Election hopefuls try to establish trust

Debate focuses on health, out-of-riding candidates

PICKERING - With the sponsorship scandal still reverberating three weeks into the federal election, voter trust in politicians has been an issue for candidates.

During a debate Wednesday night, hosted by the News Advertiser, Rogers TV, KX 96 and CKDO, candidates in the new riding of Pickering-Scarborough East dealt with the question of why voters should believe what they and their parties are promising.

Liberal hopeful Dan McTeague said his party has been rewarded with bigger majorities in each election since being elected in 1993.

"The will of the people was to follow our lead," he said.

Green Party candidate Matthew Pollesel challenged him on the issue.

"It's easy to say you had com-

Cutting down to size

Public board releases first draft of budget, reducing class numbers will mean more portables

DURHAM - Reducing primary class sizes in Durham public schools will begin this fall and in some cases will mean more portables.

The Durham District School Board's first budget draft was released Wednesday, outlining \$490.4 million in 2004/05 operating spending, more than \$25 million over the current year.

However, a lot of the new money is for new government initiatives, including \$2.9 million for primary class size reduction. It will largely go towards hiring 34.5 teachers, but the board also plans to buy

eight new portables, move eight others and renovate classrooms with a goal of reducing junior kindergarten to Grade 3 class sizes to an average of 22 kids. That would be half a student less than the current average.

"We have at least eight schools (identified for portables); some schools have portables on site," operations superintendent Mark Joel said at the budget meeting, adding they include "a few Whitby schools."

He would not yet release which schools are involved, but trustees didn't like the sound of it.

"It is kind of defeating the purpose of our accommodation plan," noted Ajax Wards 1 and 2 Trustee Marilyn Crawford, the education finance committee chairman. "We've been trying to reduce portables and now we're adding them in."

"We're right back in the same

Board taking no chances with fifth

Shifting staff to deal with disease outbreak

DURHAM – More than 50 pregnant Durham elementary teachers have been redeployed to high schools or are on sick leave due to an ongoing outbreak of fifth disease.

Caused by the human parvovirus B19 and also called slapped cheek disease, outbreaks normally occur in elementary school children and there is no treatment. Pregnant and soon-to-be-pregnant women have to be cautious as the disease in rare cases can cause severe anemia in an unborn baby or the woman to miscarry.

Mark Joel, the Durham District School Board's operations superintendent, says 30 board schools, located across the region, are affected. He says a case was confirmed at Lord Elgin Public School in Ajax and there was an unconfirmed case at Captain Michael VandenBos Public School in Whitby.

"They have to be pregnant to be re-assigned," he says of staff. "Fifth disease is a childhood disease. It has very little affect on adults."

Most teachers have been moved to their area high school to work in the library or resource centre, while a few have taken sick days.

A Durham health department fact sheet describes fifth disease as a "mild illness." Spokesman Glendene

Collins says it is not a reportable disease so the department has no information on how many cases there are in Durham. A family doctor must report to the health department incidents of severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) and influenza, for example.


She says more than half of the population is immune due to previous exposure.

Chris Hurst, human resources superintendent at the Durham Catholic District School Board, says he has not heard of a case in a local Catholic school since late last year.

The public board has sent schools a communiqué, requesting that they post a notice at all doorways to advise the general public if there is an incident or case of fifth disease there. Mr. Joel says it is not mandatory to do so, and that the frequency of fifth disease cases was higher a couple of months ago.

The health department says the disease is spread through saliva, sneezing and coughing and, rarely, blood. It is usually spread before a deep red rash appears on the face.

"A lace-like rash on the trunk, arms and legs may also be seen," states the health department release.







place with more and more portables," said Oshawa Trustee Susan Shetler, concerned the structures aren't "a safe and secure place" for young pupils.

"It is unpalatable to put more children in portables even if it is for the greater good of smaller class sizes," commented Pickering Trustee Sherry Croteau.

Reducing primary class sizes was a key campaign promise of the Ontario Liberals.

Business superintendent Ed

Hodgins's report to trustees notes that some of the funding formula benchmarks, such as transportation, have been updated.

"It is really great that they are finally looking at the benchmarks... but I think they only read half of the (Rozanski) report," said Trustee Crawford.

Widely hailed by education stakeholders, the 2002 report called on the government to update the benchmarks to better reflect actual costs. That had not occurred since 1998.

"They're counting new initia-

tives as part of the Rozanski money," Mr. Hodgins says. "So it's not a catch up, it's new initiatives."

