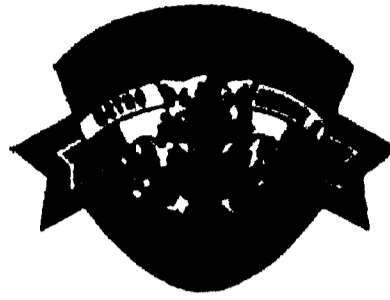

Durham may twin with Ukraine city

Business groups sought to explore notion

Developing business, educational and cultural links with a Ukrainian city is the aim of a new group being formed.

Durham Region wants to twin with Dnipropetrovsk and is looking for anyone interested in taking part.

Former Whitby Mayor and Cametoid Limited president Des Newman first approached the Region in September about twinning with Dnipropetrovsk. At the invitation of the Canadian International Development Agency, Mr. Newman travelled to Ukraine earlier this year to investigate business opportunities for his company. While there, he also examined the potential for business alliances between Canadian and Ukrainian companies.

After his presentation to Regional council, Mr. Newman was asked to form a committee to develop an organizational frame-

Charges laid in cab-jacking that ended in Pickering

A 37-year-old man who turned himself in to London, Ont. police officials last week has been charged in the recent car-jacking of a Kingston cabby and robbery at an Ajax bank.

Durham Regional Police said the man, a suspect in a bank robbery last week in London, surrendered Tuesday.

Durham Region robbery squad detectives interviewed the man and he was subsequently charged in relation to a Nov. 5 holdup at the Scotia Bank on Harwood Avenue.

As well, the man faces charges in connection with the Nov. 8 robbery and abduction of a Kingston cab driver. In that incident, the

bandit forced the victim to drive to Pickering, where he then got out of the car.

Charged with forcible confinement, using an imitation firearm to commit a crime and two counts of robbery is Neil Chouinard, of no fixed address.

He is currently being held in custody in London.

'Whitewash' predicted Nuclear plant restart probe weak: PACT

PICKERING — Terms being proposed for an environmental assessment (EA) of the Pickering nuclear station are inadequate and need to be significantly revised, say four local community groups jointly monitoring the review process.

The Atomic Energy Control Board (AECB) recently released the draft 'scope' for the EA outlining what kind of environmental work it expects Ontario Power Generation (OPG) to complete for the assessment required by the regulator as a condition for restart of the four Pickering 'A' reactors shut

down since January, 1998.

"The present scope will result in a whitewash unless the Atomic Energy Control Board dramatically improves the scope and initiates proper public hearings with an independent panel," says Dave Steele, chairman of Pickering-Ajax Citizens Together (PACT) for the Environment.

"This is a quick and simplistic review, and our community deserves better," says Irene Kock of Durham Nuclear Awareness (DNA). OPG "must prove that there is a need to operate this old, dangerous nuclear station for an-

Durham educational support workers turn down board offer

Strike continues for social workers, speech pathologists, other staff

Social workers and youth counsellors with the separate board's Association of Professional Student Services Personnel (APSSP) are continuing their legal strike this week after rejecting a board offer Monday.

"It's back in their court," said APSSP spokesman Norah Love following a union meeting yesterday when members "turned down what the board was calling their final offer."

The local APSSP, which represents approximately 30 Durham Catholic District School Board employees, launched a legal strike Nov. 22 after negotiations with the board stalled. Union members have been without a contract since last fall.

The group includes social

workers, youth counsellors, speech and language pathologists, psychologists, psychometrists and communicative disorder assistants who provide support to students in elementary and secondary schools across Durham.

The two parties returned to the bargaining table Friday to continue talks with mediator Mary Beth Furrana in the hope of ending what the union had described as "a week fraught with difficulties."

That session, at the Holiday Inn in Oshawa, lasted into the early hours of Saturday morning.

"I think we have been very fair with them. I think the offer they got was a good one," says board chairman Mary Ann Martin.

Trustee Martin reports

the board "is willing to meet to come to an agreement" and says she's looking forward to the APSSP members returning to work.

APSSP members plan to

protest at St. Mary Catholic Secondary School in Pickering this morning and at Father Leo J. Austin Catholic Secondary School in Whitby tonight.

Durham Region school boards won't quit lobby groups

Membership in Ontario school associations 'tremendous asset': Board officials

The cost of membership in the provincial associations that represent Ontario's public and separate school boards has sparked debate in some regions recently as trustees question whether the money is well spent.

