Making a very big mark

National Volunteer Week recognizes the hard work of those who give so much to community

DURHAM - It may be a long way from Thanksgiving, but this month non-profit agencies and organizations worldwide are giving thanks to volunteers.

Between April 18 and 24, individuals and groups from around the world are recognized for their hard work, dedication and help in their community, as part of National Volunteer Week.

One-in-four Canadians volunteer and the numbers are rising, according to Nancy Burke, co-ordinator of the Volunteer Resource Centre for Durham Region.

The average volunteer ranges in age from 14 and up, however those younger shouldn't be discouraged from giving time as long as they have an adult accompanying them, savs Ms. Burke.

The resource centre serves Durham residents and refers people interested in volunteering to specific agencies, such as Girls Incorporated or the Pickering Community Nursing

PACT gets sensitive

Environmental group wants Pickering to protect northern areas of concern

PICKERING - Pickering Ajax Citizens Together for the Environment wants the City to keep Seaton green.

The local group commissioned Joe Boyce, a professor of geology at McMaster University, to do a review of Pickering's growth management study.

The comments, as well as those of PACT's members, are being formally presented to Pickering councillors tomorrow (Monday).

"Our concern, and it always has been our concern, is that the environmentally sensitive areas and heritage (areas) must be protected first and foremost," said David Steele, chairman of PACT.

The group is concerned about how the coldwater streams and groundwater in the area are going to be affected by development.

"What we're saying is how do you protect the large woodlots and more important how do you protect coldwater streams?"

Mr. Joyce used to teach at the University of Toronto and is familiar with the land in the study area.

He reviewed the Phase 2 report completed by Dillon Consulting in February and the water budget analysis reports.

In his letter to Mr. Steele he said he had some doubts about whether the predicted groundwater infiltration and baseflows estimated are valid.

Mr. Joyce suggests the consultations incorporate the studies already done on the hydrologic and geologic characteristics of the area. (The Interim Waste Au-

Girls Inc., which serves Pickering, Aiax and matches up young girls with a mentor.

Girls can also participate in various programs and workshops, with mentors volunteering a minimum of four hours

"Our mandate is to inspire all girls to be strong, smart and bold," said Marilyn Mitchell, executive director. Currently Girls Inc. has 45 girls matched with a mentor, however, there are still 30 girls in need of a friend.

Volunteers are also the lifeline of the Community Nursing Home.

"When we had a recent shutdown there wasn't enough help with group programs," said Rachelle Cuaresma, co-ordinator of volunteers.

"We noticed the absence of them (volunteers).'

She explained the 107 volunteers at the nursing home offer support to patients and provide extra encouragement in daily activities.



Officer describes Jones crime investigation

DURHAM – A gunshot to the head killed Roy Jones, court heard Fri-

"The last wound was to his head as he lay on the road. The perpetrator intended to kill Roy Jones," Douglas Usher, a lawyer for accused Cosmo Jacobson, said in an agreed submission by the Crown and defence attorneys.

Mr. Jones was shot multiple times around 10:30 p.m. Feb. 4, 2001 as he returned home from his job as security supervisor at the since-demolished Metro East Trade Centre.

He was scheduled to testify in a preliminary hearing regarding a Pickering home invasion on Feb. 7, 2001. Mr. Jacobson (aka Avi Mundy) and Sean Hall are being tried for first-degree murder in Mr. Jones' death.

At the start of the trial, Mr. Jacobson pleaded guilty to five counts related to the home invasion, while Mr. Hall pleaded not guilty to the charges.

During testimony before Justice Dan Ferguson of the Superior

Court of Justice in Whitby, Durham Regional Police Detective Constable Shawn Duxbury, a member of the force's forensic identification unit, said when he arrived at the scene, Mr. Jones lay on his left side on Pickering Beach Road (since renamed Salem Road), near the Twilley Lane home he shared with his family.

Much of Det. Const. Duxbury's testimony dealt with the collection of evidence found at the scene, including five spent bullet shells, a set of keys, a drawstring from a piece of clothing and a pair of binoculars.

He said all five shells, two found next to the victim's house and three near the body, were Triton 45 Super casings.

Three keys, attached to a fob or chain, the binoculars and two shells were found between Mr. Jones' home and the neighbouring house, Det. Const. Duxbury stated.

One key was for the door and trunk of a Chrysler vehicle, one for a Chrysler ignition and one a house kev. he added.