He emphasized that the government's \$800-plus million boost to education funding is significant. But the board still faces cost pressures in areas such as teacher salaries. The government has provided for a two-per cent increase this year, but the board is already obligated to deliver a 0.8 per cent increase on Aug. 31 to fulfil expiring contract agreements.

"The government adjust-

ments really did not consider the collective agreements that boards reached, and that's across the province," Mr. Hodgins said in an interview.

He says \$375 million in government money is yet to be allocated.

As well, "all of the issues around capital accommodation" are yet to be dealt with, which Mr. Hodgins says will delay the timing of the next phase of the board's accommodation plan.

The budget reflects \$740,000 in one-time funding for energy

retrofit projects. Schools slated to benefit include O'Neill Collegiate and Vocational Institute in Oshawa and Whitby's Palmerston Avenue Public School, both of which would receive partial window replacements, and Duffin's Bay Public School, in Ajax, due for a new boiler.

Mr. Hodgins says the budget will be balanced if the Province makes good on its commitment to fund boards according to their documented special-education needs. That would mean another \$2.8 million for the board.

Keep an eye out for vandals

Summer time is ripe for late-night trouble, watch for suspicious activity

A father's gift to his son. That's what Irv Carr had in mind when he donated K.S. Oliver's 'Census Five' to the City of Pickering.

The piece of art was to be one of the showpieces of the soon-to-be-opened Frenchman's Bay East Progress Park. Mr. Carr offered it in memory of his son, who died of Batten disease.

Yet in one incomprehensible and senseless act, a precious gift was attacked by a group of thugs, leaving a mangled mess behind and graffiti on the walls of the Progress Club.

A real piece of work, these vandals.

A weekend of celebrating the best of Pickering through the annual Frenchman's Bay Festival, ArtFest, dragonboat racing, and a visit by Canada's world sailor, Derek Hatfield, was tainted by these acts.

A weekend where we welcomed visitors from around Durham and beyond to show them our multicultural best, to show our community spirit and way of life, to trumpet the beauty of the waterfront parks, trails and other amenities has to share the spotlight with cowardice.

The immediate reaction is to ask 'Why?' but there really is no answer. This type of destruction just can never be explained away. But, more than ever it underscores the importance of vigilance and ensuring we do everything possible to stop these types of acts.

Residents in the area report seeing young people scaling the 16-foot high fence protecting the park. That's a great start for looking into the crime.

We're heading into the worst time of the year for late-night antics and trouble. With the warmer weather comes more opportunity for troublemakers to stay out late. Petty vandalism and swarmings have continued to grow in Pickering over the last few years.

Everyone can do their part by keeping an eye out for anything out of the ordinary. And if you have information that can help collar those responsible, call police.

Often people fear reporting incidents for fear of retribution, but you can make a call without being identified. Call Crime Stoppers, they protect your identity and even take anonymous tips. Don't let anyone tear our community apart.

Our own Olympians to cheer for

Felicien and Luttmmer are going for gold

The 2004 Summer Olympic Games may be a world away in Athens, Greece in August, but the local flavour will be unmistakable at this historic birthplace of the Games.

All local eyes, especially those in Pickering, will be fixed on favoured daughter Perdita Felicien. Based on gold-medal performances at the 2003 World Track and Field Championships and the 2004 indoor worlds, she'll no doubt be a top contender and arguably Canada's best hope for a gold medal when she lines up in the 100-metre hurdles.

Our local Olympic contingent doesn't stop with Felicien. There's

another who will be out to do Pickering proud -- Bernard Luttmmer.

He'll be on the water in men's laser sailing, earning our country's sole Olympic entry with his performance at the recent World Laser Sailing Championships in Bodrum, Turkey.

After eight years of trying, including coming agonizingly close to a berth for the 2000 Games, Luttmmer has finally arrived. The 24-year-old

realized a dream of competing in the Olympics that originated in the learn-to-sail programs at Swan's Marina and the Frenchman's Bay Yacht Club (FBYC).

Slowly, but surely he's taken his place among the very best laser sailors on the planet, but Luttmmer is far from content. He has a golden goal.

"I see myself winning gold -- that's the only way to go," said a determined Mr. Luttmmer at his south Pickering home, enjoying a rare break from racing and training.

For those uninitiated with laser sailing, he'll be racing aboard a 14-foot, single-mast sailing vessel. All 45 competitors representing their respective nations at the Olympics will be assigned a boat, all equipped with exactly the same gear.

"Laser, to me, is the purest form of sailing out of them all," says Mr. Luttmmer. "There's only one boat design, so no one can ever get an advantage. We all get equipment from the same supplier, so it's all the same gear."