The Ontario Public School Boards' Association (OPSBA) and the Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association (OCSTA) are the two bodies that represent the province's school boards at Queen's Park.

And, the hefty membership fees charged annually by the organizations have drawn fire from some trustees.

In fact, the Toronto Catholic District School Board voted to opt out of paying its \$184,805 membership fees to the OCSTA earlier this month. According to OCSTA, the Toronto board is the first to leave the association.

But, Durham officials report local school boards aren't contemplating withdrawing their memberships

to cut costs.

"I think it would be a tremendous loss. The cost of the membership is peanuts compared to the real dollar value we get from OPSBA," says Scugog Trustee Bobbie Drew, who represents the Durham District School Board on OPSBA along with Pickering's Ruth Ann Schedlich.

The board's membership fee, approved during the budget process, was \$78,000 for the current school year. And, Trustee Drew believes it's money well spent.

"It has been a tremendous asset for us," she says of OPSBA, which provides numerous services to member boards, including support with entrepreneurial ventures, political action and communications, technology, professional development, a legal defence fund and access to a labour relations network.

Trustee Drew says the association helped the board understand the NDP's social contract and the current government's new funding formula. "OPSBA did a lot of legwork for us in terms of

interpreting the legislation."

OPSBA spokesman Jeff Sprang reports the majority of Ontario's public school boards are represented by OPSBA, with one notable exception — the York District School Board which withdrew its membership last year.

And, Oshawa Trustee Kathleen Hopper says she'd be in favour of "closely examining" whether the board should maintain its OPSBA membership.

"My concern has always been that it is basically a lobby group," she says. "I have concerns around the structure and the cost."

At the Durham Catholic District School Board, chairman and Whitby Trustee Mary Ann Martin says the board "has always supported the trustees' association."

In fact, separate board trustees approved the board's \$72,633 membership fees for the 1999-2000 school year without any debate earlier this month.

"It's an excellent voice for Catholic education at the provincial level," Ms. Martin says.

other 15 years. The risks of a catastrophe only increase with age, and Pickering 'A' is already 30 years old."

PACT, DNA, the Liverpool West Community Association and the Pickering East Shore Community Association all want the EA 'screening' ordered by the AECB this summer upgraded to a full 'panel review' with public hearings, also allowed for under the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act. The four groups will be submitting a detailed summary of more than 50 of their recommendations for the EA to the AECB by the Dec. 2 deadline set for public comment on the draft scope document. A final scope for the EA is expected to be released by the federal regulator about one week later.

"We're seeing real problems with the AECB not including a requirement that the need to restart Pickering 'A' be included in the environmental assessment," says Ms. Kock, noting the act clearly allows for such a requirement. "We need to have the restart of this plant justified for safety reasons. If they don't really need it we shouldn't restart it. It's too risky."

She notes including restart justification in the EA is particularly important in light of the fact OPG has refused to release its own study on electricity supply and demand in the province, a refusal which DNA is currently appealing to Ontario's freedom of information commissioner.

Another key area where the draft scope is lacking is in provisions for analysis of the possible environmental impact of various nuclear accident sce-

narios, according to Ms. Kock.

Mr. Steele says a major problem with the draft scope is that it's

vague and does not state in detail what OPG is required to do.

"It's in language that can be in-

terpreted in four to five different ways," he notes, adding he's been dealing with EA scope documents

for about 14 years. "I have never seen one as sloppy as this one. It's so open to interpretation."

Violence against women is always wrong

We've come a long way, but much more needs to be done to end male aggression

Next Monday marks a dreadful day of infamy, a grim anniversary of one of the most violent days in Canadian history: the Montreal Massacre.

Those two words were heard again and again exactly 10 years ago when Marc Lepine, a deranged gunman who hated females, marched into the Ecole Polytechnique in Montreal and coldly shot and killed 14 women. He then turned the gun on himself.

The slaughter sharply put into focus the issue of violence against women. All across the country, men were made to confront the actions of the worst of their sex, those who prey on women and children. Calls were made for gun controls, which the federal government responded to with tough legislation several years later. And, pressure was put on the justice system from politicians to prosecutors to judges to police officers to crack down on those who beat women or children.

Ten years hence there have been changes. For one, the National Action Committee on the Status of Women was able to get Dec. 6 declared a national day of commemoration for the women killed a decade ago. For a number of years now, the week leading up to Dec. 6 has been declared White Ribbon week, which encourages all to stamp out violence against women. In particular, men are encouraged to take part in White Ribbon week to drive the message home to all that violence against women is not acceptable and will not be tolerated in any way. The White Ribbon

committee also offers educational programs which are taught in 100 schools in Canada and 1,000 schools in the United States. Its clear message is to teach young men violence against women is always wrong.