The trial continues Monday.

Regional garbage load decreased in 2003

DURHAM - The Region disposed of 129,922 tonnes of waste from houses and apartments in 2003, a regional works department annual report said.

That represents a decrease of 1,594 tonnes from 2002. Around 16,000 tonnes of leaf and yard waste was also collected, as well as 2,519 tonnes of kitchen organic compost from Clarington, Brock, Scugog and Uxbridge who are enrolled in the program.

But there was only a 31 per cent waste-diversion rate overall in 2003, a far cry from the Region's goal of 50 per cent diversion by 2007 or earlier.

Durham has land purchases in mind

Ajax waterfront property in line for \$500,000 towards \$3 million cost

DURHAM - Helping municipalities purchase environmentally sensitive land will be a new budget item for 2005.

The move comes after the finance and administration committee Tuesday agreed to help Ajax purchase 23 acres of waterfront property. The land, located in the Carruthers Creek watershed at the bottom of Shoal Point Road, is privately owned with an application to build 16 homes about to go before the Ontario Municipal Board.

The strip is considered a "critical link" in helping Ajax achieve a connect waterfront and trail system, the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority and Town say.

After an hour-long debate, the committee agreed to give Ajax \$500,000 split evenly between 2004 and 2005 to help in the \$3million cost.

Negotiations will now continue with the land owner.

The committee also agreed to add a new budget item for 2005 with a \$500,000 base to help municipalities acquire land.

In his inaugural speech, regional chairman Roger Anderson said buying sensitive land would be part of Durham's plans, a promise made to former Mayor Doug Moffatt who brought the idea forward in his departing address before the November 2003 election.

Mr. Moffatt wanted revenues from Great Blue Heron Casino used to buy land, but that money is already allocated to the general tax levy budget, said Jim Clapp, the commissioner of finance.

Diverting that money would result in a tax increase, he said.

thority completed several studies when there were proposals to build landfills in the area).

The study area is comprised of the provincially owned Seaton lands east of West Duffins Creek and the privately owned land in the Duffins Rouge Agricultural Preserve west of the creek.

PACT would like to see comprehensive surface and groundwater studies done in both areas, but its members feel the Seaton land is more environmentally sensitive because of its coldwater streams and numerous woodlots.

The group also recognizes Pickering's need for more land to develop as urban.

"It is essential that space be put aside for Pickering's future growth," said Philip McMullen, of the PACT executive. "Which area poses the least amount of environmental damage in the future? ... The answer is the farmland.

David Home, also on the PACT executive. agrees.

"There is a need for growth... What we do say is that it has to be responsible growth and take into account the environmentally sensitive areas," he said

Mr. Home is an Ajax resident who participated in the battles against the landfills.

"I have a great interest in Duffins Creek. We fought a great debate against a garbage dump on the banks," he said. "I didn't do that work to see that happen five or six kilometres upstream."

PACT is making three recommendations to the City concerning the study, including having Dillon complete surface water and groundwater studies to determine which areas can be developed, and what level of population can be supported on the Seaton land and the agricultural land without adverse impacts on the environment.

Regional drop-off stop closes

Maintain services at Rouge Valley Ajax and Pickering

The public owes a debt of gratitude to Dr. Romas Stas for voicing the concerns of the residents of Ajax, Pickering and Whitby over the erosion of our medical services at Rouge Valley Ajax and Pickering

Since September 2003, beds at the Ajax hospital have been reduced from 59 to 45, the number of elective surgeries have been decreased and labour and delivery services have been downgraded. The food services for our local hospital are now transported from Centenary hospital in Scarborough. What's next?

In our growing region, the residents of

Ajax, Pickering and Whitby have only the Ajax hospital. The residents of Scarborough are fortunate to have three major hospitals. I am confident 15 members of the Rouge Valley Health System board of directors will not ask the quarter-million people our Ajax hospital now serves, to leave our region to travel over 25 kilometres along one of the busiest highways in North America into Scarborough for medical services.

In an emergency situation how would an ambulance negotiate rush-hour traffic along the 401 into Scarborough?

Now that the Rough Valley Health System public consultations are over, it is essential results of the consultations be made public, and it is crucial that the citizens of Durham remain committed to doing what is necessary to keep our only local hospital a full-service hospital.