Luttmmer continues a proud tradition of Olympic sailors who first learned their craft on Frenchman's Bay. Fellow FBYC alumnus Rod Davies was Canada's representative at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta.

Now, it's Mr. Luttmmer's time and also Ms. Felicien's time.

And, it's a great time for local pride in what will be an interesting Olympic Games.





Hospital chemical spill mopped up

Staff following procedure by calling in fire department

AJAX – The Ajax Fire Department was called in to assist the hospital in the cleanup of a small chemical spill Thursday morning.

“At 4 a.m. this morning staff working in the lab discovered a small leak of

a chemical called xylene, which is used in the processing of lab slides,” said Katie Cronin-Wood, hospital spokesman.

Staff at the hospital followed procedure by using a chemical absorbent to soak up the chemical, which was cleaned up and bagged an hour later. The fire department was called at 8 a.m. because there was still a chemical smell in the air.

The Ministry of Labour,

which was called in to investigate, said fire department tests found no reading for the chemical.

The MOL gave the hospital the OK to reopen the lab at 11 a.m.

The chemical is not toxic, but it can cause headaches, dizziness and confusion if people are exposed to it for short (14 days) or long periods (a year).

“As a precaution all of the staff that were in the

lab before (the leak was discovered) were sent to emerge,” Ms. Cronin-Wood said.

A total of 18 were sent to be checked out and by mid-afternoon only three checkups remained.

None of the chemical got into the hospital’s air, as the lab’s ventilation sys-

tem vents to the outside. The density of the chemical would also make it difficult to evaporate into the air.

No services at the hospital were disrupted due to the spill and by mid-afternoon everything was back to normal, Ms. Cronin-Wood said.

Crown points to powder residue as smoking gun

DURHAM – Unique gunshot residue found on Cosmo Jacobson's clothes was similar to that on garments worn by murder victim Roy Jones, a jury heard this week.

Traces of tin, an element not often used in ammunition, was found in samples taken from the clothing of both men, a scientist with the Centre of Forensic Sciences said during the trial, being heard in the Superior Court of Justice.

Tin, used primarily by European and Asian manufacturers, was not found in the bullets that killed Mr. Jones, Michael McVicar said under questioning by prosecutor Paul Murray. He suggested the tin, used to seal the primer that ignites the gun powder in a cartridge, may have been left behind by bullets fired from the gun before it was used to kill Mr Jones on Feb. 4, 2001.

"It is possible to fire ammunition that does not contain tin and release tin-containing residue from previous firings," Mr. McVicar said.

The jury of eight men and four women heard hours of forensic evidence this week. The testimony was part of the Crown's effort to link Mr. Jacobson and his co-accused Sean Hall with the slaying of Mr. Jones on an Ajax street near his home.

The prosecution has put forth a theory that Mr. Jones was killed to prevent him from testifying against the two accused men, who were facing a trial in connection with a home-invasion robbery in 2000.

This week's painstaking examination of witnesses focused on work conducted by the Centre of Forensic Sciences on evidence gathered by police in the days following Mr. Jones's murder. The jury listened as Mr. McVicar testified about finding gunshot residue on a number of items of clothing, including jeans, a sweatshirt and leather jackets, which were seized from Mr. Jacobson's home and car.

Mr. Jones's relatives wiped away tears when Mr. Murray pulled from paper bags the pants and blue jacket emblazoned across the back with the word "Security" that the victim wore the night he was attacked and shot numerous times.

Pointing to bullet holes in the pants and jacket, Mr. McVicar testified that gunshot residue found on Mr. Jones's garments was similar to that found on clothes seized by police. In addition to the typical lead, barium and antimony found in all gunshot residue, the material found on the clothes contained traces of tin, Mr. McVicar said. Tin is not commonly used in ammunition made in North America, he said.

"Tin is a material incorporated in the manufacture of ammunition by some manufacturers, but not all," he said.

"It's somewhat uncommon, but certainly not a rare thing."

Traces of similar gunshot residue were also found in a safe police took from Mr. Jacobson's

room, court heard.

Earlier in the week, the trial, which is being heard by the jury and Justice Donald Ferguson, heard DNA evidence linking the clothing to Mr. Jacobson. As well, court was told, a jacket found in a closet bore traces of DNA similar

to Mr. Hall's, according to testimony. That jacket was also found to have gunshot residue on it, Mr. McVicar said.

