Dickerson sounds off on nuclear sirens

Pickering residents don't want the units, he says

PICKERING — Doug Dickerson doesn't want to hear there are going to be less alerting sirens installed in Pickering, he wants to hear there won't be any.

The recently elected Ward 2 City councillor reiterated this week what his constituents have said repeatedly.

"The people of Bay Ridges clearly do not want sirens, period, end of conversation," he said.

Coun. Dickerson made his comments at Monday's management forum meeting where Tom Melymuk, division head of corporate projects and policy, updated councillors and the

mayor on the nuclear alerting system.

"We have made some very good progress on the review of public altering with Durham Region," Mr. Melymuk said.

Provincial policy requires that an alerting system be erected within a three-kilometre radius of a nuclear station. The Region purchased the equipment (which was paid for by Ontario

Pickering OK with delays on greenbelt

DURHAM — Responding to requests from the public, municipalities and the opposition, the Province has decided to delay the passing of its greenbelt legislation.

The deadline for comments had been Dec. 12 and the legislation regarding a Golden Horseshoe greenbelt was to be passed before the one-year moratorium on urban development ended Dec. 16. Late Thursday afternoon the government announced the development freeze in the greenbelt study area has been extended to March 9, while the deadline for submissions is now Dec. 20.

"We've determined to extend the development freeze to provide an opportunity to ensure all the comments received would have time to be reviewed before the government decision is made," said Wayne Arthurs, Pickering-Ajax-Uxbridge MPP. "We want to ensure we get it right and the best way to do it is to have adequate comment."

John O'Toole, MPP for Durham Riding, said the Conservatives pushed for the delay.

"All we were calling for was for them to listen to the public and take the time to get it right," he said.

He said it took his government a number of years to finalize the Oak Ridges Moraine Protection Act so the Liberals should take time to get the greenbelt legislation right. Mr. O'Toole said he is supportive of the idea of the greenbelt.

"I don't think anyone disagrees with greenspace and the need to have some assurance that valuable farmland isn't paved over," he said.

us for," he said.

But Mr. Arthurs added there are also landowners who have expressed concern about losing out on possible development without any compensation from the government.

"(Compensation) is not something the government has been giving any consideration to," he said.

Mr. O'Toole said many people from his mainly rural riding have concerns.

"By and large agriculture people were surprised and felt powerless and felt they needed much more time to make sure the boundaries and geographic areas of the greenbelt make sense," he said.

In its discussion of the greenbelt, one of the City of Pickering's concerns was about how little time was being given to review comments before a decision would be made.

Mayor Dave Ryan saw the delay as a positive step. "I'm pleased that they've extended the deadline, it's what we've been telling them all along," he said.

He said he hoped the extra time leads to meaningful consultation and review of comments.

Ward 1 Regional Councillor Maurice Brenner echoed his sentiments.

"It was a very positive step to allow for more open and inclusive consultation... Also, it's a wise step for them to allow time for views of stakeholders to be considered." he said.

He had no concerns with development being frozen for an additional three months, since the City has been restricted regarding development.

"For the City of Pickering it is pretty well status quo because we've been under a minister's zoning order and Ontario Planning and Development Act for some time," he said.

In it's recommendations to the minister of municipal affairs, Pickering has requested the southern portion of the Duffins Rouge Agricultural Preserve be removed from the greenbelt plan. Under the City's growth management study the southern portion of the pre-

serve is slated for development for 38,000 people.

When asked if he believes the preserve should be included in the greenbelt, Mr. Arthurs, the former mayor of Pickering, said, "that's an ongoing difference I have with my government.

"I agree with the City's recommendation that their growth management study should proceed to its conclusion."

DURHAM — The Durham Region Police Service Christmas Food and Tov Drive is underway. now in its 16th year.

The drive got off to an impressive start, following the presentation of a \$5,000 cheque by the Police Appreciation Night committee representative Allyson Allin. The funds were raised during October's Police Appreciation Night, which was held at the Deer Creek Golf and Banquet Facility.

"You always hear stories about families that are in need, so it's

just a wonderful feeling to be able to help out," said Ms. Allin, who has been a part of the Food and Toy Drive for seven years.