Be honest in introducing new taxes

Consider too, the food fight brewing over the Liberals' proposal to add the PST to basic meals under \$4. Again, taxpayers are played for the fools. The Liberals ran a very vocal election campaign last fall fully trumpeting that the Tories were hiding a deficit, that the books were nowhere near balanced. Yet, Dalton McGuinty promised that a province governed under his Liberal banner would get plenty more (I believe the sun, the moon and the stars were among his 200-plus pledges). His contention was that he'd overcome the deficit and still deliver for core areas.

When pressed, he couldn't explain where the magical money tree would be planted to produce the needed revenue. Because all along he knew there was never a chance he'd be able to deliver without finding new revenue streams, hence the new taxes he's begin-

ning to introduce.

These examples really strike at the crux of the issue. Politicians just don't seem to get it.

They rarely come clean with the public and say: 'yes, your taxes will likely go up, but there is a reason. We will maintain this service and that, and we'll commit to this other new thing.'

No one wants to pay more in taxes, but it's a bit easier to turn the money over if you know what you're paying for.

Because at their very core, everyone wants to know they're getting good value for their dollar.

Toothprints

To celebrate April as Dental Health Month Docter's Marvin Lean and Chetna Wadwha and the staff at the Pickering Dental Office are raising awareness of the importance of identification among

Today, dental hygiene is at its best and children have fewer cavities, which is good news for many parents. However, due to the lack of dental records from excellent oral hygiene, many children are left without a distinctive means of identification.

Other than fingerprinting, forensic teams around the world turn to dental imprints for identification, which is why the Pickering Square Dental Office is offering the community toothprints, a \$40 value.

The Durham Regional Police department is working with the staff at the Pickering Square Dental Office to increase the means of identifying children by informing parents of the benefits of both fingerprinting and toothprinting for their children.

Toothprints are made of patented, arch-shaped thermoplastic wafers that are left with dental impressions once they are bitten into. When the imprint is made, individual tooth characteristics are recorded, which provide vital identification information.

After parents receive their child's toothprint, they get to keep it for immediate access. Also, a toothprint that isn't rinsed captures saliva, which makes it effective for scentdog tracking. 
If you're a parent whose child goes missing, having your child's toothprint is vital in the early hours of an investigation.







continues to increase in our population, we all need to be vigilant of signs of possible elder abuse, particularly if the elder is institutionalized or dependent on a care giver for the basic necessities of life. Whether it involves a parent, sibling or spouse, someone needs to monitor the care they are receiving. Abuse is not always intentional and it takes many

suggestions are intended to help detect and or deter abuse in an institutionalized setting.

1. Ask for a list of all medications being given to the person. Every pharmacist and doctor has a copy of the Compendium of Pharmaceuticals and Specialties (commonly referred to as CPS) by the Canadian Pharmacists Association. It lists possible side effects of drugs and precautions that should be taken regarding interaction with other drugs. Write down the changes observed in the manner/behaviour of the person, and ask to read what it says about the prescribed medications.

The internet is another possible source of information for this.

2. Little money for research has been made available for studies on the elderly, so often an experimental approach is taken. Question validity of the approach of new therapies, drugs, routines

3. Be observant of the overuse of restraint, whether it is physical such as straps holding the person in a chair, or chemical where drugs are used to sedate them. With cutbacks in the healthcare sector, reduced staff often chooses to use these methods to make their job easier but it robs the senior of dignity and quality of life.

any signs of possible physical abuse such as bruises, cuts and other unaccounted for injuries as well as fearful behavior when the caregiver is pre-

Be observant of verbal abuse such as fear when spoken to, avoidance of eye contact or cry-

Have you noticed a change in mental outlook? Some medications interact negatively with each other, resulting in mental confusion, new physical ailments, depression or even suicidal thoughts.

7. Are they getting sufficient/appropriate nourishment? If they can't



feed themselves, is someone feeding them? Are they given a reasonable length of time to eat? Rushed feedings can result in aspiration of food into the lungs resulting in pneumonia.

8. If the person is in a nursing home, attend the annual Multi-Disciplinary Conferences that are held on each resident. Those involved in their care discuss the residents general care: diet, medication, problems, improvements, management of pain etc.

It is your right to attend these meetings. Your presence shows your concern and greater attention may be given to problem areas.

Every institutionalized person needs

her. You need to be knowledgeable, be observant and ask questions.

