003 but didn't become law until June.

The Region of Durham dealt with the application until the bill became law.

Transport Canada and the GTAA became involved because the application falls in the noise contour area of the proposed Pickering airport.

At the first pre-hearing conference, Mr. Stein said the proposed development would be right under the extension of the main east-west runway and its residents would be living in an environment unsuitable for people.

"The two are incompatible," he said.

OMB member Frederic Farrell set the hearing date and two more pre-hearing dates.

"This board member believes fixed target dates have to be set or nothing will happen," he said.

The next pre-hearing date is June 29 at 11 a.m. with another scheduled for Sept. 1.

Now that a hearing date has been set, the City must begin work on the application. Council has to take a position on the application and planning and development staff have to do all the technical reviews and studies.

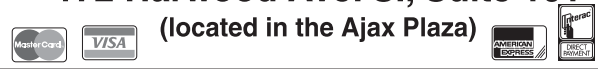

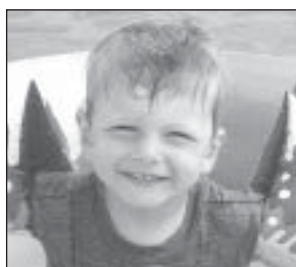

The top three winners in the elementary school contest were Sarah Nadeau from Queen Elizabeth

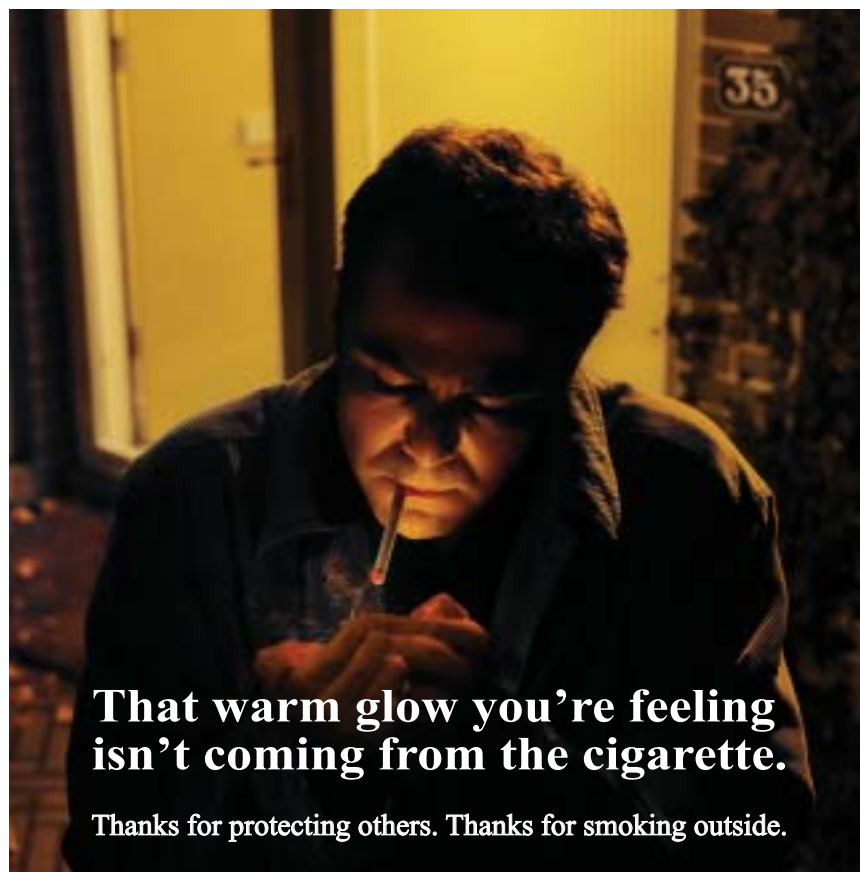

Durham all-stars shine on court

'AAAA' hoops contest was close to the end

DURHAM — The stars of Durham high school senior boys' basketball shone brightly in an evening devoted to the region's best.

The annual all-star contests — one for 'AAAA' schools as well as a 'AAA' and 'AA' schools combined game — played to a full to overflowing crowd at St. Mary Catholic Secondary School in Pickering Wednesday night. The crowd took in not only the games, but also the hugely popular slam-dunk and 3-point shooting contests, featuring eight dunk specialists and 24 sharpshooters.

And, no one left disappointed.

The format remained the same, where coaches chose players for two teams: Team Black and Team White. It proved to be right on the mark, especially based on the parity between the squads in the 'AAAA' showcase. The high-scoring, high-intensity affair was close throughout. In the end, Team White hit its shots down the stretch to post a 122-117 victory.

Team White co-coach Kirk Salesman, of Pickering High School, who was on the bench with Jason McKenzie of Pine Ridge Secondary School, was amazed by how equal the sides were.

"The teams were very balanced and that made it an up-and-down game in terms of scoring and in terms of the matchups on the court," says Salesman, a Pickering High alumnus and a former Team Canada and U.S. collegiate player.

Most difficult, Salesman noted, was divvying up the minutes among the 12 players to ensure everyone received a fair portion of playing time.

"It's an all-star game, so everyone wants to play. You want to keep everyone happy," says Salesman, who was on the Trojans' bench this year with long-time coach Ron Parfitt.

As someone who's played ball

at a high level and as someone who played in Durham, Salesman compares the calibre of the current all-stars favourably to those who played in his era.

"I was impressed," he says. "The guys look good fundamentally. In

the 90s when I played, we were more ferocious and maybe had a little more height. We were more aggressive. Right now, they play more of an up-and-down game and the guys are fundamentally sound."

But mostly, coaching in his first all-star game was an enjoyable experience, says Salesman.

"I loved it. All the guys came up to me after the game and told me 'good game,'" he says.

Pickering High School Trojans' guard Lyndon Rainford earned most valuable player honours in the 'AAAA' contest, showing not only a good shooting range, but his ability to go to the offensive boards with abandon. All told, Rainford counted 22 points in the winning cause for Team White.

After transferring from Scarborough's Stephen Leacock school a year ago, Rainford has been an offensive force with the Trojans this year. He was "proud" to not only win the MVP award, but also to play among the elite high school basketball players in the region.

"It was fun. You want to show your skills, but to have a good time at the same time."

In addition to Rainford, two other Pickering High Trojans finished in double figures for Team White. Forward Tim Cozier netted a game-high 25 points and Grade 10 guard Devoe Joseph finished with 11. St. Mary's guard Duane Howard had 23 and Dunbarton High School Spartans' Jovain Wilson added 10.

On the other side of the court, two other Trojans also scored in double figures for Team Black: Guard Stephen Lopez with 17 and guard Marcus Wong with 15. Kyle Johnson of J. Clarke Richardson led the team with 18 points. J. Clarke guard Tyrell Atkins added 15 and Ajax High centre Michael St. Rose chipped in with 12.

Meanwhile, in the 'AA'/'AAA' all-star game, Team Black buried Team White 102-63. Henry Street High School Hawks' guard Mike Allicock led all scorers with 18 points for Team Black, followed by Leo J.