Drive organizer Stephanie MacDonald is anticipating that the goal of helping more than 1,000 families will be met, noting that donations have already started pouring in. "We're hoping for a very successful year once again," she said. "It's a lot of work, but knowing that we've helped the families we have (makes it worthwhile)."

The drive counts on the support of both police and civilian volunteers, along with local car dealerships which donate the use of their vans for delivery purposes. Over 400 businesses have pledged their support, while 38 agencies (a number that's always on the rise) ensure that needy

families receive the donations. The hand-off of the toys and food is done quietly throughout the month, but volunteers are rewarded for their efforts with a reception in January.


Police Chief Kevin McAlpine expressed his confidence that this year's drive will be just as productive as those that have preceded it.

Pickering community groups getting a board budget break on the rental of school buildings

DURHAM — The public school board is slashing the rates it charges to non-profit groups that rent school facilities - and some will receive a rebate as the change is retroactive to Sept. 1.

Single gymnasiums will be reduced from \$12 per hour to \$6. Double gymnasiums from \$22 to \$11, and classrooms from \$6 to \$3 per hour, reported Durham District School Board's business superintendent Ed Hodgins at Monday's board meeting.

As well, rental cost for an auditorium has dropped by 25 per cent, and renters will pay less to have a board custodian on duty after hours.

Custodial overtime rates for non-profit groups go from \$30 to \$21 per hour, Monday to Satur-

day, and from \$40 to \$28 Sundays. Weekend start-up premiums, generally covering the cost of

from \$30 to \$21 on Saturdays and from \$40 to \$28 on Sundays. Sixty-six

Durham schools will

be available for rent later on Fridays, until 10 p.m., as custodial hours are being extended.

In July, the ministries of education and tourism and recreation announced funding for a Community Use of Schools initiative. The idea is to encourage more community use of schools, and to make it cheaper for non-profit groups to rent them. The board is receiving about \$603,000, but had to enter into an agreement with the Province in order to access the money.

"The intent would be to add custodial hours supported by this grant," Mr. Hodgins told trustees. In an interview, he said no new

staff would be required as custodial hours would be extended later into the evening.

"It makes so much sense for the school boards to share the facilities with the community at large," Oshawa Trustee Kathleen Hopper said.

She noted the Durham board owns millions of dollars worth of facilities that should be available

to groups when students aren't in school.

Fellow Oshawa Trustee Susan Shetler asked for an estimate on how much the rebates would cost the board. Mr. Hodgins responded approximately \$100,000 would be returned to school user groups.

Noting the agreement is in place for just a year, Whitby Trustee Elizabeth Roy wondered how groups could be made to understand why there's a rate increase a year from now if the initiative isn't extended. Mr. Hodgins said those receiving a rebate would also get an explanation.

Last year, Mr. Hodgins says board facilities were rented for more than 37,000 hours.



We have to save our greenspace

Our natural areas deserve full protection from future development

Regeneration, protection and new opportunities are at the centre of a new management plan for the Greenwood Conservation Area.

Located in north Ajax and stretching across into Pickering, the 283 hectares that make up the area have provided residents in the two communities with a unique environmentally-sensitive area for a number of years.

The management plan was created by the Toronto Region Conservation Authority, which owns the entire area, but only manages the portion (about two-thirds) that falls within the Ajax boundaries.

The plan takes an environment-first approach, using eight 'management zones' in areas such as restoration, public use, and natural environment.

Among the key pieces of the plan for the Pickering portion is the restoration of old fields and meadow areas, and helping to accelerate the process that will get more forest cover. In addition, while a trail already exists, it will become part of the greater Trans-Canada Trail and signage will be added to designate the path as such.

In the Ajax portion, among the plan's targets is the restoration of a former gravel pit, which is now used as an off-leash area for pets. Restoration will take about 18 months, with native plants eventually ending up there. Work will also be completed on the Duffins Creek system, which will mean rerouting some walking trails to ensure the waterways thrive.

Finally, the Town will establish a stewardship committee to help implement the plan, a public participation exercise that has worked well in other areas.

Taking care of our natural areas can't be an option, it simply must happen. Projects such as this, along with others like the watershed plan for the Duffins and Carruthers creeks, and efforts by groups such as the Frenchman's Bay Watershed Rehabilitation Project are vital to sustaining our sensitive ecological resources.