The jury also heard that some items found near Mr. Jones's Twilley Lane home, including binoculars and the drawstring

from a sweatshirt, bore DNA similar to Mr. Jacobson's.

So far the Crown's case has focused on Mr. Jacobson, also known as Avi Mundy. The trial has heard that Mr. Jacobson told a friend he stood lookout when Mr. Jones was killed, but was not

the shooter.

The attempt to shift blame to Mr. Jacobson's one-time friend, Mr. Hall, has created an intriguing dynamic in the case.

It is expected the jury will continue hearing evidence until the end of July.

The treatment of wastewater at water pollution control plants or by private waste disposal systems (such as septic systems) generates residual solids referred to as *biosolids* or *septage*. Durham Region is currently undertaking concurrent studies to identify environmentally responsible and cost-effective strategies for managing these residual solids.

The biosolids and septage management strategies are being prepared in accordance with the master planning provisions of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment*. Based on these planning provisions, alternative methods of managing biosolids and septage are being identified and evaluated based on an assessment of the following factors:

- Natural Environment
- Social Environment
- Economic Environment
- Cultural Environment
- Regulatory Requirements
- Technical Feasibility

The proposed biosolids and septage management strategies will be presented at a Public Information Centre on **Tuesday, June 22, 2004, between 6:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. at the Pickering Recreation Complex, East Entrance, O'Brien Room, 1867 Valley Farm Road, Pickering.** A formal presentation will take place at 7:00 p.m., and Durham Region staff and project consultants will be available to answer questions. We encourage your involvement in these studies to help us identify the issues that are important to you.

Green's the colour of development for residents

Public meeting gathers greenbelt input

DURHAM – Keep it green, residents from across southern Ontario have told a public meeting on the Province's proposed greenbelt.

More than 50 people from areas such as Durham, Northumberland, Scarborough, Oakville and Milton came to Durham College recently for a public meeting in front of the greenbelt task force.

"We're not just protecting the birds and bees... if we don't protect our green-space, our air and food, our quality of life will suffer greatly," said Jim Robb of the Rouge Duffins Green-space Coalition.

"We need to look at green infrastructure as an investment."

The Greenbelt Act, or Bill 27, is looking to establish a permanent band of protected land in Ontario. In December, the Province placed a one-year moratorium on development on a greenbelt "study area" that stretches from Niagara and the Niagara Escarpment, through Halton, Peel, Toronto, York, Durham and into Northumberland.

The task force is to report back to the Province on how to establish the greenbelt - 90 per cent of which is privately owned - where it will be and how much it will cost.

Cities like Berlin and Rome would call the rapid development in the Greater Toronto Area a "crisis" and immediately put in steps to stop it, said lawyer David Donnelly of Environmental Defence Canada.

"This generation has had their kick at the can." Mr. Donnelly said to cheers and applause.

Ian Attridge of the Kawartha Heritage Conservancy said he wants the proposed greenbelt to help with the securement of environmentally sensitive lands, including bigger income tax incentives for those who donate their property.

Rob Burton, executive director of Clear the Air Coalition drove from Oakville to say how "thrilled" he was over the proposed greenbelt.

There is a planning "crisis" in Ontario when it comes to waste management, sprawl, algae in Lake Ontario and deadly air pollution, Mr. Burton said.

And homeowners are forced to pay for this "cost of growth," he added.

The West Duffins Landowners Group owns about 2,500 acres of land in

northwest Pickering and its members feel their land should not be included in the greenbelt.

"In our view, this has already been done through the municipal planning process," said lawyer Stanley Makuch of Cassels, Brock and Blackwell LLP, referring to the City of Pickering's growth management plan that recommended portions of the land be developed.

"The GTA, in our view, has a significant shortage of land."

Some farmers in attendance said they don't want any more interference from the government on how to run their lands and businesses.

The same has been said by local politicians, who want the tools and resources to implement any planning legislation, rather than more documents dictating what they can do.

But the draft recommendations of the task force so far show more provincial hands in local planning.

They include:

- the Province reviewing the way in which "need" for infrastructure is decided;
- having an appellate tribunal to "uphold the integrity of the plan";
- a provincial task force on agriculture;
- special tax incentives for landowners in the greenbelt.

"What you're seeing is the pendulum swinging back and forth," said Russell Powell, chief administrative officer of the Central Lake Ontario Conservation Association, who

sits on the task force.

"This provincial government seems to be more proactive in the planning department."

Alex Georgieff, Durham's commissioner of planning, said he is currently reviewing the draft paper and "can't talk" until he makes his report to planning committee on June 8.