'Last Blast' dropped after shooting

Decision made in wake of Ajax man's death outside college pub

DURHAM - The Last Blast vear-end party for Durham College students has been cancelled in the wake of a fatal shooting at an on-campus pub earlier this month.

"The decision came out of respect for family and friends of the victims," said student association president Ken Swan. "We're hearing many people still want it to take place, but many don't think it should happen this year.

"We decided it wouldn't be an appropriate venue due to the incident happening so close," Mr. Swan said.

Durham Regional Police are still investigating, but have yet to lay murder charges in the April 3 shooting at E.P. Taylor's, which killed 21-year-old Ajax resident Dwayne Moses

A 24-year-old bouncer was also treated and released from hospital with gunshot wounds to the

Six men - five from Toronto and one from Ajax - were originally taken into custody and charged jointly with attempted murder and aggravated assault. Due to insufficient evidence, those charges were downgraded last week to breach of probation and obstruction of justice and police.

One of the six men, 23year-old Matthew Okoko of Toronto, was released and all charges against him were dropped.

The student centre at

Durham College, which has remained closed for investigation since the shooting, was turned over to the college's student government Tuesday afternoon.

While E.P. Taylor's will be open during the day for students finishing up their final exams this week and next, Mr. Swan said "all formal programming" has been cancelled until the end of the term.

That includes the Last Blast, a New Orleansthemed party that was to take place at E.P. Taylor's April 23.

"There's been a lot of planning for it. We certainly didn't anticipate this happening," said Mr. Swan. "But we're comfortable with our decision."

Asked if E.P. Taylor's is beefing up its security, Mr. Swan said, "Everything is going to be reviewed by the student centre and student centre management at a later date."

In the meantime, there will be a greater security presence, in the form of more security guards at E.P. Taylor's during the day, he said.

Mr. Swan couldn't say if the shooting has made pub management reconsider allowing outside patrons inside E.P. Taylor's in the future.

"All of our policies still have to be reviewed," he

With it being the last week of classes, most students are concentrating on exams and end-of-year projects, Mr. Swan said.

"I'm sure there are lots of mixed emotions," he

"As for any concern about their own safety, I haven't heard anything to that effect (from students)."

"I don't think this has been a reflection of our campus at all, " he added.

Early learning: A smart move

Parents can get their preschoolers off to a great start.

Ever wonder why some kids do well in school right from the start? Experts at Oxford Learning Centres say that "smart" kids start learning almost at birth, during that critical period of early childhood when the mind is wide open.

"Research shows that certain developmental, or cognitive, skills can only be fully developed if they are offered at the appropriate time," says Emma Gamble, Oxford's Early Childhood Education Specialist.


'Think of the child's developing mind as a series of plateaus. Research shows that these plateaus open at a certain young age. If they are not developed during that period, they close."

A 1999 study by Dr. Fraser Mustard, titled "The Early Years Report," showed that by the age of six, most of the human brain's wiring for lifelong learning, behavior and health is already in place. The study also found that children's earliest experiences, particularly during the first three years of life, are major contributors to positive brain

While most children in North America attend a day care centre or pre-school before entering the traditional school system, Gamble says that few programs are structured to promote lifelong development. The good news, however, is that parents can help their children develop a love of learning and Oxford's Little Readers program can help too.

1. Set the stage. Pioneer educator Dr. Maria Montessori often spoke of the "prepared environment" as a place that is conducive to learning. Parents can arrange their home in such a way that their kids ca',t help but learn. Buy plenty of books and place them on a few low shelves, where tiny hands can reach them. Keep art supplies in an accessible cabinet and display artwork where it can be readily admired. Play classical music, restrict television viewing to a few hours a week and encourage children to play outside, where they can learn about the natural environment. The key is to keep the tools of learning, be they formal or informal, close at hand.





2. Encourage independence. A true sense of self-esteem encourages children to do things on their own. And capable children grow into capable adults. Parents can start by getting kids involved with household chores. Start with simple tasks, like polishing furniture and wiping the table. Slowly introduce them to more difficult tasks, such as flower arranging, sweeping and cooking. Child-sized brooms, mops and sponges can make these jobs go more smoothly. Place stepstools near the kitchen and bathroom sinks, and make sure they can reach and make their own beds.

3. Read, read, read. Parents should start reading to their children as infants. As they grow, encourage them to make up their own