Our environmentally-sensitive lands must have the support of all levels of government, along with all residents.

Barrett the right choice for board

May be trustee rookie, but education experience is extensive

The six children and a busy job, one would think Michael Barrett has enough on his plate.

But the Oshawa trustee heaped on a lot more Monday, when he became chairman of the Durham District School Board. Mr. Barrett is a rookie trustee, so one would think he's not qualified for the position. In fact, the opposite is true, and he's a good choice.

As he noted in an interview, Mr. Barrett has attended board public meetings for six years. He is a former school community council and regional parents' advisory council chairman. Most recently, he was one of two board representatives on the Ontario Pubic School Boards' Association. Mr. Barrett knows the issues and, as a vice-president of human resources, is accustomed to working with and training people.

He's clearly committed to hard work and that's a plus to the board and parents. After losing two trustee elections, Mr. Barrett could have given up, could have stepped back from school-related stuff. But in the contentious and often surreal term preceding this one, he saw first-hand a dysfunctional group and was determined to help get it back on track.

Mr. Barrett is someone who speaks his mind. He is one of a few trustees who acknowledged they didn't fully understand the impact on parents and students of the board's new transportation policy. In March, as the board approved a new school building plan, he warned that the needs of older school communities

As for the outgoing chairwoman, Whitby Trustee Elizabeth Roy earned a lot of deserved respect from her colleagues and constituents in her four years as board leader. She faced a trustee rebellion at one point and her share of controversies. Trustee Roy's experience is a huge asset to the board, and Mr. Barrett will certainly benefit from her good counsel.

The chairman's job is an important one. Remember, this is a large school board, with almost 70,000 pupils, more than 6,000 employees and a half-billion dollar budget. True, staff does virtually all of the work of running it, but the chairman is the face of the board. With Mr. Barrett, trustees have chosen someone who is smart, forthright and equipped with a sense of humour.

He'll likely need the latter in the com-

group runs for six weeks and has a limited number of spaces. The other five sessions run from 3 to 4 p.m. and 7:30 to 8:30 p.m.







Cost of bike path plan raises eyebrows at Region

By Jillian Follert Staff Writer

DURHAM— Local politicians are in agreement that a system of regional bicycle paths would benefit the environment, promote an active lifestyle and complement the amalgamated transit system currently in the works.

What they don't agree on, however, is the cost of getting the wheels rolling.

A report presented at Wednesday's joint meeting of the Region's planning and works committees, put a \$121,500 price tag on hiring the firm of Marshall Macklin Monaghan Limited to develop the ambitious plan, which would link existing municipal bike paths and create new ones throughout the region.

"We're talking about spending over \$121,000 and we're not going to build one yard of pavement for that," said Whitby Mayor Marcel Brunelle. "It's a great idea, I support the idea... but that's a lot of money for people to sit in an office somewhere putting numbers

Commissioner of Planning Alex Georgieff defended the cost, noting that other municipalities have spent roughly the same amount on similar plans.

"This isn't something we can do ourselves, we don't have any-

one with bike path planning expertise," he said. "And we need a comprehensive plan before we take on a project of this size."

The firm is expected to complete the project in three phases; a working paper that determines goals and objectives, a plan that develops cycling related policies and programs, and an implementation strategy that details actions and administrative tasks needed to begin actual construction of the path system.

Mr. Georgieff said consultation with individual municipalities and user groups will be a key component. A municipal advisory committee and stakeholder workshops will be established during phase one, and a public



information centre will be held at the end of phase two.

something I can see and touch, but I also understand the importance of having a master plan."


Oshawa Regional Councillor Cathy Clarke pointed out that some municipalities have already poured funds into creating their own master plans, and asked why the firm is spending money to create new ones from scratch.

"We have met with area municipalities and we're aware that some have their own plans already... those will be used as a foundation for this larger plan," assured Mr. Georgieff. "We're not abandoning them at all, we're building on them."

The \$121,500 needed for development of the plan, will be comprised of \$65,000 from the Planning Department's 2004 Operating Budget, and \$56,500 from the Works Department's 2004 Roads Capital Budget.