The Greenbelt Task Force will have its final recommendations to the Province by the end of the summer.



Local, national issues tackled at Ajax debate

Health care, airport and gun registry draw strong reaction

AJAX – Health care, an airport in north Pickering and the gun registry were the hot issues up for debate by candidates in Ajax-Pickering Riding Tuesday night.

Liberal Mark Holland, NDP candidate Kevin Modeste and Conservative Rene Soetens faced off over questions from an audience and media panel at the McLean Community Centre. The possibility of building an airport in the northern part of the riding was posed to the candidates.

“The only way an airport will arrive in Pickering is if there is a proven need,” said Mr. Soetens, adding efforts to close other small airports such as Buttonville and Oshawa are going to create that need sooner.

“There has to be a business case made for an airport in Pickering and that hasn’t been proven yet,” Mr. Modeste said.

“I’m opposed to an international airport in north Pickering, it doesn’t make sense,” Mr. Holland said. “I think a small regional airport does make sense.”

Health care was a big topic of the evening, with questions concerning how problems would be addressed both nationally and locally at Rouge Valley Ajax and Pickering hospital.

Mr. Holland said we need to reinvest in health care and the Liberals are committed to spending \$9 billion over the next five years.

Mr. Modeste criticized the plan saying the party has had 11 years to invest in health care.

“The Liberal record on this is the antithesis of this,” he said. “We had a throne speech and a budget and it wasn’t even an issue, suddenly there is an election and it’s a buzz issue.”

Mr. Holland refuted the claim later.

“If we had put it in the budget we would have been accused of politicizing the budget,” he said.

Mr. Modeste said the way to help the local hospital is through investments.

“The key problem is funding and the NDP is the only party committed to 25 per cent (funding) for health care,” he said. “If you want anything to be better we have to invest in it.”

Mr. Soetens stated his party’s stand on the issue.

“We’re committed to the Roy Romanow report. We are the only party that says we will work in the context of the report,” he said. “At the federal level what you have to have is a commitment to the Romanow health accord.”

Mr. Modeste pointed out the Romanow report is against privatization, which he accused the Conservatives of considering.

The audience also wanted to hear each candidate’s thoughts on the gun registry, which has cost close to \$1 billion.

“It’s a wasted piece of legislation that has cost every Canadian \$100 a head,” Mr. Soetens said.

“The gun control program does need to be retooled,” Mr. Holland said.

But, he added as a member of the Durham Regional Police Services Board he knows what the registry has done; pointing out it has been used 2.2 million times since 1998.

“We need to consult with the people who use the gun registry, our law enforcement officials,” Mr. Modeste said, adding there needs to be tougher, boarder controls to prevent illegal weapons from coming into the country.

The candidates also talked about the rising cost of post-secondary education, tax cuts and military spending.

The debate was hosted by the News Advertiser, Rogers TV, KX 96 and CKDO. Green Party candidate Karen MacDonald was invited to participate but was unable to attend.

The federal election is June 28.

mitments when you’re party isn’t committed to anything,” he said.

Gary Dale of the New Democratic Party challenged previous Liberal promises, such as working to eliminate child poverty by 2000, reducing greenhouse gases and appointing an independent ethics commissioner.

“We will deliver on all of these,” Mr. Dale stated.

Conservative candidate Tim Dobson brought up the sponsorship scandal.

“Prime Minister Paul Martin promised us, before he would go to the electorate, we would find out where the money went,” he said. “Three weeks ago an election was called and he didn’t deliver.”

About 75 people, most affiliated with one of the candidates, attended the debate, held in the auditorium of the Pickering central library branch.

Candidates were asked which of two options, cutting taxes or investing in services, would prevail

if their party were elected.

“All are important to me and the Conservative Party,” said Mr. Dobson. “When we laid out our platform, tax cuts would be slow at first and escalating later. We can provide tax cuts to provide funding for programs.”

“We’ve seen tax cuts don’t work,” Mr. Dale said, noting after the cuts the government would only have enough money to pay for program overhead. “We want to deliver programs Canadians want and need.”

Mr. McTeague said the issue requires balance.

“Canada still has a \$500 billion debt,” he said. “The cost of serving the debt is \$40 billion a year. That impacts our ability to fund programs. You can’t produce tax cuts and leave \$50 billion unanswered.”

“With these tax cuts, you shift taxes so you’re not taxing those who can’t afford them. You can’t cut taxes recklessly,” Mr. Polleesel stated.

Asked about the importance of an MP living in their riding, Mr.