The Dec. 6 Fund publishes each year a list of the 100 or more women who die because of male violence. And the Fund provides cash to move desperate, beaten women from emergency shelters to their own accommodation.

Engineering faculties across Canada have encouraged more women to enrol in the traditionally male-dominated field and female students now number about 20 per cent at schools where they were just 13 per cent a decade ago. More women are enrolling in other post-graduate programs, the federal government is finally going to pay the billions it owes its female civil servants in back pay, and some 25 memorials across the country remind all of the tragic events in Montreal 10 years ago. Out of the bloodshed a new awareness has been created, some degree of progress has been made.

It will be up to all of us to make sure the 14 women did not die in vain, that their assassination will act as a spur for further change. Let's create a better Canada where women are finally free from the shackles of male aggression.

Gas price editorial missed the mark

To the editor:

Re the Nov. 23 News Advertiser editorial headlined 'Gas prices a problem for decades':

Your editorial with respect to gasoline pricing reads more like the latest argument supplied by the Canadian Taxpayers Federation. Regrettably, it is an argument whose only purpose is to distort the issue at hand - that being, why do we have high gas prices.

Perhaps your article is somewhat premature given that the price at the pumps is hovering at the 67-cents-per-litre range, 77 cents for premium. Let's be realistic here. Taxes on gasoline don't increase on long weekends, neither have they increased during the current five-month fleecing period forced on Canadian consumers by the major oil companies.

Please bear in mind that Canada has the second lowest gasoline taxes in the world and, last time I checked, our taxes go toward the common good of our society not to the profits of the oil giants and their shareholders. Moreover, Canadians can fire their federal or provincial governments in the next election over the issue of gasoline taxes. They cannot however fire the CEO of Petro-Canada.

It seems that the price of gasoline could be \$1 per litre and your paper would still act as apologists for big oil - ready to join in the tired repetition of the mantra that taxes are behind the high price of gasoline. Such a poor argument is but one more reason why the oil industry is able to deflect criticism away from its greed for profit.

The major oil companies do not compete with each other. They represent an oligopoly that can set whatever price they want for an essential commodity.

It is high time editorials focus on the pricing policies of the major oil companies; the lack of true competition in the Canadian oil industry; and the dominant position held by the oil majors who control it and less ink on abetting the fleecing of the consumer public.

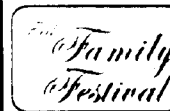

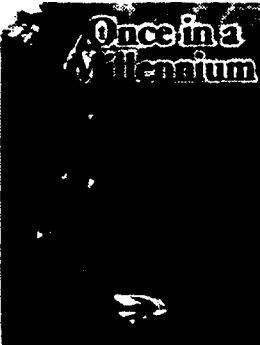

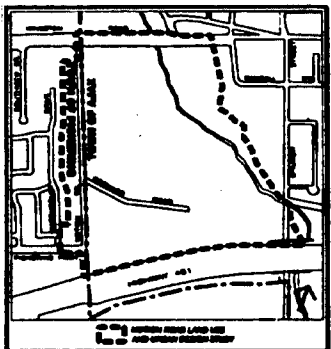

Tougher tests sought for mould in portables

Mom worried for kids' safety needn't fear: Region health department

Concerned there could be hazardous mould in school portables in Durham, a Pickering couple is calling on the Region's health department to revise the procedures officials use to inspect the structures.

"I'm looking for an assurance that my kids are safe being in portables," says Brenda Shedden, a member of the school council at Pickering's St. Mary Catholic Secondary School. "Basically I'm looking for invasive testing because the testing method they've been using isn't working. It's not the reliable way to find out if you have mould or not."

However, Dr. Donna Reynolds, associate medical officer of health with the Durham health department, reports the "proactive" approach used to examine portables for mould here is becoming a model across Ontario.

And, according to the Education Improvement Commission's progress report released Thursday, Durham Catholic District School Board "administrators were proactive in inspecting for mould in portables, and in taking action to solve the problem."

For the past two years, the health department has conducted a yearly survey of the oldest portables in the

region in conjunction with the school boards, Dr. Reynolds reports.

"The initial response is a detailed physical inspection to determine if there is any evidence of mould. We are also looking for conditions that could support mould growth," such as moisture around windows or doors.