A motion to finance that amount and authorize the firm to begin work was carried despite outstanding concerns about the

"I still have a real issue with how much we're spending for an office exercise," said Mayor Brunelle at the close of a lengthy debate. "Should it be done? Absolutely. Should it be done at any cost? I don't think so."

The do's and don'ts of decorating with colour

'Everybody knew everybody,' recalls Bill Parish of Ajax' first election

Ajax: 50 years later

Tomorrow marks golden anniversary of important first

AJAX — Fifty years ago, Elvis Presley was an unknown truck driver, Louis Saint-Laurent was prime minister, a computer filled an entire room, and televisions, for those who had them, were black and white.

Tomorrow, Dec. 11, marks the 50th anniversary of the first municipal election for a community that had a name, but wasn't incorporated. On Dec. 11, 1954, a record turnout of 76 per cent of Ajax residents went to the polls to elect their first council.

The population of Ajax was a fraction of today's and most residents lived within earshot of Hwy. 401. Voters selected a mayor, a reeve, a deputy reeve, six councillors and six school board trustees, all at large. They also picked local hydro commissioners.

In 1954, Bill Parish was elected a councillor and he later went on to become the mayor, a job his son Steve now holds. He recalls a different town than today.

The population "wasn't any bigger than probably 6,000. It wasn't any more than that," he said.

"Most of the single men and the single women, not all of them, had left. There were 600 houses up north (of the 401)."

Ajax had been the site of a munitions factory during the Second World War, drawing young men and women from across the country. The factory was run by Defense Industries Limited, or DIL.

During the Korean War, building began in the Admiral and Forest road areas. In 1955-56, construction of the Lakevista Gardens subdivision began. These are the homes

surrounding Ajax High School, in the Burcher and Emperor roads

Prior to the Town being incorporated, the community was called the Improvement District of Ajax and, while owned by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, was administered by a provincially-appointed board of directors.

The directors were Benjamin de Forest 'Pat' Bayly, John Mills and William Rideout. Mr. Bayly would go on to be the first mayor of Ajax, while Mr. Mills also served on the first council, filling the position of reeve until 1960.

Residents petitioned the Ontario Municipal Board in 1954 for the community to become a town. The petition was granted and the election set for Dec. 11.

The Improvement District Board had done a good job," Mr. Parish says. "Most people felt we had moved to the point to elect our own council and school board. Ajax was growing and people wanted to come out from an appointed

During the war, "DIL made the rules and there was no municipal government then. People were feeling it was time they had an elected government," he adds.

And vote they did, as three-quarters came out to cast a ballot.

'When other municipalities were having 33, 30 or 35 per cent, we had a record turnout. That shows the enthusiasm of the people," Mr. Parish states.

Everybody knew everybody. They knew (the candidates) personally," he says. "I don't think we've matched it since. It's really marvelous when you think how it's slipped federally, provincially and municipally."


Mr. Parish recalls Mr. Bayly as "a brilliant man, a brilliant leader, a man of great integrity.



Busing seat decision to be considered early in the new year

Committee chairman says trustees making progress on review

By Mike Ruta

DURHAM — Trustees are making gains in their review of the public school board's busing policy, and Durham parents could find out what they've come up with in about two months, says Trustee Susan

The chairwoman of the board's ad hoc transportation committee made the comments in an interview following a recent meeting of trustees, where board members discussed the policy.

"I think we're making good progress," Trustee Shetler said. "It might not be quick enough for the public, but trustees are beginning to understand all the different pieces when you review transportation."

Trustees have been examining components such as French immersion busing in their review of the policy, she says, adding trustees could be finished the process by late January or early February. Board members next plan to discuss the policy on Dec. 15.

The seven-month-old transportation policy provided extra busing services for working parents who count on day care. However, it also eliminated surplus seating for hundreds of students, and for months parents pressed the board to change it, arguing that children who had a seat on the bus are now out of luck, even though in some cases a sibling can ride and the vehicle has many empty seats. Board officials say the Ministry of Education directed the DDSB to pursue a transportation consortium, a move discussed for several years in Durham.

The former Conservative government, as it worked on a new

told boards they must be in a consortium qualify funding. Current Education Minister Ge-

rard Kennedy in a recent interview said when the model is introduced, boards although "it is implied by efficiencies in the model."