Polleesel, an Ottawa resident, viewed it two ways.

“In some sense it’s very important to see what’s important to your constituents,” he said. “Otherwise, it’s not so important. From coast to coast to coast, the issues are the same. It’s not a definite requirement.”

Mr. McTeague, who lives west of Toronto, noted he moved out of the riding so his family wouldn’t have to travel far.

“I’m not prepared to put my family’s safety in harm’s way. My years have been effective.”

Mr. Dobson, a Pickering resident, said, “I think it’s absolutely essential to live or be very near to the riding.” That allows an MP to “take the pulse of the community. I want my MP to drive on the same streets I drive on.”

Mr. Dale also supported having a candidate in the riding.

“I’ve lived in the community for 20 years and I have no intention of leaving it,” he said.

Repeats of the debate will continue to air on Rogers over the coming weeks.

Public school board bus plan still up in the air

Issue will be addressed June 21

DURHAM – Public school board trustees are no closer to resolving the issues surrounding their new busing policy after a Monday night meeting.

About all Durham District School Board trustees decided was not to have a dedicated public meeting on the matter. But, whether the policy that eliminates surplus seating will change or remain the same after the June 21 board meeting is unknown.

“Nothing could happen or something could happen,” board chairman Elizabeth Roy said in an interview.

Parents still have a chance to comment on the policy through public question period at the board meeting, she said, noting trustees would be in touch with their school councils in the interim.

Trustee Roy reminded trustees that amending the transportation policy is no easy matter.

It would have to be rescinded before trustees agree on changes and approve a new policy, possibly at a special summer board meeting.

Meanwhile, the clock is ticking; while the current school year is winding down, the next is just

three months away and parents and board staff are in limbo until a decision is made.

“We need to have a solution to this immediately,” said Trustee Roy.

About 10 parents attended the meeting on the busing policy, approved at the standing committee level after trustees agreed to skirt procedure. Normally it would have gone to the full board for final approval.

“The board made a decision to suspend the rules... they opted out of public input,” said Howard Abbey, co-chairman of the F. M. Heard Public School community council in Whitby. “I don’t think they recognized the familial impact that this has.”

Recognizing that most parents are working when school lets out, the new policy allows for busing to a daycare facility or second address after school. However, the ability to get a child on an empty or surplus seat on a school bus was removed. Roughly 800 students are riding on surplus seats this year.

At F. M. Heard, a single-track French Immersion school, most are kindergarten siblings of FI students who will likely enter the program when it starts in Grade 1. Without a surplus seat, parents have to get students to school.

Pickering Trustee Paul Crawford again called for a public meeting, suggesting the June 21 board meeting.

Nothing or something could happen.

“I’m not making a decision until the stakeholders have their say,” he said.

Oshawa Trustee Michael Barrett, however, said if it’s not the will of the board to change the policy, a public meeting would be a waste of time.

Pickering Trustee Sherry Croteau suggested a grandfathering clause, allowing those who have had surplus seating to keep riding until they leave elementary school.

“We’re never going to come up with a solution until we start brainstorming ideas,” she said.

Even if trustees allow surplus seating, the board will likely have to deal with the issue again next year, said Oshawa Trustee Kath-

leen Hopper. If the Province’s new transportation model is implemented in the 2005/06 year, board superintendent Ed Hodgins says it would mean about \$3.7 million less in transportation money.

“For me, the bottom line has always been that the budget has give and take to it,” she said, adding she wants to know what’s being dropped or cut from the budget if the policy changes.

The board’s e-learning and other programs would have to be looked at, said education director Craig Burch.

“I don’t believe there’s a cheap tweaking,” he said.

Trustees should have had a public meeting on the issue in March, says Mr. Abbey, who might raise it on Monday, when trustees hear public deputations on the coming year’s budget.

Mr. Hodgins says it would cost about \$350,000 for siblings to keep riding the bus on surplus seats.

“We’re not talking about a lot of money in the grand scheme of things,” says Mr. Abbey, noting the board’s half billion-dollar budget.

He questioned why the board’s full transportation grant from the Province is not being used for transportation.

Mr. Hodgins has said that in the current budget, roughly \$2 million went from the transportation budget to support board programs.

Seniors' month focuses on fall prevention

DURHAM – June is Seniors' month, and the Durham Region Health Department plans to celebrate by highlighting injury prevention among seniors.

Statistics show that falls are the leading health concern for seniors, and are the leading cause of emergency room visits and injury-related deaths for the senior population. A 2001 report showed that there were 629 hospitalizations among Durham seniors as a result of falls.