Inspectors also ensure the dry-wall is not soft, Dr. Reynolds says. A follow-up inspection may include air sampling to gauge the air quality or invasive testing, which requires inspectors to open the walls of a portable to check for mould.

"There is varying opinion on the necessity of doing invasive testing," says Dr. Reynolds. She believes "for the most part" the maintenance of portables in Durham has been good.

But, Mrs. Shedden says she's concerned the methods used in

Durham to examine portables for mould are not as thorough as those employed in other regions. For example, in Peel, the health department asked both of the region's school boards to "invasively inspect" all portables earlier this year.

"I've taken it upon myself to do as much investigation as I can," says the mother of four, who believes a more thorough examination of portables is needed.

"Generally mould is present (in portables) and generally you can't see it; it's concealed within the walls," says Brenda's husband Brian, vice-president of client services for J. McBride & Sons Ltd., a building restoration firm that repairs portables.

"The only way of determining the extent of the mould is to do invasive testing, to open up randomly small sections of the wall,

on the inside and the outside," says Mr. Shedden, who was a guest speaker at a recent conference on mould held in Toronto by the Ontario Building Envelope Council.

Mr. Shedden, whose firm has repaired mouldy portables in other regions, also says that simply replacing wet drywall is "absolutely not" enough to address the problem. "You're treating a symptom, not the cause."

His wife fears "We may have a potentially huge problem...It's an issue for all across Durham."

But, Dr. Reynolds says, "I think the Durham Region approach is becoming a model for many of the other jurisdictions in the province."

And, she says, if there's a need to knock holes in portable walls to check for mould, "We will do it. At this point we have not identified that need."

- First, pick a place in your home to display the tree. By doing this you will know what size and shape of tree to buy.
- To make sure your tree is fresh you should test the needles to ensure their resilience.
- Make sure the tree is a healthy green colour and has a noticeable fragrance.
- Lift the tree a few inches off the ground and release it firmly on the stump end. The outside green needles should not fall substantially.



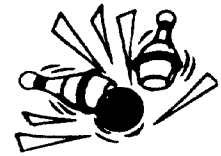

Separate boards join pool to fund schools, pay debts

The Catholic School Boards Services Association (CSBSA) is partnering with CIBC World Markets Inc. to implement a pooled funding program to finance the long-term capital debts of separate boards here and elsewhere.

"This is a significant step in achieving our objective of assisting CSBSA members to finance their capital plans, which are currently in the range of \$400 million," reports CSBSA executive director Peter Howarth.

Set up to establish a new approach to capital debt financing, the association includes the Catholic school boards in Durham, Toronto, York, Dufferin-Peel, Halton and Simcoe-Muskoka.

Under the Province's new funding formula, school boards receive annual grants for new pupil places. Those grants can be used to finance new school construction and

renovations or to repay debt incurred in those areas.

"The Ministry of Education is delighted that school boards are working co-operatively to establish innovative solutions that maximize the value of grants being provided for the construction of new schools," says assistant deputy minister Norbert Hartmann.

"The students of Ontario will be significant beneficiaries of such co-

operative ventures."

According to the CSBSA, the first pooled debenture is expected to be issued in early 2000 and will be used for the construction of new schools in several regions.

"We expect that pooled financing on behalf of multiple school boards will be the most efficient and cost-effective means of raising capital," reports David Leith, managing director of CIBC World Markets. "Pooled financing will also permit school boards with smaller capital requirements to benefit from the liquidity of larger transactions."

Meanwhile, David Visser, superintendent of business for the Durham Catholic District School Board, told trustees recently the board will benefit from the consortium for years to come and its participation will result in significant savings.

"We were sloppy defensively in the second period," notes Blad. "On all four of those goals, (goalie Mike) Andreoff made the first save and the defenceman didn't pick up sticks and that's where the goals came from. They were leaving guys alone in front of the net instead of knocking them on their butts."

John Buscema scored twice for the Panthers and Brent Chandler recorded the other goal.

In the Markham loss, undis-

ciplined penalties in the second period allowed the hosts to score three times to take a commanding 4-1 lead into the final 20 minutes. Pickering outscored Markham 2-1 in the third period but by that point the damage had already been done.

Pickering scoring information wasn't available.

The Panthers next home game is against the Vaughan Vipers at the Pickering Recreation Complex on Friday, Dec. 3 at 7:30 p.m. The Panthers host the rival Ajax Axemen on Monday, Dec. 6 at 9:30 p.m.