Questioned recently in the legislature about the transportation cuts the board made this year, he said,

"they shouldn't have made them." Denise Barrett, an Ajax parent who has gone to Queen's Park in an effort to have the board reverse course on the policy, suggests the minister is right on the money, noting the board received about \$18 million from the government for student transportation, but "has chosen to take this money and spend it elsewhere."

A soccer season to remember for Ajacian Big payday for Pickering

It's still sinking in that Chapman and Irish are best in the U.S.

AJAX — Several days after winning a national collegiate championship, Ajax's Candace Chapman is still in disbelief.

The 21-year-old forward with the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish women's soccer team still hasn't come down to earth from the high of winning the NCAA Division 1 championship over the UCLA Bruins in North Carolina on

In a final that featured high drama at every turn, the Irish pulled out the improbable victory, after having an own-goal scored on them, and then, in the latter stages of the game, rallying to tie the contest. After overtime failed to provide a winner, the game proceeded to penalty kicks -- a first for an NCAA women's soccer championship game. In the end, Notre Dame edged UCLA 4-3 on penalty kicks. "It feels unreal right now. It

hasn't sunk in yet even though it's been two days since we won," says Chapman, a senior at Notre Dame, with one final season of eligibility. "It's an amazing feeling."

Also amazing was the reception the team received upon arrival back at the venerable South Bend, Indiana campus on Monday. It's one she'll never forget.

 $\hbox{``Coming back to the campus was}\\$ awesome. An escort drove us to the Main Circle (at the university) and there were tons of people to greet us off the bus. It was an awesome feeling."

The championship game, she says, was a "roller coaster" as her emotions ran the gamut, from the low of having an own-goal, to the high of praying for her teammate and Canadian Katie Thorlakson on a penalty kick in the second half, which sailed past the UCLA goalkeeper, giving the Irish new life.



"It definitely was a roller coaster," she says. "From the moment I saw the ball roll into our net, I said 'it can't end like this. On the TV timeout, we all got together, we all said we have to win because it can't end like that. When we got that penalty call and Katie put it in the net, I knew it was our game."

When the game went to penalty shots, Chapman acknowledged that it was a nerve-racking time for her and her teammates.

"I was nervous, though. I knew anything could happen on penalty shots. We practised them before the (final four) tournament," she

"They had a corner (kick) and one of our defenders went up for the ball. One of the UCLA players headed it to the side of the net and I was right there," she recalls. "I put my leg out and stopped it. I just saw it hit me and I said to myself 'I've got to get this out of here' and I kicked it out."

One of her finest moments in her collegiate career came in last Friday's semifinal victory over the University of Santa Clara Broncos of California. The Irish won 1-0 on a goal scored by Chapman.

'There was about 15 minutes left in the semifinal and I got the ball at $\,$ midfield and I dribbled up the field.

The defenders were running back but when I hit the 18-yard box they came at me. I deked a player and passed to Katie (Thorlakson) who one-touched it back to me. All the defenders went to her and left me

Chapman says there was a certain chemistry and magic that surrounded the Irish this season, coming to the fore at a pre-season training trip to Brazil and ending with a national title last Sunday. In four years at the university, she had experienced only one playoff run, with the Irish ending its season in the "Sweet 16" in her sophomore season. But, this go-round was different right from the start.

'The team chemistry this year was so amazing. We had so many good players this season. For the players who started and the players who come off the bench, there was no drop-off in the level of play throughout the season. We were still competitive," says Chapman, one of three Canadian starters on the Irish, along with Melissa Tancredi, of Ancaster, and Thorlakson, of Langley, B.C.

The Archbishop Denis O'Connor Catholic High School graduate says the championship victory was especially sweet considering the long road of recovery she endured since injuring her anterior cruciate ligament in her knee last year, while attending a training camp with the Canadian national women's soccer team. It kept her out of the World Cup last year, as well as missing an entire season with the Irish.

She says the whirlwind of activity surrounding the national championship win has prevented her from considering next season. She has one more year of eligibility remaining with the Irish, and acknowledged it will be a different roster with many senior players graduating this year. She's also committed to resuming her career with the Canadian national women's team, with two camps in the new year. With Notre Dame, there's the spring season, with several practises as well as several exhibition games.