The health department has planned a number of events throughout the month of June to promote fall prevention. Centres participating in the initiative will be giving out gift-sized bottles of sparkling apple juice with an attached fall-prevention message to seniors attending their events throughout June.

Community service pays off for students

Multicultural scholarships up for grabs

DURHAM - The Multicultural Council of Oshawa/Durham (MCO) invites students to send in submissions for its annual Community Services Scholarship.

The Community Services Scholarship will recognize excellence by focusing on the student's academic achievements, school involvement and contributions and service to the community.

Also applicants must write an essay on the theme of "Multiculturalism: Enhancing the Canadian Identity" of between 500 and 800 words. Applicants may also

add any other information that they wish to provide.

By applying for the scholarship the applicant gives the MCO permission to print and publish parts or all of any essay submitted. The decision of the Scholarship Committee will be final and the monetary awards will be presented to the recipients upon proof of their accep-

tance at a college or university.







Advantage Airtech tips for air conditioning efficiency

Central air conditioners and heat pumps operating in the cooling mode are rated according to their seasonal energy efficiency ratio (SEER).

SEER is calculated using the seasonal cooling output divided by the seasonal energy input in watt-hours for an

average climate. Many older air conditioners have SEER ratings of only six or seven. The national efficiency standard for central air conditioners now requires a minimum SEER of 10. To qualify for an Energy Star label, there has to be a SEER rating of 13 or higher.

Besides SEER, there are two other factors to check. The first is high temperature performance. Although it's not a federally rated number, the EER (energy efficiency ratio) at 95°F is available.

In addition, a small device called a

thermal expansion valve (TXV), preferably factory-installed, should be specified. The TXV improves high temperature performance, and helps the unit deliver its rates efficiency even under adverse conditions. The device costs much less than the service call or inefficiency it guards against.

The efficiency of room air conditioners is measured by the EER, which is the ratio of the cooling output divided by the



power consumption. A typical new room air conditioner has an EER of about 9.8, which is what's required by national appliance efficiency standards. The minimum efficiency varies depending on the design and cooling capacity of each unit. The Energy Star criteria for room air conditioners are 10.7 or 10.8.

When you're shopping for central air conditioners, look for SEER ratings over 13 and EER ratings of 11 or higher. High efficiency units generally cost more, but in hot climates, more efficient units pay for themselves over a few years through reduced electricity bills.

Central air conditioners are usually more efficient than room air conditioners, however don't buy a larger system than you need just because it has a higher efficiency.







Casino, Region square off on smoking laws

Great Blue Heron says it's exempt from new rules, Durham doesn't think so

DURHAM - With one hand holding a burning cigarette, Joan Grech pulls the handle on one of the hundreds of slot machines at the Great Blue Heron Charitable Casino and hopes for the best.

Amid the noisy whistles and beeps of the video lottery terminals, a smoky haze hangs over the large room where the slot machines are located despite municipal legislation prohibiting smoking in public areas.

As her slot machine comes up short of any payout, Ms. Grech lets out a sigh, takes a drag from her burning Player's and hits a button to try her luck again.

"This is why I'm here," says the Markham resident, holding up her cigarette. "I'm giving them money, so why can't I smoke? Why can't I enjoy a beer or coffee and a smoke while I'm here?"

"I leave enough money in these machines," adds Ms. Grech, who says she travels to Scugog "at least once a week, if not twice" to the

Scugog Island gambling hall.

"I won't go to Woodbine, I won't go to the other places where they won't let you smoke."

A quick tour around the massive casino - which in its promotional materials boasts 50 gaming tables and 452 slot machines - shows that Ms. Grech is not alone.

Ashtrays sit beside nearly every video lottery terminal and on almost every gaming table throughout the casino.

There are no signs advising patrons of the new smoking bylaw - which as of June 1 restricts smoking in all public places in Durham - however, found on one wall leading into the slot machine area, is one politely asking customers to refrain from smoking cigars and pipes on the premises.

There is no sign of construction of a designated smoking area for smokers - as dictated in the new bylaw, businesses like casinos, race tracks and bingo halls wishing to continue to allow smokers in their establishments must create a self-contained smoking area, not to exceed 50 per cent of their total floor space - and, as patrons keep pumping tokens into the slot machines, a casino employee swings by Ms.

Grech, empties her ashtray, and with a smile on her face tells Ms. Grech to "keep on smoking. It's OK here."

The Great Blue Heron Charity Casino has found itself in the middle of an interesting debate: Is it exempt from the new bylaw? Apparently, casino officials say they are.

Officials with the Durham Region Health Department, however, have a different idea.

"They (the casino) are of the opinion that they are exempt from the bylaw because of their (Native) status," says Alex Connor, a manager of environmental health who is responsible for enforcing the bylaw. "We're of a different opinion. They're not exempt. So the health department is investigating."

"At the end of the day, a court will probably have to decide."

The Great Blue Heron is located on lands owned by the Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nations. It is owned by the Baagwating Community Association and operated by a partnership between the Baagwatings, Casinos Austria International Ltd., Fantasy Gaming Entertainment Inc. and Sonco Gaming Inc.

Repeated calls to senior casino officials were not returned.

Those same casino man-

agers haven't held any discussions with health department officials either, says Mr. Connor.

"No one from the casino has contacted me," he adds.

And, as of last week, the health department has yet to fine the casino.

"We don't just walk in and start laying charges. We do warnings, then follow up. Eventually a decision is made," says Mr. Connor, noting the health department received five complaints the first day and few more since then.

"Someone will have to fol-

low up on the warning letter we sent out."

Mr. Connor said his investigators have been up to the casino and saw people smoking.

As far as he knows, the facility has made no move to build a designated smoking room.







The world is his race

Hatfield visits Pickering to talk about importance of grassroots support to sailing

PICKERING — One sailing trip around the world deserves another.

Canadian sailor extraordinaire Derek Hatfield will circle the globe again two years from now, facing the best sailors on the planet in the Five Oceans Race.

Hatfield was the guest of honour at the Frenchman's Bay Yacht Club's annual Sail Past and opening day ceremonies at the Breezy Drive club Saturday morning.

After a brief address as part of the ceremonies, Hatfield gave a more in-depth account of his treacherous sailing odyssey aboard the 'Spirit of Canada' in the 2002 and 2003 version of the trans-world race, as well as an-

nouncing his plans for 2006, which include racing a state-of-the-art Open 60 sailboat.

The New Brunswick native, who now lives in Aurora, says it's his competitive spirit, along with the burning desire to represent Canada, that has spurred him to take the helm for another voyage around the world. The trip covers more than 28,700 nautical miles and begins in September 2006.

"The last time there was such an outpouring of support from Canadians and those from around the world that I was interested in competing in class 1, the 60-foot class," says Hatfield who, as far as he's aware, will be the lone Canadian in the 2006 race that is expected to attract approximately 20 entries from around the world. "But, this time, we're out to win. We were third in our class (class II, 40-foot sailboat) last time, so I think we can compete well and we can represent Canada very well at this international event."

The new 'Spirit of Canada' entry, an Open 60 sailing vessel, will be the first one of its kind

built in Canada. The design has been completed, with actual construction beginning in Aurora by the end of the summer.

"It's very high-tech," says Hatfield. "It's easy to sail, it's more safe, it's faster and now I can concentrate on the performance of the board. I want to bring a top-notch team together to do that."

While Hatfield finished third in the 2002-03 edition of the Five Oceans Race, then known as the 'Around Alone Single-handed Yacht Race', it was anything but smooth sailing. On the ocean 25 miles southeast of Cape Horn on March 7, 2003, he navigated the 'Spirit of Canada' for 24 hours through 60-foot waves amid winds blowing 100 miles per hour. The boat, not to mention Hatfield, barely made it out intact.

"The boat stood on its nose and then rolled upside down. It took all of six seconds to do this," recalled Hatfield, who was thrown into the icy southern ocean, but was scooped back into the boat as it righted itself. "It was just like a car crash -- I

had no time to react as it happened so quickly. My survival skills kicked in at that point. I did what I had to do to survive."

Miraculously, Hatfield was able to steer the battered sailboat to a tiny port in Argentina. The mast and sails as well as all the electronics in the boat were ruined. But, thanks to support from Canadians and others from across the world, he received the funding to do the necessary repairs and get back in the race.

"The support from Canadians and corporations allowed it to happen. The outpouring of support for the 'Spirit of Canada' was unbelievable," he says.

Hatfield received financial support from the Frenchman's Bay Yacht Club in 2002 and will count on the club for support as his plans for the 2006 race go forward.

"The grassroots program has been very important, going way back to the construction of the 'Spirit of Canada' that took five years. I received the assistance of people across Canada. People

In the compulsory figures event, DSSC brought home more excellent results with Katie LePage 8th, Chelsey Matthews 9th, Sophie Baetz-Dougan 18th and Julia Maclean 21st out of 204 swimmers.
